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Plymouth, November 6.

Vessel lately arriving here from Malaga, confirms to us the report that Captain Ruth with two of His Majesties Fregats lying hefore Saly, had taken one of their Men of War, and forced three others of them with some of their Prizes on

shore, where they were all of them destroyed.

Yesterday and this day came into this Port about 50 sail of ships, whereof about 20 from Ireland, the rest from the Bastwards, all of them outwards bound; and amongst them the Dartmouth Fregat bound for Tangier, and afterwards for the Canarier, for the Convoy of our Merchants. Here is also put in one Dutch Ship laden with French Wines.

Hull, Nov. 8. Here are lately arrived 6 vessels of this place from Holland, one of which had the fortune to meet with a great ship laden homewards from Riga, but grown so leaky, that her men were about to quit her, but by this timely affistance, she was (though with some difficulty) safely brought into Humber. Here is also arrived a Sweek from Stockholme, intending for Linne, informing us, that another ship laden from the same place, intending hither, was forced to put into Christiana, from whence going out, she was by some missfortune foundred, and sunk to the bottom in the River.

Maples, Offob. 23%. On Munday last arrived here a Courier Extraordinary from Spain, who (leaving here some disparches with the Viceroy, with Orders from Her Catholick Majesty to his Excellency, to pass from hence to Rome on his Embassie of Obesience to His Holines) departed with all possible diligence for Messina. The next day arrived an Extraordinary from Rome sent to the Nuncio, ordering him to use his endeavors for the sending the German Soldiers into the Venetian service.

On Saturday morning returned hither the 5 Gallies b.longing to this Port, from their voyage into the Levant.

Rome, Octob. 27. The King of Poland has fince the Refignation of his Crown entertained tome thoughts of coming hither; and in order thereunto made known his defires to the Pope, that he might enjoy such Franchiles and Exemptions as have been allowed to the Queen Christina of Swedeland; whereupon the Pope hath ordered Monsegnior Rossi Advocate Fiscale of the Camera, to give him an account of what Grants were made to the said Queen.

On Friday last the Venetian Ambattadour had an Extraordinary Attilience from his Holiness and Cardinal Rospigliosi about the German soldiers lately employed in the Kingdome of Naples, which he desires may be tent for Gandia,

to the affistance of the Republick.

Tis said the Pope intends in little time to fill up the Vacancies in the Sacred Colledge, by compleating the number of the Cardinals; among t whom may be promoted Monfegnior Pallavicino Uncle to Segnora Pallavicino of Genona, between whom and Don Tonafo Kospigliosi the Popes Nephew, a Marriage is at the last consente to. The other Candidates are said to be Monsegnior Cerri, Auditor di Rola, Monsegnior Bonacors Treasurer, one of the Popes Nephews (supposed to be) Abbot Felice, with the three Nuncio's Pigniatelli, Borronco, and Bergellini, employed in the Courts of the Emperour and Kings of Spair and France.

Warfaw, 080b. 2". The particular and preparatory Diets are for the most part ended with much quietness, only in that at 570da, the Sieur Agohy, Palatine of Inou.odiflania having accused the High Chancellour of private enteat vours to promote some Prince to the succession, for the advantage of his partic lar interest; the Chancellour purgering himself from th accusait n, proceeded, to recrimination, urging, that the Palatie chad by several open and publick scrions savoured the Fench design for promotion whereof he had received a considerable sum of Moneys, which so incented the Assembly, that publickly clying out against the Palatine, they were proceeding to violence, and had in probability stain him, had he not in time made his escape from them.

From Prussia we are told, that the Protestants and Catholicks have proceeded with so much moderation at Mariemburg, that the former have obtained a promise for the maintenance of their priviledges, and liberty of Conscience; and that in this Assembly, they have resolved to entertain 1200 men, which are to be employed for the deserce of that Countrey, and that all of them shall be obliged to take an oath of fidelity to the Republick and States of Prussia.

King Cafimir intends ludienly to pass into Podolachia, where he will continue during the time of the Election of his successor. The Prince of Lorrain seems at present to have

the greatest interest amongst the Electors.

From Ukrania we have a confirmation of the great victory of the Muscovites over the Tartars and Cossacks, in which Sultan Galga, brother to the Chamos Tartary is said to have been either killed or taken prisoner, no news being heard of him since the the Battle; and that the said Tartars and Cossacks are by this victory reduced to so mean a condition that they are not able to continue longer in the field without a powerful succor from the Cham, which they press for with much eagerness.

