The following Amendments to the Statutes of Exeter College, Oxford, made by the Governing Body of the said College, and sealed on the 24th day of February, 1919, have been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions contained in "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877":—

Amendment to the Statutes of Exeter College, Oxford, passed unanimously by the Governing body of the College at a Meeting specially summoned for the purpose.

That in Statute III, Section 25, line 4, (Edition 1897), after the words "in the University" shall be inserted the words "or Heads of University Institutions or Departments thereof."

That in Statute III, Section 25, line 5, after the word "Tutorial" shall be inserted the words "or Research."

The College Seal was ordered to be affixed to the above amendments at a Meeting of the Rector and Fellows, being the Governing Body of the College, held on February 24th, 1919.

The following Statute made by the Governing Body of St. John's College, Oxford, on the 22nd day of November, 1918, (and sealed on the 13th day of December, 1918), has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877":—

Ex parte the President and Fellows of Saint John's College, in the University of Oxford.

A STATUTE made to amend certain Statutes framed by the Commissioners appointed under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, (40 and 41 Vict., c. 48), in relation to St. John's College, in the University of Oxford, duly passed at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of the said College specially summoned for this purpose on the 22nd day of November, 1918, by the votes of the whole number of persons present and voting, and submitted to His Majesty the King in Council.

Whereas in Statute XV, Clause 1, of the Statutes of the said College it is enacted:—
"The President and Fellows may from time to time pay out of the Corporate Revenues a sum not exceeding £500 in any year to a Pen-

sion Fund and may add to it a sum deducted from the Tuition Fund, such deduction not to exceed £10 per centum in any year. The proceeds of any Advowsons which may be sold by the College and any property which the President and Fellows hold in trust for the purchase of advowsons may, if the President and Fellows think fit, be added to the capital of this Fund. The capital shall be invested from time to time in any securities in which Trust Funds may legally be invested. The income of the Fund, including the sums paid to it yearly from the corporate revenues and from the Tuition Fund, shall be applicable to the payment of pension; No pension shall be payable out of the capital of the Fund; and any pension of an earlier date shall be payable in priority to any pension of a later date." And in Clause 3 of the same Statute:—"The President and Fellows may also if they think fit, grant to any person who has served the College as Bursar for thirty years, or for a less period if he retires on account of sickness or infirmity, a pension which shall in no case exceed £200 a year."

And whereas in Statute XVI, Clause 2, it is enacted:—"In the year 1908, and in every succeeding year, the President and Fellows shall contribute the sum of £600 towards the emoluments of the Sibthorpe Professor of Rural Economy, or if they shall elect the said Professor to an ordinary Fellowship in the College, then so long as the Professor shall be a Fellow of the College, they shall contribute £400 a year to the emoluments of the Professor, in addition to the emoluments of his Fellowship."

"So soon as the amount of the corporate revenues of the College will permit, after satisfying the several charges and payments imposed or authorised by these Statutes, including the augmentation of the number of Open Scholarships to twelve, the said corporate revenues shall be further charged with the payment of an annual sum of £250, which shall be paid to the University, and shall be applied to such purposes connected with the Professoriate, or otherwise with the advancement of learning, science and research within the University as the University with the consent of the College, may determine."

And whereas it appears to us the President and Fellows of the said College that it is desirable that the said Statutes shall be altered and amended in manner hereinafter appearing:—

Now We, the President and Fellows of the said College, in exercise of the powers vested in us under and by virtue of the 54th section of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, do, by this present instrument under our Seal, alter and amend the Statutes of the said College as hereinbefore set out in manner following, that is to say:—

In Statute XV, Clause 1, by adding at the end of the Clause the words "If and so long as the income of the Pension Fund shall exceed £1,500 a year the whole or any part of the income remaining after payment of the pensions chargeable upon the fund may be transferred at the discretion of the College to the Tuition Fund; but such transference shall only be made at a stated General Meeting of the College."

In Clause 3 of the same Statute by substituting for the word "thirty" the word "twenty," and by omitting the words "which shall in no case exceed £200 a year," and by substituting

for them the words "payable out of Corporate revenue which in no case shall exceed in amount £10 a year for each year of service."

In Statute XVI, Clause 2, by substituting for the figures "£600" the figures "£800," and by substituting for the figures "£400" the figures "£600," and in the second paragraph of the same Clause by substituting for the figures "£250" the figures "£300," and by omitting the remainder of the Clause following the figures "£250," and by substituting the words "which shall be paid to the University towards the stipend of the Professor of Forestry, or if the Professor shall be a Fellow of the College, they shall pay £100 to the University towards the stipend of the Professor."

