Cadiz. August 28. N. S.

THE 20th of this month arrived in this Bay 14 English Men of War, and one Dutch, with two Fire-ships, having under their Convoy the *Reward*, the *Expedition*, the *George*, from *Scanderoon*; the *Chandois*, the *Crown*, the *Concord*, the *Richard*, from *Smirna*; the *Ruby*, the *Jacob*, the *Bonadventure*, the *Prosperous Africk*, from *Zant*; the *William and John*, from *Galipoli*; the *Robert and James*, and the *Burton*, from *Alicant*; two Dutch Ships from *Smirna*, and one from *Venice*: And yesterday they all failed again for *England*, together with several other English and Dutch Merchant-ships, Danes, Hamburgers and Genoufes; being in all about 50 Sail.

Barcelona, Aug. 30. On the 16th of the last Month arrived here 5 Dutch Men of War, with several Victuallers from *Cadiz*, who failed again the next day to joyn the Fleet before *Palamos*. The 20th came in the *Carlisle* and *Plimouth*, from *Legborne* and *Genoua*, having taken near *Thoulon* a French Ship of 14 Guns, laden with Sugar from *Martinico*. The 23d arrived several Dutch Men of War and Transport-ships, with 4000 Soldiers from *Flanders*, who landed here, and are gone into Quarters of Refreshment. Admiral *Russell* having received Advice that the French were fitting out their Fleet at *Thoulon*, sailed the 27th towards the Coast of *Provence*, after having thrown above 1500 Bombs into *Palamos*, which destroyed greatest part of the Town, and killed many of the French. The Marquis *de Gastanaga* has drawn off the Spanish Forces from before *Palamos*, and, by our last Advice, was encamped about two Leagues from that place.

Madrid, Septemb. 7. Yesterday an Express was dispatched from hence to *Cadiz*, with Orders for the departure of the Galeons; which is believed will accordingly sail about the end of this month. The Garrison of *Ceuza* is still closely besieged by the Moores. We have Advice, that on the 23d past, in the evening, a Flash of Lightning set fire to a Magazine of Powder in the Town of *Almeida* in *Portugal*, which blew up the Castle, and totally destroyed the place, with above 300 of its Inhabitants.

Coruma, Septemb. 17. The Spanish-Expedition Packet-boat arrived here the 13th, in 8 days from *Falmouth*; and the day before came in two

Dutch Privateers from the *Streights*. From *Lisgo* of the 9th Instant they advise, that the *Bonadventure*, *Robert Walle* Master, arrived there the 8th from *Newfoundland*.

Legborne, Septemb. 5. We have Advice from *Messina*, that the *Essex* Man of War, Captain *Wright* Commander, with the two French Prizes, the *Content* and *Trident*, sailed thence the 26th of the last Month, to joyn the Fleet.

Venice, Septemb. 9. A great Convoy will be ready to sail for the *Levant* by the beginning of the next Month. We have received Letters from *Constantinople* which give this Account, The Sultan has made great Alterations since his coming to the Government, all the chief Officers who were advanced by his Predecessors, *Solyman* and *Achmet*, being strangled or banished; the late *Visier*, who had the Reputation of a prudent Man, and the fittest in the Empire for that Office, was deposed and strangled, being accused of having had some private Meetings with the principal Officers of the Janizaries, in order to hinder the Grand Signior's going into the Field; and his Body was exposed for two days at the Gate of the *Seraglio*, with all the Marks of Ignominy; and the Seal (which is the Badge of this Employment) was given to *Mahomet Bassa*, who was Page to Sultan *Mahomet*. The *Mufti* was deposed, and *Fessoula Effendi* put into his place, who has a great share in the Management of the publick Affairs. *Hafsan Bassa*, who was Bassa of *Scio* when taken by the Venetians, is made Caimacan of *Adrianople*; and *Osman*, Bassa of *Cyprus*, Caimacan of *Constantinople*. The Captain Bassa is disgraced, and that Office given to *Mexxomorto*, who commanded the Turkish Men of War in the late Fight against the Venetians: The Fleet he is to have under his Conduct this Summer will consist of 33 fighting Ships, 10 whereof belong to *Argiers*, and 3 to *Tripoli*, and 20 Gallies. The Grand Signior decamped from *Adrianople* the 10th of *June* and will move by short Marches to *Belgrade*: His Army is composed of about 80000 men.

Vienna, Septemb. 10. By the last Letters from *Hungary*, the Grand Signior was encamped near *Temeswaer*, and the Elector of *Saxony* near *Betsch*: The former seemed to have a design against *Transilvania*; and to prevent it, the Imperialists would continue their March to joyn with General *Veterani*, who on his side advances to meet them. Their Imperial Majesties

ities are at present at *Ebersdorffe*, and intend to continue there till the middle of the next month.

Francfort, Septemb. 16. The Armies that have acted on the *Rhine* this Summer will, 'tis thought, separate in few days, and go into their Winter-Quarters. The Imperialists work with great diligence on the Fortifications of *Eppingen* and other places, to bridle the Garrison of *Philipsburg*, and prevent the Enemy's Incurfions during the Winter towards the *Neckar*.

Cologne, Septemb. 20. The 14th instant arrived here the Marquis *d'Aronches*, Ambassador Extraordinary from the King of *Portugal* to the Emperor; and on the 16th he continued his Journey towards *Venna*. The States of this Diocess are assembled at *Bonne*; and the Elector of *Cologne* has demanded of them an extraordinary Subsidy for maintaining the Forces he has now on foot.

Falmouth, Septemb. 16. Yesterday arrived here the *Spanish Expedition*, in 7 days from the *Groyne*; and the lame evening came in the *Sujan and Mary*, and the *George Frigate*, both from *London*, and bound to *Cork in Ireland*, and from thence to the *West-Indies*. A Dutch Privateer, called the *Anna Jacoba*, brought in this morning a Prize called the *John of Dunkirk*, laden with Deals and Tar for *Brest*, taken some days ago on the French Coast.

Plimouth, Septemb. 17. Yesterday came in the *Germoon*, who the 14th in the afternoon saw 7 French Men of War about 9 Leagues from *Ushant*, and gave the Westward, one of which gave her chase for some time. The same day arrived here the *Smirna-Factor*, with about 20 Sail bound to this place and *Falmouth*. And this day came into this Port His Majesty's Ship the *Norwich*, with several Merchant-ships bound to the *West-Indies*.

Hull, Septemb. 18. Yesterday arrived here our East Country Ships, being 8 Sail: A Fleet of 150 Light Colliers are passed by to the Northward, under Convoy of 3 Men of War.

Yarmouth, Septemb. 20. Yesterday came into this Road the *Ree-Buck*, with several Merchant-ships from the Southward; and this day the *Selebay*, with some Coasters.

Deale, Septemb. 20. On the 19th came into the *Downes* 3 Dutch Men of War, with several Merchant-ships from *Holland*; as also a Venetian Ship, called the *Joseph*, from *Zant*, bound to *London*; and this morning the said Dutch Men of War, with the Ships under their Convoy, sailed again to the Westward. The Squadron of Men of War commanded by Sir *Cloudfley Shovell* was yesterday in the Afternoon off the *Northforeland*, being bound for the Dutch Coast, to attend His Majesty in his Passage to *England*. The Wind is now at N. E.

Whitehall, Septemb. 21. An humble Address has been made to His Majesty by the Council, Burgeffes and Representatives of the several Counties of the Province of *Maryland*, in a General Assembly convened and met under *Francis*
