ARMY COUNCIL ORDER.

THE METAL BANDS (WOOL BALES) ORDER,
1918.

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon
them by the Defence of the Realm Regula-
tions, the Army Council hereby order as
follows:—

1. No person shall, without a permit issued
by or on behalf of the Director of Raw Mate-
rials, sell or deliver any metal bands used for
binding wool bales, sheep skins, or bales of
mohair, which are now situated on or in any
quay or warehouse in the United Kingdom, or
may arrive in the United Kingdom, after the
date hereof, or at prices exceeding the prices
indicated in the Schedule hereto annexed, or
at such other prices as in any particular case
may be allowed by or on behalf of the Director
of Raw Materials.

2. No person shall without a permit issued
by or on behalf of the Director of Raw Mate-
rials, deliver for shipment to any place outside
the United Kingdom any bands of the descrip-
tion aforesaid.

3. It shall be the duty of any person having
in his possession, custody, or control any bands
of the description aforesaid to cause them to
be removed from the bales in such manner as
may be directed by or on behalf of the Director
of Raw Materials.

4. It shall be the duty of any person having
in his possession, custody, or control any
bands of the description aforesaid to furnish
such particulars as to his business as may be
required by or on behalf of the Director of
Raw Materials.

5. It shall be the duty of all persons to
comply strictly with the provisions hereof, and
with any requirement or direction made or
given by or on behalf of the Director of Raw
Materials for the purposes hereof, and any
person failing to comply with any such pro-
vision, requirement, or direction shall be
guilty of an offence against the said Regula-
tions.

6. This Order may be cited as The Metal
Bands (Wool Bales) Order, 1918.
