TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established under that Act and the Trade Boards Provisional Orders Confirmation Act, 1913, for certain branches of the Sugar Confectionery and Food Preserving trade in Great Britain, as defined in the Regulations made by the Board of Trade, and dated 23rd December, 1913, give notice as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they Propose to Fix Overtime Rates under Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, to apply in respect of male and female workers employed in the trade, whether engaged on time or piece-work, as follows:-

For the first two hours Overtime on any day, except Sundays and customary Public Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be equivalent to TIME AND A QUARTER, that is to say, one and a quarter times the minimum rate otherwise applicable.

For Overtime after the first two hours, the Overtime Rate shall be equivalent to TIME AND A HALF, that is to say, one and a half times the minimum rate otherwise applicable.

For all time worked on Sundays and customary Public and Statutory Holidays the Overtime Rate shall be equivalent to DOUBLE TIME, that is to say, twice the minimum rate otherwise applicable.

In compliance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act. 1918, the Trade Board propose to declare THE NORMAL NUMBER OF HOURS OF WORK PER WEEK TO BE 48.

All hours worked in any week in excess of the normal number of hours shall be paid for as Overtime, and in any case the Overtime Rate applicable shall be payable where on any day the number of hours worked exceeds 9, or, in the case of Saturday, exceeds 5.

Provided that where it is the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on alternate Saturdays, the normal. number of hours for the week in which attendance on Saturday is required shall be deemed to be 50.

The Trade Board will consider any Objections to their Proposal to Fix Overtime Rates, which may be lodged with them within two months from the 3rd March, 1919. The Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Act, 1909, and the Trade Boards Provisional Orders Confirmation Act, 1913, for certain branches of the Sugar Confectionery and Food Preserving trade in Great Britain, as defined in the Regulations made by the Board of Trade, and dated 23rd December, 1913, have given Notice that they have varied in accordance with their Proposal 18th November, 1918, the General Minimum Time Rates fixed by them for female workers of 18 years of age and upwards from 5d. to $6\frac{1}{2}$ d. an hour and for male workers of 22 years of age and upwards from 8d. to 11d. an hour, with corresponding variations for younger workers.

The Trade Board have also given Notice that they have received notification from the Minister of Labour, that he has made an Order, dated 28th February, 1919, under Section 4 (2) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, confirming the rates as varied by the Trade Board, and specifying the 3rd March, 1919, as the date from which such minimum rates shall become effective.

On application to the Trade Board further information will be given as to the rates varied, if in the opinion of the Trade Board the applicant is likely to be affected thereby.
