VENEREAL DISEASE ACT, 1917: SECTION 1.  
Application to Certain Areas.

THE VENEREAL DISEASES  
(BERKSHIRE, &c.) ORDER, 1918.

To the Council of every County and of every County Borough named in the Schedule to this Order;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas a Scheme has been made in pursuance of the Public Health (Venereal Diseases) Regulations, 1916, by the Council of each of the Counties and County Boroughs named in the Schedule to this Order, for the gratuitous treatment of persons in the area of that County or County Borough suffering from venereal disease, and such Scheme has been approved by Us, the Local Government Board, and is now in operation:

Now, therefore, in the exercise of the powers conferred on Us by the Venereal Disease Act, 1917, We hereby Order that Section 1 of that Act shall on and after the 1st day of July, 1918, apply to the area of each of the Counties and County Boroughs named in the Schedule hereto.

This Order may be cited as "The Venereal Diseases (Berkshire, &c.) Order, 1918."

NOTICE.—The Venereal Disease Act, 1917, provides by sub-section (1) of section 1 that in any area in which the section is in operation, a person shall not, unless he is a duly qualified medical practitioner, for reward either direct or indirect, treat any person for venereal disease or prescribe any remedy therefor, or give any advice in connection with the treatment thereof, whether the advice is given to the person to be treated or to any other person; the Act further provides by section 3 that if any person acts in contravention of any of the provisions of the Act, he shall be liable on conviction on indictment to imprisonment, with or without hard labour, for a term not exceeding two years, or on summary conviction to a fine

not exceeding one hundred pounds, or to imprisonment, with or without hard labour, for a term not exceeding six months.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

INVERNESS-SHIRE (SKYE AND OUTER ISLANDS) SHEEP-SCAB ORDER OF 1918.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

*Alteration of Application of Inverness-shire (Skye and Outer Islands) Sheep-Scab Order of 1915.*

1. The provisions of the Inverness-shire (Skye and Outer Islands) Sheep-Scab Order of 1915 shall apply only to the Areas described in the Schedule hereto.

*Revocation.*

2. The Inverness-shire (Skye and Outer Islands) Sheep-Scab Order of 1917 is hereby revoked.

*Short Title.*

3. This Order may be cited as the INVERNESS-SHIRE (SKYE AND OUTER ISLANDS) SHEEP-SCAB ORDER OF 1918.

SCHEDULE.

Areas in the county of Inverness:—

(a) In the Outer Islands:—

1. An Area in the parish of Barra comprising the Island of Muldoanich and such parts of the said parish as lie to the north of the Sound of Vatersay, but excluding the Islands of Fiaray, Fuday, Gighay, Flodday, and Hellisay.

2. An Area in the parish of South Uist comprising the crofting Townships, grazings, and grounds of Ardohuig, Kilerivagh, Grimsay, Hacklet, Liniolate, Torlum, Griminish, Aird, Muir of Aird, Balvanich, Dunganichy, Uachdar, Gramsdale, Kyles Flodda, and Island Flodda, all in Benbecula.

3. An Area in the parish of North Uist comprising the crofting Townships, grazings, and grounds of Minish, Lochmaddy.

4. An Area in the parish of South Uist
