

the sale and supply of intoxicating liquor should be controlled by the State, and to apply to such area so defined the Regulations issued by His Majesty in pursuance of the said Act under the Defence of the Realm Consolidation Act, 1914:

And whereas His Majesty in Council in pursuance of the said first-mentioned Act has issued the Defence of the Realm (Liquor Control) Regulations, 1915, under the said last-mentioned Act:

And whereas it appears to His Majesty that it is expedient for the purpose of the successful prosecution of the present War that the sale and supply of intoxicating liquor in the respective areas defined and specified in the Schedule hereto should be controlled by the State on the grounds that War material is being made, loaded, unloaded and dealt with in transit therein, and that men belonging to His Majesty's Naval and Military forces are assembled therein:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

The Defence of the Realm (Liquor Control) Regulations, 1915, and any Regulations amending the same shall be, and are hereby applied to the respective areas defined and specified in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

1. The West Norfolk Area, being the area comprising so much of the County of Norfolk as is not comprised in the Eastern Area as defined and specified in the Schedule to an Order in Council, dated the 18th day of August, 1916.

2. The Lincoln Area, being the area comprising the City of Lincoln, the Borough of Boston, and the Petty Sessional Division of Kirton and Skirbeck, in the administrative County of the Parts of Holland; the administrative County of the Parts of Kesteven (excepting the Petty Sessional Division of Bourne); and the administrative County of the Parts of Lindsey, in the County of Lincoln (excepting so much of the last-mentioned administrative County as is comprised in the Humber Area as defined and specified in the Schedule to an Order in Council, dated the 13th day of April, 1918).

WHEREAS by the Aliens Restriction Order, His Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred by the Aliens Restriction Act, 1914, has been pleased to impose restrictions on aliens and to make various regulations for carrying those restrictions into effect:

And whereas it is expedient to extend the provisions of that Order in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

The following subsection shall be substituted for subsection (1) of Article 25B:—

“(1) A registration officer may, subject to the general or special instructions of a

Secretary of State, grant to a Turkish subject resident in his registration district who is proved to his satisfaction to fulfil any conditions as to race, religion, origin or otherwise, which may be specified in such directions, and to be opposed to the Turkish régime and well disposed towards the interests of His Majesty and His Allies, a certificate of exemption from all or any of the provisions of this part of this Order except such as apply to alien friends.”

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 20th day of May, 1918, in the words following, viz.:—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council bearing date the 8th day of August, 1917, to approve of Climate Allowance at the following rates being granted during the period 1st April to the 30th September of each year to Officers and Men employed in the tropical region of the West Coast of Africa, viz.:—

3s. a day to Commissioned Officers.

1s. a day to Warrant Officers,

6d. a day to the rest of the Ship's Company:

“And whereas the climate in the Gulf of Guinea remains of a very trying and unhealthy nature throughout the whole of the year, and we are therefore of opinion that Climate Allowance should be paid continuously in this locality:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the continuous payment of Climate Allowance at the above rates to Officers and Men serving in Ships stationed in the Gulf, *i.e.*, between the coast and a line drawn from Cape Palmas, in Liberia, to Cape Padron, on the South of the Congo River, with effect from the 1st October, 1917.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
