By the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

No. 79.

WHEREAS His Majesty has been pleased, in exercise of the power in that behalf conferred on Him by Section one, sub-section one, of the Trading with the Enemy (Extension of Powers) Act, 1915, by divers Proclamations, and in particular by a Proclamation dated the 23rd day of May, 1916, and amended on the 16th day of January, 1918, entitled "The Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation," to prohibit all persons or bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, resident, carrying on business, or being in the United Kingdom from trading with any of the persons or bodies of persons mentioned in the List contained in the last-mentioned Proclamation, such List being therein referred to as the Statutory List:

And whereas by Section one, sub-section two, of the said Act, it is provided that any List of persons and bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, with whom such trading is prohibited by a Proclamation under the said Act may be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of a Secretary of State:

And whereas the Statutory List contained in the last-mentioned Proclamation has been varied and added to by subsequent Orders of Council:

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs to the effect that the Statutory List should be further varied and added to as set forth in the Schedule hereto.

Now, therefore, Their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to Order, and it is hereby Ordered,

That the Statutory List be varied and added to as set forth in the Schedule hereto.

Whereof the Right Honourable Arthur James Balfour, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, the Controller of the Foreign Trade Department, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

NOTE (1).—All persons or firms resident, carrying on business or being in the United Kingdom are prohibited from having, with any person or firm mentioned in this List, or in any List issued under the Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation, any dealings other than such as are expressly authorized by paragraph 5 of the Proclamation. A List (The Consolidated List No. 76A), consolidating all previous Lists, up to and including that of the 21st February, 1919, together

with List No. 77 of the 7th March, 1919, List No. 78 of the 21st March, 1919, and the List herewith annexed, contain all the names which up to this date are included in the Statutory List.

Additions to and variations in these Lists will be published at intervals approximately of two weeks.

The Lists are published in the London Gazette and reproduced in the Board of Trade Journal, and separate copies of all Lists may be obtained at a small cost from the Superintendent of Publications, His Majesty's Stationery Office, Imperial House, Kingsway, W.C.

NOTE (2).—Where a firm is mentioned in the List, every partner in the firm is also included in the List, and all dealings with any partner in the firm, as well as all dealings with the firm, are prohibited; and conversely, all dealings with a firm, any partner in which is mentioned in the List, are also prohibited.

NOTE (3).—Where a person or firm mentioned in the List has more than one address in the country or group of countries under which the name of the person or firm appears, all dealings in that country, or in any country in the group, with such person or firm are prohibited, even in cases where one only of the addresses or one only of the countries is specifically mentioned.

NOTE (4).—Trading is prohibited under the Trading with the Enemy Proclamations of 25th June and 10th November, 1915, with any person or firm of enemy nationality resident or carrying on business in China, Siam, Persia, Morocco, Liberia or Portuguese East Africa. Persons or firms in the United Kingdom are therefore prohibited from trading with any person or firm of enemy nationality in any of those countries, even though such person or firm is not mentioned by name in the Statutory List.

NOTE (5).—In order to minimise as far as possible any inconvenience which may be caused to British traders by the dislocation of export trade owing to the inclusion in the Statutory List of a former connection, the Foreign Trade Department is collecting and classifying the names of non-enemy firms who may be able to act as substitutes for firms mentioned in the Statutory List. A considerable amount of information is already available at the Foreign Trade Department, and it is in many cases possible to suggest the names of satisfactory substitutes for individual firms on the Lists, without the necessity of referring the matter abroad. The Department is, however, prepared on application to inquire of His Majesty's Representatives abroad for the names of suitable substitutes. When the applicant wishes this done by telegraph he is required to undertake to pay the cost of telegraphic correspondence. It would greatly facilitate the work of the Foreign Trade Department if applicants in making inquiries would specify the particular trade or trades for which substitutes are required. *General inquiries for new connections abroad should be addressed to The Comptroller-General, Department of Overseas Trade (Development and Intelligence), 73, Basinghall Street, London, E.C. 2.*

NOTE (6).—The Statutory List for each country is telegraphed, on the day of issue, to His Majesty's Representative in that country,

who is instructed to notify accordingly British Consular Officers, to whom persons abroad should apply for information as to names on the List. Persons and firms in the United Kingdom with agencies or branches abroad would, however, be well advised to furnish such agencies or branches with issues of the List as they appear. The names on the Lists for all countries in Central or South America are also notified to His Majesty's Ambassador at Washington, who transmits them to H.M. Consul-General at New York and to other centres in the United States likely to be interested.

NOTE (7).—It is not unusual for firms in Holland and the Netherland East Indies to be registered under names commencing with descriptive terms such as "Handel Maatschappij" (Trading Company) or "Naamlooze Venootschap" (Limited Liability Company). In such cases it has been found more convenient to publish the firm under its proper name followed by the general descriptive term "Handel Maatschappij" or "Naamlooze Venootschap" (N.V.) as in the case of an English company.

WHEREAS it is provided by Section 2 of the Customs (Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914, that any Proclamation or Order in Council made under Section 8 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, as amended by the Act now in recital, may, whilst a state of war exists, be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade:

(A) Wood pulp.

