In conformity with the provisions of the Statute 56 and 57 Victoria, cap. 66, notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for India in Council proposes, with the advice and assistance of the Civil Service Commissioners, at the expiration of forty days from the date of this Gazette, to make the addition shown below in the Regulations for the admission of candidates to the Indian Civil Service, under Section 97 (2) of the Statute 5 & 6 George V., cap. 61.

It is proposed to add the following proviso

to Regulation 11; that is to say:—
"Provided that the Secretary of State for India in Council may exempt from the operation of Regulations 7 and 10 a selected Candidate who was successful at the open Competition held in August, 1914, and who, after his nomination as a Selected Candidate has continuously served and is still serving in His Majesty's Forces, and the Civil Service Commissioners, if satisfied as to the eligibility of the said candidate, exempted as aforesaid. in respect of health, character and conduct, may certify that he is entitled to be appointed to the Indian Civil Service, notwithstanding that he has not complied with the requirements of Regulations 7 and 10."

It is intended that the above proviso shall come into force as soon as made in order that certain selected candidates for the Indian Civil Service, who were successful at the open Competition of 1914, and who are now serving in His Majesty's Forces, may be appointed to the Indian Civil Service, without further

examination.
