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Turin, June 17.

THE Forces of the Allies before *Cazal* are hitherto employed in carrying on the Line of Circumvallation, and making several Redoubts, which will be finished in few days, and then, 'tis said, they will formally Besiege the place, for which they design about 22000 men; and the rest of the Forces are to Encamp at *Vigon*. The French continue all this while in their Quarters, having sent so many of their Troops towards the Coast of *Provence*, that they do not think themselves strong enough to take the Field on this side. We have an Account of the arrival of the Transport Ships at *Finat*, and that the Regiments designed to *Catalonia* were going to Embark.

Venice, June 18. The Letters we have lately received from the *Morea*, give an account of the Enemies preparations for some design against that Country, and of the Care of the Captain-General to oppose them; For which purpose he had Posted a good body of the Venetian Forces near the Pass of *Corinth*, and the rest of the Troops were so Quartered that they might be at hand to second them in case there was occasion. The Venetian Fleet was still at *Napoli di Romania*, and would probably stay there till the arrival of the Convoy which sailed from hence about the beginning of the last month. The Turkish Troops in *Dalmatia* are all marched to *Hungary*, which will give us an opportunity of making some attempt upon the Enemy in those Parts.

Vienna, June 18. The last Letters from *Hungary* inform us, That the Imperial Forces, who had their rendezvous near *Buda*, were marched to *Baja*, where the Foot Encamped, and the Horse at 3 or 4 miles distance from them, for the convenience of Forage, which was not so plentiful about *Baja*. That the Count de *Heydelsheim*, General of the Horse, was daily expected in the Camp; That the Forces, upon his arrival, were to be Mustered, and after that would march on towards *Peter Waradin*; and that in the mean time, a great quantity of Provisions had been sent thither by Water to be laid up for the use of the Army when they came into that Neighborhood. They continue all this while to work with extraordinary diligence on the Fortifications of *Esseck*, as well as *Peter Waradin*, which they propose to have finished this Summer. General *Veterani*, who commands the Imperial Forces on the Frontiers of *Transylvania*, is marched with them to observe the Tartars, who are coming to join the Ottoman Army which is to rendezvous between *Wissa* and *Belgrade*; We have yet no News that the Turks have drawn together any considerable number of their Forces; About 10000 lye in their Quarters near the Frontiers, and can soon assemble together; but the rest are to come from *Bania*, *Albania*, *Dalmatia*, and with the Grand Visier from *Sophia*, which is the place of rendezvous for the Asiatick Troops. The Change that has been lately made in the Ministry at the

Ottoman Port, is confirmed from all hands, and at the same time, the Advices from those parts continue to speak of the Sultan's resolution of going himself into the Field this Summer. The Elector of *Saxony* is expected here in two days; His Troops march towards the *Danube*, and propose to join the Imperial Army near *Peter Waradin* about the end of the next month. General *Caprara* stays here to accompany him to the Army, of which he is to have the chief Command under his Electoral Highness. The Minister of *Mausia* continues his sollicitation at this Court, to have *Cazal* restored to the Duke his Master, in case it be taken by the Allies.

Hailbrun, June 25. The Forces Commanded by Prince *Lewis* are still Posted near *Steppach*; Their Camp is very strong as well by its situation as the Works they have cast up, and the Army will continue there till the rest of the Forces have joined them, when Prince *Lewis* designs to march towards the Enemy, who continue Encamp'd about *Bruchsal*. The Count de *Lippe*, who Commands the Troops of *Hesse*, is expected here in a day or two in his way to join the said Forces, who are already marched to the *Bergstrait*; and those of *Munster* will in few days pass the River *Main*, in their march towards the Confederate Army.

Cologne, June 28. The Advices from the *Upper-Rhine* say, The two Armies continued in the same Camps; the Allies near *Steppach*, and the French near *Bruchsal*. The Forces of *Hess* were come into the *Bergstrait*; and those of *Munster* were to pass the River *Main* the 27th at *Costheim*, in their march thither. The French destroy the Forage on the other side of the *Rhine* as far as they can, and 'tis believed they will quickly repair that River.

Liege, June 28. The Forces of *Brandenburg* and *Liege* are marched towards the River *Mehaigne*, where they are to join with a Body of Horse Commanded by the Earl of *Athlone*. 'Tis believed their design is upon *Namur*; A great many Vessels pass towards *Huy* with Cannon, Ammunition, &c. from *Maastricht*; and a great number of Pioneers is Summoned from these parts, who are to be ready against the beginning of the next month.

Brussels, June 29. The Elector of *Bavaria* Encamped this Afternoon at *Ninove*, and marches to morrow to *Hall*; where the Pioneers that have been Commanded in from *Brabant*, are to join the Army. A great many Pioneers have been likewise Summoned to *Maastricht* from the Parts thereabouts. The Earl of *Athlone* advances with great marches towards the *Meuse*. *Marschal de Boufflers* marches to observe the Elector of *Bavaria*. The *Marschal de Villeroy* continues Encamped behind the Enemies Lines between *Ipres* and *Menin*.

Hague, July 1. By Letters from the Camp of the *Brandenburg* Forces of the 26th past, we have an account, That they were come to *Falais* on the River *Mehaigne*, about 2 Leagues from *Huy*, having
