PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council, dated the twenty-eighth day of November, nineteen hundred and fourteen, His Majesty was pleased to make regulations (called the "Defence of the Realm Regulations") under the Defence of the Realm Consolidation Act, 1914, for securing the public safety and the defence of the realm:

And whereas the said Act has been amended by the Defence of the Realm (Amendment) Act, 1915, the Defence of the Realm (Amendment) (No. 2) Act, 1915, and the Munitions of War Act, 1915, and other enactments:

And whereas the said regulations have been amended by various subsequent Orders in Council:

And whereas it is expedient further to amend the said regulations in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the following amendments be made in the said regulations:—

1. In Regulation 43B after the word "soldier" wherever that word occurs there shall be inserted the words "or airman."

2. The following Regulation shall be substituted for Regulation 46A:—

"46A. If any person—

(a) assists any prisoner of war to escape or knowingly harbours or assists any prisoner of war who has escaped;

(b) without lawful authority transmits, either by post or otherwise, or conveys to any prisoner of war any money or valuable security, or any article likely to facilitate the escape of any prisoner of war;

(c) (i) without lawful authority transmits or conveys otherwise than by post to any prisoner of war any letter, or written message, or written or printed matter;

(ii) without lawful authority transmits or conveys by post or otherwise on behalf of any prisoner of war any letter or written message or written or printed matter;

(d) without lawful authority conveys or sells any article of food to any prisoner of war who is in any place of detention for prisoners of war, or who is in receipt of Government rations;

(e) without lawful authority conveys or sells any intoxicating liquor or tobacco to any prisoner of war;

(f) being a person by whom any prisoner of war is employed fails to comply with any instructions issued to him by the proper

authority as to the conditions of such employment;

(g) does any act calculated or likely to prejudice the discipline of any prisoner of war or to interfere with the administration of any place of detention for prisoners of war or to interfere with the arrangements for the custody, management, employment, or proper conduct of any prisoner of war; he shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

"This regulation applies to interned persons, and to persons detained by order or under the directions of a Secretary of State while awaiting repatriation or deportation, as it applies to prisoners of war."

3. In paragraph (b) of subsection (1) of Regulation 55B for the words "or any of them" there shall be substituted the words "and, if so required, in any adjoining area, or any of such brigades."

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 25th day of October, 1918, in the words following, viz. :—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Your Majesty's Orders in Council bearing dates the 29th day of October, 1914, the 10th day of January, 1917, and the 13th day of March, 1917, sanction was given to the payment of Separation Allowance to the wives, and in respect of the children of Seamen, Marines, and Reservists, borne on the books of Your Majesty's Ships:

"And whereas we consider it desirable that in certain circumstances Supplementary Separation Allowances should be granted to the wives and dependants of Seamen, Marines, and Reservists, holding the Rating or Rank of Ordinary Seaman, Able Seaman, Private, or any relative Rating or Rank in other Branches of Your Majesty's Naval and Marine Forces:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction payment, with effect from the 16th May, 1918, of such Allowances, subject to the conditions as regards award and amount payable indicated in the Schedule hereto.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal, which is nevertheless most humbly submitted.

"SCHEDULE.

"1. It shall be a condition of the award of a Supplementary Separation Allowance under these Regulations that the Seaman or Marine

in respect of whom it is claimed shall have declared in favour of the claimant a weekly allotment from his wages, which—

(a) If his Full Pay and Allowances in the nature thereof do not exceed 12s. a week, is not less than 1s. 6d. a week, or

(b) If his Full Pay and Allowances in the nature thereof exceed 12s. a week, is not less than the weekly excess of such Full Pay and Allowances over 10s. 6d., provided that, if the excess be not an exact multiple of 6d., it shall be not less than the precise multiple of 6d. next below such excess.

"2. Subject to the declaration of the minimum allotment prescribed above, the Supplementary Separation Allowance shall be such weekly sum as, when added to that minimum allotment, and the amount of Navy Separation Allowance and Allotment Concession in course of payment, will make up a weekly sum equal to that which would have been payable to the claimant as Army Separation Allowance and State Allotment if the Seaman or Marine had been a Private in the Army.

