SILVER BULLION (MAXIMUM PRICE).

ORDER OF THE TREASURY FIXING A MAXIMUM
 PRICE FOR SILVER BULLION SOLD IN THE
 UNITED KINGDOM.

The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's
 Treasury, in pursuance of the powers con-
 ferred on them by Regulation 30EEE of the
 Defence of the Realm Regulations, hereby
 make the following Order:—

As from the date of this Order the maximum
 price for silver bullion in the United Kingdom
 shall be 48 7-16d. per standard ounce.

The Order of the 13th November fixing a
 maximum price at 48½d. per standard ounce is
 hereby revoked.