Genoua, Offob. 29. Here is lately arrived from Cadiz the Dutch Convoy of two Men of War an three Metchants Ships, bringing with them a confiderable funume of Mo-

neys.

From Milin we are informed, that the Marquis de Mortara their Governour, with the Count Galeazzo Trotti his Camp-Mafter General, and several other o the principal Officers of his Army, having vifited the Fo tificati ns of Mortara, Novara, and Arona; in all which places he had been received with great honour and demonstrations, was returned again to Milan: having in all places taken order for the necessary reparations of the Forts, and their sup-ply with all things, of which they stood in want. He is now fertling a strict Discipline amongst the soldiery, and endeavours to ease the Countrey of a great part of their burthen, by dismissing mort of the forreign Companies and fuch others as can best be spared from the necessary defence of t'e Countrey under his Government; and particularly, the Regiment of Majorque which came last from Spain, but has incorporated the I ldiers in the Old Tertia's or the Spanish I fantry, which he intends to keep full and complest 3 and that he has intentions to cashier all those Companies which have been railed fince the Peace 1660, The Command of the remainder of the German Foot is conferred on the Prince de Bezzolg; with the Tile of Commifsaty General.

Madrid, Octob. 21. Upon an information given in the 13th instant to the Queen Regent by a Reformed Officer Don Farnardo Patina, the brother to Don Juan of Auftia's Secretary, was taken into cultody and secured 3 upon whose examination, and the retirement of the Secretary, for whom also a strict search had been made; the Marquis de Salinas was some days after commanded to take with him some soldiers of the Guard, with a party of 80 Horse, and to march to ocanna, where opening private Orders, he went thence with all diligence to Consuegra to secure the person of Don Juan, but he having timely withdrawn himself into Arragon, sent a Letter to the Queen Regent, bearing date the 21 in stant from Couluegra, wherein after many expressions of his zeal for Her Majesties fervice, wherein he professes himself ready to spend every drop of his blood: he c'arges the couse of his retirement upon Her Confessor Father Eberardo, the better to secure his person from his practises, desiring Her Majesty to Suspend Her judgement upon his tetirement, till the rece pt of a second Letter from him by way of Manisest.

In the mean time, for the better fecusity of the Peace 200 Horse are ordered to be drawn into this City, and 15000 more to quarter about it, to be in readiness upon all occasi-

Venice, Nev. 2. We have not received of late any farther news from Candia but what confirm to us that the Rains which have fallen in great abundance in that Kingdom, have ruined a great part of the Enemies Mines, and fultrated all their hopes of making any farther advances this year upon the Town. 'Tis as confidently faid, that the French success are fafely arrived, which adds fresh courage to the Defendants, and as much dispair to the Enemy. This notwithstanding, the Senate is as careful as formerly to provide for a constant supply of all forthof necessaries. This last week departed from hence to the artant for Zante, with the forces lately from German; other ships attending them in that place for their transportation into Candia.

From Dalmatia we are informed, that most of the forces raised by the Bassa of Bossine for the relief of their Army before Candia being discouraged by the tediousness of the Siege, and the great numbers which have perished before it, sell into a mutiny, and afterwards deserted the Employment.

Cologne, Nov. 13. The Lorrain forces are said to be quartered about three miles from Mayence, keeping themfelves within their own bounds, expecting yet a greater addition to their Infantry before they will adventure upon any Siege for the enlarging of their Winter Quarters. A party of about 20 Lunenburgers Horse and Foot, lately dit nisfed from the service of the States-General of the United Provinces, having passed the Rhine about Binghen, where marching thence for the affirmance of the Lorrainers, of whose intentions intelligence being given to Monsieur La Roche a Co lonel in the Prince Elector Palatines Army; He with a party of 300 Horse, immediately marched away to attend them, and neer Creuznach, sell in a mongst them, killing several of them upon the place, and amongst others the Count Van Dona, taking prisoners 111, with a ltheir Baggage, which he carried off to Oppenheim.

Paris, Nov. 17. The Sieur Foly is by His Majestles, Order gone for Portug 1 to negotiate in His Majestles name with the Prince Don Pedro about the Trade into the East Indies, and to strengthen, the Commerce there by uniting our force with that of Portugal.