"3. If the Full Pay and Allowances in the nature thereof of a Seaman or Marine, in respect of whom a Supplementary Separation Allowance has been granted, fall below the total at which they stood at the date on which the Supplementary Separation Allowance was awarded, the Admiralty may, in any case in which such a course appears appropriate, increase the Supplementary Separation Allowance, provided that the Allowance as thus increased shall in no case exceed the weekly sum properly payable under the two preceding Rules. Similarly if the Full Pay and Allowances in the nature thereof of any such Seaman or Marine be raised above the total at which they stood at the date on which the Supplementary Separation Allowance was awarded, such Supplementary Separation Allowance shall be reduced or withdrawn, as may be necessary to ensure that the Supplementary Separation Allowance, if any, continuing in course of payment shall not exceed the sum properly payable under the two preceding Rules."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as

are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas by Your Royal Warrant bearing date the 25th day of January, 1918, Your Majesty has been graciously pleased to sanction the grant, during the present War, of Allowances in respect of Children of Officers serving in Your Majesty's Army in the ranks of Second Lieutenant, Lieutenant, Captain, and Major:

“And whereas we are of opinion that like Allowances should be granted in respect of the Children of Officers of Relative Rank (except Commissioned Warrant Officers for whose Dependants provision is made by way of Separation Allowance) in the Royal Navy, Royal Marines, Royal Naval Reserve, and Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve, and in the Royal Naval Air Service:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction, with effect from the 1st October, 1917, and for the period of the present War, the grant of Allowances in respect of the Children of Officers of the Royal Navy, Royal Marines, Royal Naval Reserve, Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve, and Royal Naval Air Service, holding the Ranks or Relative Ranks of Sub-Lieutenant, Lieutenant, and Lieutenant-Commander, R.N., at rates not exceeding those set forth in the Schedule annexed hereto, provided that no Allowance be granted in respect of the Children of an Officer married subsequently to the 14th day of January, 1918, unless or until the Officer shall have attained the age of 22 years.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.”

“SCHEDULE.

“For the Children, under 18 years of age in the case of Sons, and under 21 years of age in the case of unmarried Daughters, of—

I.—(1) Commissioned Officers of the Royal Navy, Royal Marines, Royal Naval Reserve, and Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve, of and below the Rank or Relative Rank of Lieutenant, R.N., or Captain, R.M., with the exceptions specified below.

(2) Commissioned Officers of the Royal Naval Air Service of and below the rank of Flight Lieutenant, or Observer Lieutenant, provided that they are borne for ‘ground’ duties, and consequently are ineligible for flying pay.

(3) Chaplains, R.N., of under 8 years' seniority.

(4) Officers borne for special duties and in receipt of Consolidated Salaries not exceeding £400 a year.

(5) Temporary Lieutenant-Commanders R.N.R., and R.N.V.R., provided they are paid at rates not exceeding those applicable to Lieutenant, R.N.

(6) Officers of the Rank or Relative Rank of Lieutenant-Commander, R.N., promoted from Commissioned Warrant Rank.

(7) Quartermasters, R.M., Directors of Music, R.M., and the Musical Director, R.M., of the Royal Naval School of Music, whatever their Rank, £2 a month for each Child, subject to a maximum of £8 a month.

II.—(1) Commissioned Officers of the Royal Navy, Royal Marines, Royal Naval Reserve, and Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve, of the Rank or Relative Rank of Lieutenant-

Commander, R.N., or Major, R.M., with the exceptions specified above.

(2) Chaplains, R.N., of over 8 and under 15 years' seniority.

(3) Temporary Surgeons, R.N., and Surgeons and Dental Surgeons, R.N.V.R.

(4) Graded Commissioned Officers of the Royal Naval Air Service of and below the Ranks of Flight Lieutenant, and Observer Lieutenant, with the exceptions specified above.

(5) Officers of the Royal Naval Air Service of the Ranks of Flight Commander, Squadron Commander, Flight Observer, and Squadron Observer, when borne for ‘ground’ duties, and consequently ineligible for flying pay.

(6) Officers borne for special duties and in receipt of Consolidated Salaries exceeding £400, but not exceeding £500 a year, £1 a month for each child, subject to a maximum of £4 a month.

