And whereas it is expedient to alter the first and second items of the Schedule to the first hereinbefore recited Order in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the power in that behalf by Section 737 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to direct that the first and second items in the Schedule to the Order in Council of the 4th day of July, 1908, shall be amended by the substitution of the words "Protectorate of Nigeria" in the first column in place of the words "Northern Nigeria" and "The Protectorate of Southern Nigeria," and in the second column by the substitution of the words "The Police Magistrate or other Commissioner of the Supreme Court at each Port within the local limits of the jurisdiction of the Supreme Court" for the words "The Cantonment Magastrate at Lokoja " and " At Calabar and Warri the Police Magistrate, and at other ports of the Protectorate the District Commissioner of the District," and that the words so substi-tuted shall be numbered "1" in each column of the said Schedule respectively, and that the succeeding items in the said Schedule shall be renumbered as "2," "3," "4," "5," "6" and "7" in both columns accordingly.

W HEREAS by the Colonial Courts of Admiralty Act, 1890, it is, amongst other things, provided that the Legislature of a British Possession may, by any Colonial Law, confer upon any inferior or subordinate Court in that Possession such partial or limited Admiralty Jurisdiction under such Regulations, and with such appeal (if any), as may seem fit:

And whereas by the said Act it is further provided that every Colonial Law which is made in pursuance of the said Act shall, unless previously approved by His Majesty through a Secretary of State, either be reserved for the signification of His Majesty's Pleasure thereon, or contain a suspending Clause providing that such Law shall not come into operation until His Majesty's Pleasure thereon has been publicly signified in the British Possession in which it has been passed:

And whereas a certain Bill passed by the Legislative Council and the Legislative Assembly of the State of Western Australia (being one of the States constituting the Commonwealth of Australia) entitled "An Act to confer limited Admiralty Jurisdiction upon the Local Court at Broome, and for other relative purposes" has been transmitted for the signification of His Majesty's Pleasure thereon:

And whereas the said Bill, so transmitted as aforesaid, has been laid before His Majesty in Council, and it is expedient that the said Bill should be assented to by His Majesty:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of the said Act, and in exercise of the powers thereby reserved to His Majesty as aforesaid, doth, by this present Order, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, declare His assent to the said Bill.

WHEREAS by the Isle of Man (War Legislation) Act, 1914, His Majesty has power to extend to the Isle of Man any Act which, in the opinion of His Majesty, was passed for the purpose of meeting any emergency created by the present War, subject to adaptateons for the purpose of making the Act applicable to the Isle of Man:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Courts (Emergency Powers) Act, 1917, shall extend to the Isle of Man, subject to the following

adaptations:-

1. In Section 1, Sub-section 2, after the words "Act of Parliament," wherever the same occur, there shall be read the words "or Act of Tynwald."

2. In Section 3 before the words "any Government Department" and the words "appropriate Government Department" there shall be read the words "the Lieutenant Governor or."

3. For the words "Increase of Rent and Mortgage Interest (War Restrictions) Act, 1915," wherever the same occur, there shall be substituted the words "Increase of Rent and Mortgage Interest (War Restrictions) (Isle of Man) Act, 1918."

4. For the words "passing of this Act," wherever the same occur, there shall be substituted the words "date of the Order in Council extending this Act to the Isle of Man."

5. For the words "passing thereof" in Subsection (1) of Section 5, there shall be substituted the words "date of such Order," and in Sub-section (2) of such Section for the words "summary conviction" there shall be substituted the words "conviction before a High Bailiff or two Justices of the Peace."