“The expression ‘enemy country’ in this Proclamation means the territories of the German Empire and of the Dual Monarchy of Austria-Hungary, together with all the Colonies and Dependencies thereof”;

And whereas it was also declared by the said Proclamation that from and after the date of the said Proclamation the persons therein referred to were prohibited from having certain transactions with any person or body of persons of whatever nationality resident or carrying on business in an enemy country:

And whereas it was further declared by the said Proclamation as follows:—

“Nothing in this Proclamation shall be taken to prohibit anything which shall be expressly permitted by Our Licence, or by the licence given on Our behalf by a Secretary of State or the Board of Trade, whether such licences be especially granted to individuals or be announced as applying to classes of persons”;

And whereas by Proclamations dated the 8th day of October, 1914, the 7th day of January, 1915, and the 14th day of September, 1915, the said Proclamation dated the 9th day of September, 1914, was amended as in those Proclamations set forth:

And whereas it is desirable to grant the licence hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, the Board of Trade, on behalf of His Majesty, and in pursuance of the powers reserved in the said Proclamations and all other powers thereunto them enabling, do hereby give and grant licence to all persons

and bodies of persons resident, carrying on business or being in the United Kingdom to trade and have commercial and financial transactions with persons or bodies of persons resident or carrying on business in Croatia and Slavonia, Bosnia, Herzegovina, and those parts of Dalmatia not covered by the Royal Proclamation dated the 10th day of February, 1919.

Provided always that any licence which may be necessary in respect of any transaction under any prohibition of export or prohibition of import for the time being in force in the United Kingdom, or in respect of any remittance of money out of the United Kingdom covered by Regulation 41 D of the Defence of the Realm Regulations, is first obtained:

Provided also that this licence shall not permit any person or body of persons to pay to any person or body of persons resident or carrying on business in the said territories any sum of money which by the terms of the Trading with the Enemy Amendment Acts, 1914 and 1915, or either of them, is required to be paid to the Custodian appointed under the Trading with the Enemy Amendment Act, 1914, but such sums of money must be paid to the said Custodian.

Provided further that this licence shall not permit any person or body of persons to pay or deliver to any person or body of persons resident or carrying on business in the said territories any sum of money or property of which by the terms of the Trading with the Enemy Amendment Acts, 1914 and 1915, or either of them, notice has been or ought to have been given prior to the date hereof to the said Custodian.

If an Examination begins in one of the first six months of any year, Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of March in that year. If an Examination begins in one of the last six months of any year, Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of September in that year.

In reckoning age for Competition, persons who have served for two full consecutive years in any Civil situation to which they were admitted with the Certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding five years which they may have spent in such service.

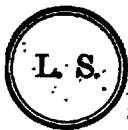

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. Notwithstanding the provisions of the Yorkshire (West Riding and District) (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1919, the Yorkshire (West Riding and District) (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1919 (No. 5), the Yorkshire (West Riding) (Leeds District) (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1919, and the Yorkshire (West Riding) (Leeds District) (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1919 (No. 2), an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District may grant a licence authorising the movement of an animal from any premises situate within the Scheduled District described in the Yorkshire (West Riding) (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1919 (No. 5), except premises within the Prohibited Areas described in the First Schedule to that Order, to a railway station in any of the Boroughs specified in the First Schedule to the Yorkshire (West Riding) (Leeds District) (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1919 (No. 2).

2. The movement from the railway station of any animal moved with a licence under the preceding article shall be subject to the conditions set out in the last-mentioned Order.

To empower the Council to purchase and acquire and the Rhymney Valley and General Electric Supply Company, Limited (in this notice referred to as "the Company"), to sell to the Council the undertaking of the Company for such price or consideration and upon and subject to such terms, conditions and stipulations as have been or may be agreed upon between the Council and the Company, or defined by the Bill.

2. To confirm (with such variations as may be necessary or desirable) the terms of agreement made between the Company and the Council dated November 25th, 1918, to extend the time for completing the purchase of the undertaking of the Company, and to enable the parties thereto to carry the same into effect.

3. To empower the Council to carry on the business of the Company and to continue to supply the area heretofore supplied by the Company, to employ the Resident Engineer of the Company and other usual transitory provisions.

4. To authorize the Council to generate, transform, store and supply electric energy for lighting, heating, power and all other purposes, public and private, as defined by the Electric Lighting Acts, within the urban district of Bedwellty, in the county of Monmouth, and such parts of the urban districts of Gelligaer and Mynyddislwyn as are at present supplied by the Company.

