In the Matter of Max Eugen Alfred Seligmann.

Revocation of Certificate of Naturalization.

Whereas I am satisfied that Max Eugen Alfred Seligmann, to whom a Certificate of Naturalization numbered 5675 was granted on the 25th January, 1888, pursuant to the provisions of the Naturalization Act, 1870, has since the date of the grant of the certificate been for a period of not less than seven years ordinarily resident out of His Majesty's dominions otherwise than as a representative of a British subject, firm or company carrying on business, or an institution established in His Majesty's dominions, or in the service of the Crown, and has not main-