Payment may be continued beyond, or granted after, the normal age limit in cases in which Officers' Sons or Daughters are afflicted with lasting mental or bodily infirmity rendering them incapable of earning their own living, and dating from a period prior to the date on which the Son or Daughter attained the normal age limit.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

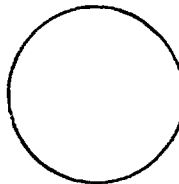

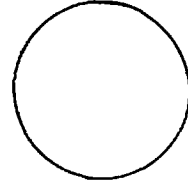

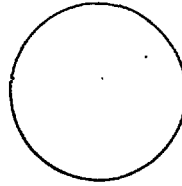

DEFENCE OF THE REALM.

RAILWAY WAGONS DISPOSAL (ENGLAND AND WALES).

ORDER DATED NOVEMBER 9TH, 1918, MADE BY THE BOARD OF TRADE UNDER REGULATION 7B OF THE DEFENCE OF THE REALM REGULATIONS.

In the exercise of the powers conferred upon them by Regulation 7B of the Defence of the Realm Regulations, the Board of Trade hereby order as follows:—

1. The trader responsible for the unloading of any railway wagon containing coal, coke or patent fuel delivered by a railway company shall unload it or take delivery of the contents thereof, and shall tender it to or place it at the disposal of the railway company within such time as is specified in the first part of the schedule hereto.

2. The trader responsible for the loading or unloading of any merchandise other than coal, coke or patent fuel conveyed or to be conveyed by railway shall load or unload and tender to or place at the disposal of the railway company the wagon employed, together with the covering sheet or sheets, if any, within such time as is specified in the second part of the schedule hereto.

3. After the expiration of such time as is specified in the schedule hereto, a railway company may make charges for the detention of any wagon or sheet owned by them, or which for the time being they are entitled to use, or for the use or occupation of any accommodation provided by them in connection with or arising out of the detention of any wagon or sheet.

4. No trader shall, without the written consent of the railway company, use for internal purposes any wagon or sheet belonging to a railway company, or any wagon or sheet of which the Board of Trade have taken possession under any Orders made in that behalf.

5. Nothing in this Order shall extend or apply to a wagon belonging to a private owner whilst the same is upon the private siding or premises of such owner, but save as aforesaid this Order applies to all railway wagons whether owned by a railway company or by a private owner. The expression "private owner" includes a person entitled to the use of a wagon under a hiring contract.

6. In this Order the term "trader" includes any person sending or desiring to send or receiving merchandise by railway, at whose disposal a wagon, whether empty or loaded, is placed.

7. The provisions of this Order are in addition to and not in derogation of any other provisions for enforcing the prompt loading and unloading of wagons.

8. The Detention of Wagons and Sheets (England and Wales) Order, 1917, is hereby revoked without prejudice to any matter or thing done or suffered or penalty incurred or proceedings taken thereunder.

9. Infringements of this Order are summary offences against the Defence of the Realm Regulations.

10. This Order applies to England and Wales only and may be cited as "The Railway

Wagons Disposal (England and Wales) Order, 1918."

At Depôts and in Private Sidings:—

Wagon to be unloaded and placed at railway company's disposal within 4 days exclusive of the day on which notice of arrival of the wagon is given.

In granting such certificate, the Board shall have regard to whether the particular depôt or siding was regarded in the coal trade as situate in London at the date of this Order.

PART II.

NUMBER OF DAYS ALLOWED FOR LOADING OR UNLOADING MERCHANDISE OTHER THAN COAL, COKE OR PATENT FUEL.

(A) WAGONS SUPPLIED EMPTY FOR LOADING.

At Stations, Private Sidings, Docks, Wharves, &c.:—

Wagon to be loaded and tendered to railway company for conveyance within 1 day exclusive of the day on which the wagon is placed at the trader's disposal.

(B) LOADING WAGONS AFTER CONVEYANCE.

At Stations:—

Wagon to be unloaded and placed at railway company's disposal within 2 days exclusive of the day of receipt by the trader of notice of arrival.

At Ports (Shipment Traffic only):—

Wagon to be unloaded and placed at railway company's disposal within 3 days exclusive of the day of arrival.

