ORDER OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL IN ENGLAND.

Thames Estuary and River Medway—Regulations with regard to Fishing Vessels, Yachts and Pleasure Craft.

Former Notice.—No. 1191 of 1917; hereby

Mariners are hereby warned that, under the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, the following Regulations have been made by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty and are now in force:

1. No vessel or boat is allowed to fish to the eastward of a line drawn from the North Fore-

land to the North-East Gunfleet buoy.

2. No vessel or boat is allowed to cruise or anchor to the eastward of the above line except in the traffic routes.

3. The bye-laws of the Shoebury Artillery

danger area are to be observed.

4. No boat may approach Osea island in the River Blackwater at any hour of the day or night within 300 yards of high-water mark or approach or pass to the northward of any of H.M. vessels moored off the south side of the

5. Mariners are warned that the danger of. drifting mines still exists.
