PADIHAM.

Whereas the Urban District Council of Padiham (hereinafter called the Council), have made application to the Local Government Board for the issue of a Provisional Order under Sections 297 and 303 of the Public Health Act, 1875, to partially repeal, alter, or amend the Padiham Urban District Council Act, 1908, so as:—

(1) To extend for a further period of ten years the period limited by Section 38 of the said Local Act for the construction of the reservoir, conduits, and other works, referred to therein, and to make applicable to the extended time the powers granted to the Council or their predecessors by the Indenture of the first day of November, 1892, referred to in Section 39 of the Act:

(2) To substitute a period of fifteen years for the period of seven years and six months mentioned in paragraphs (D) and (F) of Section 55 of the said Local Act and to make provision for the payment of interest by the owners upon the moneys already expended by the Council under that Section, and to provide that any agreement made under paragraph (H) of the Section shall be deemed to have been made under the Section as so amended: and

(3) For the several purposes of the Application or for purposes connected with, incidental to, or consequent on those purposes to make any such alteration or amendment of the said Local Act, or of any other Local Act or of any Act confirming a Provisional Order made in pursuance of any of the Sanitary Acts or of the Public Health Act, 1875 in force in the said District as may be necessary or desirable:

And whereas it is proposed that a Provisional Order should be issued in compliance with the said Application;

Notice is hereby given, that R. C. Maxwell, Esquire, LL.D., Barrister-at-Law, one of the Inspectors of the said Board, will attend at the Council Offices, Padiham, on Thursday, the Thirteenth day of March, 1919, at a Quarter past Ten o'clock in the forenoon, to hold a Local Inquiry into the subject-matter of the said Application and the proposed Provisional Order.

And notice is hereby further given, that any person interested may attend at such Inquiry and be heard with reference to the said Application and the proposed Provisional Order.
