The following Amendments to the Statutes of Exeter College, Oxford, made by the Governing Body of the said College, and sealed on the 24th day of February, 1919, have been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions contained in "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877":—

Amendment to the Statutes of Exeter College, Oxford, passed unanimously by the Governing body of the College at a Meeting specially summoned for the purpose.

That in Statute III, Section 25, line 4, (Edition 1897), after the words "in the University" shall be inserted the words "or Heads of University Institutions or Departments thereof."

That in Statute III, Section 25, line 5, after the word "Tutorial" shall be inserted the words "or Research."

The College Seal was ordered to be affixed to the above amendments at a Meeting of the Rector and Fellows, being the Governing Body of the College, held on February 24th, 1919.

The following Statute made by the Governing Body of St. John's College, Oxford, on the 22nd day of November, 1918, (and sealed on the 13th day of December, 1918), has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877":—

*Ex parte* the President and Fellows of Saint John's College, in the University of Oxford.

A STATUTE made to amend certain Statutes framed by the Commissioners appointed under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, (40 and 41 Vict., c. 48), in relation to St. John's College, in the University of Oxford, duly passed at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of the said College specially summoned for this purpose on the 22nd day of November, 1918, by the votes of the whole number of persons present and voting, and submitted to His Majesty the King in Council.

Whereas in Statute XV, Clause 1, of the Statutes of the said College it is enacted:—  
"The President and Fellows may from time to time pay out of the Corporate Revenues a sum not exceeding £500 in any year to a Pen-