At Private Sidings, Docks, Wharves, &c.:—

Wagon to be unloaded and placed at railway company's disposal, if empty, within 2 days, or if reloaded, within 3 days, exclusive in either case of the day on which the wagon is placed at the trader's disposal.

PART III. (GENERAL).

The number of days to be allowed for the return of any covering sheet or sheets to be same as for wagons.

The term "day" in this Schedule means the twenty-four hours beginning at 6 a.m., excluding the twenty-four hours beginning at 6 a.m. on Sundays, Good Friday, Christmas Day, and any day declared by or under any Statute or Regulations to be a public holiday.

Notice of arrival may be given verbally or in writing, and may be sent by post, telegram or telephone.

Notice is hereby given that, under the
 Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regula-
 tions, 1914, the following Regulations have
 been made by the Lords Commissioners of the
 Admiralty and are now in force:—

(1) *Beachy Head to St. Albans Head—Traffic
 Regulations.*

I. REGULATIONS REGARDING TRAD- ING, FISHING AND PLEASURE CRAFT.

1. The areas on the South Coast of England
 to which the following orders apply are:—

Area A.—Enclosed by a line from Beachy
 head to Owers light-vessel to Boulder bank
 buoy, thence in a 315° (*N. 30° W. Mag.*)
 direction to the Portsmouth Defence area.

Area B.—Enclosed by a line from Culver
 cliff to a point 3 miles, 90° (*S. 75° E. Mag.*),
 from Culver cliff, thence within the 3-mile
 limit to a point 3 miles, 180° (*S. 15° W.*

Mag.), from Freshwater Gate, thence to Freshwater Gate.

Area C.—Enclosed by a line joining Chewton Bunny to Christchurch ledge buoy, thence to a point 3 miles, 180° (*S. 15^{\circ} W. Mag.*), from Anvil point, thence to a point 3 miles, 180° (*S. 15^{\circ} W. Mag.*), from St. Albans head, thence to St. Albans head.

2. The term craft as used herein includes ships, barges, boats and vessels of all descriptions, and the orders apply to all fishing and pleasure craft.

3. No craft are to go out in the specified areas between sunset and sunrise.

4. All craft from places within these areas are to be on shore or back in their harbour half an hour after sunset.

5. No craft are to be put to sea during fog or thick weather, and any caught at sea by fog, &c., are to return to shore or harbour at once, if possible.

6. Craft unable to return to harbour owing to failing wind or fog, &c., are to anchor and show the regulation anchor lights at night. No bright lights are permitted. Fishing craft anchoring off Brighton or Hove are to anchor between the piers.

7. Craft found after dark in the areas detailed in paragraph 1 are liable to be fired upon.

8. Fishing is permitted during daylight hours in areas A, B and C except within the limits stated in paragraph 9, by all *bonâ fide* fishermen, provided they are in possession of a permit which can be obtained from the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, through their District Fishery Officers or the Coastguard. When applying for these permits, fishermen are to state the port from which they intend to work, and this will be entered on the permit. Permits for areas A, B and C are only issued to craft registered locally. Under no circumstances are fishermen allowed to carry passengers in their boats.

Permits will not be issued for vessels transferred from ports of registry outside areas A, B and C to ports of registry inside those areas, except in special cases approved by Commander-in-Chief, Portsmouth.

9. No small craft may anchor or be under way in the area bounded as follows:—

(a) *On the North.*—By the coastline between Seaford head and Crowlink Coastguard Station.

(b) *On the West.*—By a line drawn from Seaford head in a 158° (*S. 7^{\circ} E. Mag.*) direction for a distance of $1\frac{3}{10}$ miles.

(c) *On the East.*—By a line drawn from Crowlink Coastguard Station in a 197° (*S. 32^{\circ} W. Mag.*) direction for a distance of $1\frac{3}{10}$ miles.

(d) *On the South.*—By a line joining the southern extremities of limits (b) and (c).

10. All unregistered fishing craft must carry their permit number painted on each bow in figures not less than 12 inches in height. Vessels registered as British sea fishing boats are to comply with the statutory rules as regards lettering and numbering.

11. Night fishing is permitted by special permit in a portion of area A by craft for which a Board of Agriculture and Fisheries permit has been issued. Applications for these special permits to be made to Captain A. B. Purvis, D.C.W.O., Worthing, through Mr. Edward Page, Chief Fishery Officer, 61, Tamworth Road, Hove.

