### ROYAL WARRANT AMENDING SIXTH CLAUSE OF ROYAL RED CROSS WARRANT.

*GEORGE R.I.*

Whereas by Our Royal Warrant dated 10th  
 November, 1915, the Decoration of the Royal  
 Red Cross was divided into two Classes, re-  
 cipients of the Second Class being eligible for  
 advancement to the First Class, and whereas  
 no provision was made in Our said Royal War-  
 rant for the disposal of the Cross of the Second  
 Class of a recipient who is advanced to the First  
 Class:

It is Our Will and Pleasure and We do  
 hereby ordain that the Sixth Clause of Our  
 said Royal Warrant shall, as from the date  
 thereof, be read as follows:

Sixthly.—Recipients of the Second Class  
 of the Decoration shall be eligible for ad-  
 vancement to the First Class as vacancies may  
 arise, and on such advancement the Cross  
 shall be returned to the office of Our Secre-  
 tary of State for War.

Given at Our Court at *St. James's* this  
 Thirtieth day of *April*, 1918, in the  
 Eighth year of Our Reign.

### ARMY COUNCIL ORDER.

#### SALE OF WOOL (GREAT BRITAIN) ORDER, 1918.

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon  
 them by the Defence of the Realm Regulations,  
 the Army Council hereby order as follows:—

1. No person shall sell any raw wool grown  
 or to be grown on sheep in Great Britain or  
 the Isle of Man during the season 1918, except  
 unwashed daggings or clarts otherwise than to  
 persons authorised by or on behalf of the  
 Director of Raw Materials or at prices exceed-  
 ing those set out in the schedule hereto an-  
 nexed, or at such other prices as in any par-  
 ticular case may be allowed by or on behalf of  
 the Director of Raw Materials.

2. No person shall make or take delivery  
 of or payment for any wool of the description  
 aforesaid otherwise than in accordance with  
 the provisions of this Order, whether in pur-  
 suance of any contract entered into prior to the  
 date hereof or otherwise.

3. All persons having in their custody or  
 control any stocks of wool of the description  
 aforesaid are hereby required to sell such wool
