

established in Great Britain under the above Act and the Trade Boards Provisional Orders Confirmation Act, 1913, for the Sugar Confectionery and Food Preserving Trade as defined in the Regulations made by the Board of Trade and dated 23rd December, 1913, have given notice that they have varied certain minimum rates of wages for female workers, the minimum rates as varied being as follows:—

1. For female workers under 15 years of age, 7s. 6d. per week.
2. For female workers of 15 and under 16 years of age, 11s. per week.
3. For female workers of 16 and under 17 years of age, 14s. 6d. per week.
4. For female workers of 17 and under 18 years of age, 18s. per week.
5. For female workers of 18 years of age and upwards who have been employed in the trade for an aggregate period of less than 12 months and cannot suitably be engaged on piece work and to whom the Trade Board shall have issued a certificate on the ground that the employment is not merely temporary or seasonal, 19s. 6d. per week.
6. For female workers of 18 years of age and upwards (and others to whose employment the minimum rate of 21s. 8d. per week is applicable under the terms of Section 1 (a) of the Notice issued by the Trade Board dated 30th September, 1918), 21s. 8d. per week.

The above minimum rates are weekly rates based on a week of 52 hours.

The Notice setting out the variations which have been made is dated 30th September, 1918, from which date such variations take effect as provided by the Trade Boards Act.