5. To empower the Council to continue the use of any lands or buildings acquired by them from the Company for the generation, transforming and supply of electricity for all purposes.

6. To authorize the Council to open, break up and interfere with streets, roads and public places, ways, footpaths, railways, tramways and bridges, culverts, sewers, drains, gas and water pipes and mains, and telegraph and telephone wires, and to lay down, erect, maintain, renew and remove, either above or under ground or otherwise, electric lines, conductors, mains, pipes, tubes, wires, posts, street or distribution boxes, meters, apparatus or other works or things required for the purpose of enabling the Council to generate, supply, store, convey, transmit or distribute electricity, and to confer all such powers upon the Council as may be necessary for effecting the objects of the proposed undertaking.

7. To authorize the Council to take, collect and recover rents and charges for the supply of electricity for lighting, power or other purposes, and the use of any motor or other machine, lamps, meters, fittings or apparatus connected therewith, and to prescribe the limit of the price to be charged therefor, and to authorize special charges to be made where no rent is charged for the supply and use of mains, meters, fittings, and other apparatus, and to

make provision with regard to the supply of energy to premises having a supply of gas.

8. To confer upon the Council all or some of the powers of the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act, 1899, and enactments incorporated therewith, and to alter, vary and extinguish all rights, powers and privileges which would or might interfere with any of the objects of the intended Act, and to confer all other rights and privileges necessary for carrying such objects into effect.

9. To authorize the Council to take in bulk from any Corporation, Company or person for any of the purposes of their undertaking a supply of electrical energy upon such terms as may be agreed between the Council and any such Corporation, Company or person.

10. To authorize the Council to borrow money for the purposes of the intended Act upon the security of the undertaking or the revenue thereof, and upon the district fund and general district rate (if necessary), and any other rates and property of the Council, and to empower the Council to grant and issue mortgages, stock, debentures, and debenture stock in respect thereof, and to confer further financial powers on the Council.

11. To provide for the application of the revenue and profits arising from the electricity undertaking of the Council, and for meeting any deficiency in such revenue, and to provide for the formation and application of a reserve fund in respect of the said undertaking.

12. To enable the Council to sell and the Urban District Councils of Gelligaer and Mynyddislwyn, or either of them, to purchase on terms to be agreed or defined in the Bill the respective portions of the undertaking of the Company situate within their respective districts, and to make such provision as may be necessary to carry the same into effect and to enable those Councils to continue the supply of electricity at present afforded by the Company within their respective districts.

13. To extend the area of supply of the Gelligaer Urban District Council for purposes of electricity supply so as to include the whole of the urban district of Gelligaer and to amend the Gelligaer (Bedlinog and Fochriw) Electric Lighting Order, 1914, accordingly.

14. To constitute the Mynyddislwyn Urban District Council the authority for the supply of electricity for public and private purposes within the urban district of Mynyddislwyn, and to confer upon that Council the powers, rights and obligations usually conferred on local authorities by Provisional Order of the Board of Trade.

15. To empower the Urban District Councils of Gelligaer and Mynyddislwyn respectively to raise on loan or mortgage moneys for the payment of the purchase price and for other purposes connected with the acquisition and carrying on of the portions of the undertaking purchased by them respectively.

16. To make further provision with reference to the testing, quality, purity and pressure of gas supplied by the Council, and the instruments to be used for such testing; to relieve the Council from all obligations relating to the maintenance of a standard of illuminating power, and in lieu thereof to prescribe a standard calorific power for the gas supplied by them.

17. To authorize the Council to purchase coke-oven gas or gas in a crude or unpurified form from any Company, body, or person, and to utilise the same for the purposes of the gas undertaking of the Council, and to supply the same to any Authority, Company, or person within the limits of supply of the Council for lighting, heating, manufacturing, power, or other purposes, and to enable the Council to lay mains and pipes for the purposes of obtaining or supplying such gas.

18. To empower the Council, notwithstanding Section 21 of the Bedwellty Urban District Council Act, 1912, and an agreement dated February 16th, 1915, and made between the Council and the Mynyddislwyn Urban District Council, to increase the price charged for gas supplied to the Mynyddislwyn Council, and, for such purposes, to vary or repeal Section 21 of the aforesaid Act of 1912, and to determine or temporarily suspend the operation of the said agreement, or otherwise to alter the same in such manner as Parliament may sanction.

19. To relieve the Council of any obligation to give a supply of gas, in bulk or otherwise, to the Mynyddislwyn Urban District Council.