12. Fishing is absolutely prohibited for all steam, oil, or petrol-driven fishing vessels of over 50-ft. keel length.

13. The following orders regarding oil of all kinds and petrol are to be complied with:—

(a) Oil, motor spirit, petrol, or other goods may not be shipped on board craft of any description, whether coasting or foreign, either as stores for the equipment or navigation of the vessel or as merchandise, except at places which are under the supervision of a Customs Officer. Such goods must be properly pre-entered before shipment, and a clearance must be obtained from the Customs Officials in accordance with the Customs War Powers Act, 1915, pars. 1 to 3.

(b) In places where there are no Customs Officials, oil or petrol-driven craft cruising in pleasure areas, and oil or petrol-driven fishing craft of 50-ft. keel length and under, may obtain their stores locally, provided the Coast-Watching Officer as representing the Customs Officials is previously notified and a Stock Book giving particulars of quantities received and used is kept on board and open for inspection.

(c) Sailing vessels may not have on board a quantity of petrol, motor spirit, benzine, paraffin, petroleum or similar substances exceeding four gallons.

14. Owners of motor craft, pleasure craft, and small craft of all descriptions are to supply to the Coastguard Officer of the district lists of all their boats and vessels which they may place afloat, and they are to obtain from him permits for them. Without such permits these craft are not to be used. The number of the permit is to be painted on each bow in figures not less than 12 inches in height.

15. Motor craft, pleasure craft, and small craft of all descriptions are not to proceed outside of their ports, creeks or rivers, during the hours of official day, unless in possession of a permit, which may be obtained from a Customs Official on personal application, or (in places where there is no Customs Official) from the Coastguard Officer of that district.

16. The areas within which pleasure craft with permits may move during daylight are as follows, and, except as provided for in paragraph 17, they are forbidden to move in any other areas:—

Seaford: Within three-quarters of a mile radius from Old Battery, Blatchington.

Newhaven: Within one mile radius from the end of the western breakwater.

Rottingdean: Within one mile radius of the slipway.

Brighton: Within one mile radius from eastern pier.

Hove: Within one mile radius from Coastguard station.

Shorham: Within one mile radius from the end of western pier.

Worthing: Within one mile radius from the end of town pier.

East Preston: Within one mile radius of Coastguard boathouse.

Littlehampton: Within one mile radius from the end of western pier.

Bognor: Within one mile radius of green fishing light.

Pagham: Within one mile radius from the coast watching hut.

Selsea: Within one mile radius from Coast-guard station.

Sandown Bay: Inside the line joining Culver cliff and Dunnose head.

Ventnor: Within one mile of Ventnor pier.

Christchurch: Inside line joining Chewton Bunny to Christchurch ledge buoy, and thence to Christchurch head.

Christchurch head to Sandbanks: Within 500 yards of low water mark.

Note.—Boating off Bournemouth is permitted inside a line joining the Martello tower near Sugar Loaf chine and Southborne, provided the boats are supervised and inspected by the Piermaster and Beach Inspectors in conjunction with the Coast-Watching Officer.

Poole harbour: Within line joining North and South havens.

Studland bay: From opposite Studland village to the old breakwater within 400 yards of low water mark.

Swanage bay: To the west of line joining Ballard and Peverill points.

17. At certain ports and places where pleasure cruising is permitted in areas A and C a strictly limited number of permits will be issued to amateur fishermen, who are residents and British born, to fish during daylight only in an extension of the pleasure cruising area. The conditions and regulations under which these permits are issued are printed on the permits and are to be strictly complied with. This relaxation of the rules has been made with the sole purpose of increasing the food supply.

Applications for these permits should be made:—

By residents of Newhaven to the Senior Naval Officer, Newhaven.

By residents of other places and ports in area A to Captain A. B. Purvis, R.N., Divisional Coast-Watching Officer, Lorne House, Broadwater Road, Worthing.

By residents of ports and places in area C to Captain A. L. K. Knapton, R.N., Divisional Coast-Watching Officer, Rope Hill, Lympington.

