GENERAL ORDER OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT BOARD.

THE PUBLIC HEALTH (INFLUENZA) REGULATIONS, 1918.

To the Mayor, Aldermen, and Commons of the City of London, in Common Council assembled;—

To the Councils of the several Metropolitan Boroughs, Municipal Boroughs, and other Urban Districts in England and Wales;—

To the Councils of the several Rural Districts in England and Wales;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas We, the Local Government Board, are empowered by Section 130 of the Public Health Act, 1875, as amended by the Public Health Act, 1896, from time to time to make, alter, and revoke Regulations with a view to preventing the spread of any epidemic or infectious disease, and to provide for the enforcement and execution of the Regulations;

And whereas Influenza is an epidemic and an infectious disease, and it appears to Us to

be expedient that the Regulations hereinafter set forth should be made in relation to Influenza:

Now therefore, We, by this Our Order, and in the exercise of the powers conferred upon Us by the Public Health Act, 1875, the Public Health (London) Act, 1891, and the Public Health Act, 1896, and of every other power enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

ARTICLE I.—In these Regulations, unless the contrary intention appears:—

(a) The expression "Local Authority" means, as the case may be, the Mayor, Aldermen, and Commons of the City of London in Common Council assembled, the Council of a Metropolitan Borough, the Council of a Municipal Borough or other Urban District, or the Council of a Rural District;

(b) The expression "District" means the District subject to the jurisdiction of the Local Authority for the purposes of the Public Health (London) Act, 1891, or of the Public Health Act, 1875, as the case may be;

(c) The expression "place of public entertainment" means a building used as a theatre, music hall, place for public singing, dancing, or music, place for cinematograph exhibition, or other place of entertainment or amusement, to which the public are admitted by ticket or by payment.

ARTICLE II.—The following Regulations shall apply and have effect with respect to every place of public entertainment, that is to say:—

(1) Where the public are admitted to a place of public entertainment, the entertainment there shall not be carried on for more than three hours consecutively;

(2) There shall be an interval of not less than thirty minutes between any two entertainments given at a place of public entertainment to which the public are admitted;

(3) During the interval referred to in the last preceding paragraph the place of public entertainment shall be effectually and thoroughly ventilated.

ARTICLE III.—Any Local Authority may, on the advice of their Medical Officer of Health signified in writing, relax, so far as regards their District, and either generally or for any particular period, or as regards any particular place or class of place of public entertainment, the requirements of these Regulations or any of them, upon such conditions, if any, as the Local Authority may determine.

ARTICLE IV.—It shall be the duty of every Local Authority in England and Wales to enforce these Regulations, which shall come into operation on the 25th day of November, 1918, and continue in force until revoked by Our Order.

ARTICLE V.—This Order may be cited as the Public Health (Influenza) Regulations, 1918.