18. Pleasure permits will be issued at the discretion of the Customs Official and Coast-guard Officer subject to the following conditions:—

(a) No person shall receive a pleasure permit in respect of any craft for which he has been granted a Board of Agriculture and Fisheries fishing permit.

(b) Subject to par. (a), pleasure permits may be granted to private owners and to owners of craft for hire, on the strict understanding that no professional fisherman or boatman between the ages of 18 and 60 be employed either on shore or at sea in connection with such craft. Any infringement of this rule will lead to the immediate withdrawal of the permit.

(c) All persons who receive pleasure permits will be expected to do their utmost to increase the food supply by catching fish; but this does not give them authority to go outside the limits of the pleasure area.

(d) The pleasure permit is always to be carried by the person in charge of the craft when the craft is in use, and the owner of the craft is responsible that those using the craft understand the orders relating to pleasure cruising.

19. Trawling and other forms of bottom

fishing with nets are prohibited within the following areas:—

(a) Within one mile radius of a position $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles, 154° (S. 11° E. Mag.), from Newhaven breakwater.

(b) Within one mile radius of a position $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles, 171° (S. 6° W. Mag.), from West pier, Brighton.

20. *Shipping of Amateurs as Crew on Commercial Fishing Vessels.*—Where it is proved that there is a shortage of *bona fide* fishermen to form the crews of fishing craft provided with Board of Agriculture and Fisheries fishing permits, permission may be granted to a limited number of approved amateur fishermen or yachtsmen enabling them to ship as crew on such craft. In cases where this is required application is to be made to the District Inspector of the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries (Mr. E. S. Russell, Warblington Cottage, Havant).

21. No excursion traffic is allowed except with the written permission of the Commander-in-Chief, to be obtained for the season in regard to standing excursions, and on each occasion of special excursions.

22. No boat (except such boats as may be authorised by the Senior Naval Officer, Littlehampton), by whatever means propelled, shall be under way in Littlehampton Harbour between Runcorn Piles and the outer end of the Western breakwater between 2 hours before and 1 hour after high water. During these hours a red flag will be kept hoisted at swing bridge and also at the flagstaff of the Littlehampton Motor Club.

23. Nothing in these orders shall affect the standing orders relating to the Defence Areas at Portsmouth, Newhaven, and Poole.

II. NEWHAVEN AND APPROACH— CAUTION WITH REGARD TO EX- TINCTION OF LIGHTS; TRAFFIC REGULATIONS; AREA WITHIN WHICH ANCHORING AND TRAWL- ING IS PROHIBITED.

CAUTION WITH REGARD TO EXTINGUISHMENT OF LIGHTS.

Notice is hereby given that the following lights within the port are liable to be extinguished without further notice being issued:—

1. Light at South end of West pier.
2. Light at North end of West pier.
3. Light at end of Sea wall.
4. Red Leading Light on Packet wharf.

REGULATIONS FOR THE INTERNAL TRAFFIC OF THE PORT OF NEWHAVEN.

The port is now closed. Entry into the Port of Newhaven is prohibited to all merchant ships other than those on Government Service, and those which may have previously obtained special permission to enter from the Senior Naval Officer at Newhaven.

Until further notice, the following regulations are to be observed by all merchant shipping (including barges, boats and private vessels), moving within the limits of the Commercial Port of Newhaven.

Entrance into Port.

1. Shipowners and local agents are warned that their vessels should be directed to arrive at, and leave, the port as a general rule by daylight, and to conform to the following regulations.

2. Shipowners and local agents will facilitate the entry of their vessels by giving previous

notice of probable time of arrival to the Senior Naval Officer, Newhaven (Telegraphic address:—Divisional Transports, Newhaven), with particulars of appearance, &c., so that they may be readily identified.

3. A vessel wishing to enter the port is to proceed to the Examination Anchorage marked on Admiralty Charts Nos. 2154 and 1652, and there anchor, unless previously met by the Examination Steamer. Instructions will be given to the Master by the Examining Officer as to entering.

4. The Examination Anchorage is westward of the breakwater. It is a square area, of which the sides are 888 yards long, the northern one being drawn in the direction 255° (*West Mag.*) from a point situated 255° (*West Mag.*) and 800 yards from the Breakwater Lighthouse. (See Admiralty Charts Nos. 1652 and 2154.)

5. The Examination Steamer will be found at the seaward end of the entrance channel.

6. The Examination Steamer will be distinguished by the following means:—

By Day.—A white ensign, and at the foremast head a special pilot flag (white and red, horizontal, surrounded by a blue border). When the port is closed the Examination Steamer will, in addition, hoist three red balls, and three red balls will be similarly hoisted at the flagstaff at the West pier.

By Night.—Three lights vertically, six feet apart, conspicuously displayed at the end of the yard, so as to show an unbroken light round the horizon. When the port is closed, these lights will be red; when it is open, they will be white.

Note.—These lights are in addition to the ordinary navigation lights, and they will also be hoisted at the flagstaff at the West pier.

Leaving Port.

7. No vessel is to attempt to leave the port without having first received permission from the Senior Naval Officer.

Pilots.

8. At the discretion of the Chief Examining Officer, small coasters and fishing vessels, whose masters are British subjects, or those transports whose masters are in possession of a pilotage certificate for the port, will be allowed to enter or leave the port without a pilot.

9. Subject to the above exemptions, pilotage is compulsory, and all merchant vessels must have a licensed local pilot on board before leaving or attempting to enter.

Traffic by Day.

10. The movements of all vessels, barges, or boats of any kind are subject to the direction of the Senior Naval Officer, whose orders are to be obeyed immediately.

11. Subject to the above, merchant shipping may move as usual within the port of Newhaven, taking care to keep clear of any H.M. ships which are being navigated in the port.

Traffic by Night.

12. All vessels, barges, and boats must display the regulation lights.

13. When anchoring care must be taken to be well clear of the fairway.

Approach to Government Vessels and Establishments.

14. No vessels or boats will be allowed to approach any Government ship, vessel, or lighter, or other Government craft, or any Government establishment, without special permission.

Warning.

15. Vessels disobeying these Regulations will be liable to be fired on.

AREA WITHIN WHICH ANCHORING AND TRAWLING IS PROHIBITED.

All vessels are prohibited from anchoring or trawling or any other forms of bottom fishing with nets, in an area formed by lines joining the following positions:—

- (a) Birling gap.
- (b) Lat. $50^\circ 38' 00''$ N., long. $0^\circ 09' 00''$ E.
- (c) Lat. $50^\circ 39' 00''$ N., long. $0^\circ 02' 00''$ W.
- (d) Lat. $50^\circ 43' 00''$ N., long. $0^\circ 02' 00''$ W.
- (e) Seaford head.

See also paragraph 19 (a) of Part I. of this Notice.

III. SPITHEAD APPROACH—TRAFFIC REGULATIONS.

1. Passage of vessels between Noman's fort and the charted position of Warner light-vessel is entirely prohibited.

2. Vessels of all descriptions are prohibited from anchoring in St. Helen's roads to the westward of a line drawn in a 162° (*S. 5° E. Mag.*) direction from Noman's fort.

3. Until further notice all vessels should keep clear of a circular area of half a mile in radius the centre of which is situated $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles, 270° (*N. 75° W. Mag.*), from Fishing light on Selsea bill.

IV. POOLE BAY AND SOLENT APPROACH—RESTRICTION OF TRAFFIC.

No craft of any description, other than craft employed on Admiralty work, is to be under way to the northward of a line joining St. Catherine's point and Anvil point, between one hour after sunset and one hour before sunrise, or during fog.

(2) *Portland Harbour Approach—Restriction of Traffic.*

No vessels or boats of any description are to move in the area north of a line joining Portland bill with St. Albans head, by day or night, unless proceeding into Weymouth anchorage.

Variation.— 15° W.

Note.

This Notice is a revision of the former Notice quoted above.

Caution.

This Admiralty Notice to Mariners is issued under the provisions of the Defence of the Realm Regulations, and failure to comply strictly with the directions contained in it will constitute an offence against those Regulations.

Any person found guilty of such an offence is liable to severe penalties both of imprisonment and fine.

Any person aiding or abetting the commission of such an offence is himself guilty of an offence against the Regulations.

Attention is also drawn to the fact that any infringement of the directions contained in this Admiralty Notice to Mariners is liable to result in the detention of the ship or vessel.