(2) That the following headings should be added:—

Chemicals, drugs, dyes, dyestuffs and medicinal and pharmaceutical preparations, the following:—

(B) Potassium bicarbonate and mixtures containing potassium bicarbonate;

(A) Cod liver oil and preparations containing cod liver oil;

(A) Malt extract and preparations containing malt extract;

Provisions and victuals which may be used as food for man, the following:—

(B) Malt sugar (maltose) and articles and preparations containing malt sugar;

(A) Sheepskins, haired or woolled.

Now, therefore, their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the same be approved.

Now, therefore, the Board of Trade, on behalf of His Majesty, and in pursuance of the powers reserved in the said Proclamations, and all other powers thereunto them enabling, do hereby give and grant licence to all persons residing, carrying on business or being in the United Kingdom to negotiate for the supply of any goods, wares or merchandise to German Austria, to supply any goods, wares or merchandise to German Austria, to carry or arrange for the carriage of and to insure any goods, wares or merchandise destined for German Austria, and to take such action as may be necessary or convenient to secure payment for any goods, wares or merchandise so supplied or for any charges or expenses connected with such supply, carriage or insurance:

Provided always that any licence which may be necessary in respect of any such supply under any prohibition of export for the time being in force in the United Kingdom is first obtained:

Provided also that nothing in this Licence shall be deemed to authorize the payment of money which at the date hereof is or but for the war would have been due to any person or body of persons resident or carrying on business in

German Austria or the withdrawal or disposal of funds or property held or managed in this country for the account of or on behalf of any such person.

Now, therefore, the Board of Trade, on behalf of His Majesty and in pursuance of the powers reserved in the said Proclamations, and all other powers thereunto them enabling, do hereby give and grant licence to all persons and bodies of persons resident carrying on business or being in the United Kingdom to trade and have commercial and financial transactions with persons or bodies of persons resident or carrying on business in Poland;

Provided always that any licence which may be necessary in respect of any transaction under any prohibition of export or prohibition of import for the time being in force in the United Kingdom, or in respect of any remittance of money out of the United Kingdom covered by Regulation 41D of the Defence of the Realm Regulations, is first obtained;

4. The proposed tramroads and tramway are intended to be constructed on a gauge of 3 feet 6 inches or such other gauge as may be approved by the Board of Trade. The motive power proposed to be employed upon the tramways will be animal power, or electrical, steam, or other power not being animal power, or partly one such power and partly another.

5. To provide that so much of Section 34 of the Tramways Act, 1870, as limits the extent of any carriages used on any tramway beyond the outer edge of the wheels of such carriages shall not apply to carriages used on the tramroads, tramways and light railways of the Corporation.

7. To authorize the Corporation to provide and run trailer and coupled carriages on any of their tramroads, tramways and light railways.

8. To empower the Corporation and any other corporation, authority, company, body or person to enter into and fulfil contracts or agreements with reference to the construction, maintenance, working, running over, user, leasing, sale or purchase of or interchange of traffic upon the tramroads, tramways, and light railways of the Corporation, or the tramways of such other corporation, company, body or person, and to confirm any such contract or agreement which may be entered into prior to the passing of the Bill.

9. To empower the Corporation to provide, maintain and run motor omnibuses within the borough and beyond the borough along the following route:—

In the parish of Seaton and the township of Greatham from the southerly boundary of the borough along the road of the Tees Conservancy Commissioners between West Hartlepool and Port Clarence

to the bridge carrying that road over Great-ham Creek; and in any other direction that may be necessary or expedient.

10. To empower the Corporation to demand and take fares, tolls and charges for the use of and for the carriage and conveyance of passengers and goods on and by their omnibuses, and to acquire lands and erect buildings therefor, to make bye-laws for the regulation thereof, and to apply thereto the Conveyance of Mails Act, 1893.

11. To provide that the tramroads and tramways and omnibuses and works authorized by the Bill shall form part of the tramway undertaking of the Corporation, and to extend and apply thereto all or some of the provisions contained in the West Hartlepool Corporation Tramways Order, 1912 (confirmed by the Tramways Orders Confirmation Act, 1912), the West Hartlepool Light Railways Order, 1897, the West Hartlepool Light Railways (Deviation, etc.) Order, 1901, and the West Hartlepool Light Railways (Amendment) Order, 1913, and the enactments incorporated therewith respectively.

12. To make further provision in regard to the tramways, light railways and omnibuses of the Corporation, including the appointment of stages and the fares, rates and charges to be taken in respect of each stage; the persons to and the places at which fares, rates and charges shall be paid; the appointment of stopping and starting places; the running of through cars and omnibuses; the running of special services of cars and omnibuses on special occasions, and the exemption of such special services of cars and omnibuses from restrictions as to fares; the imposition of penalties upon persons obstructing, damaging or interfering in any manner with the working of tramways or light railways; the removal of obstructions; the erection of shelters, waiting rooms and cloak rooms, the use of portions of the public streets and the purchase of land for that purpose, and power to charge for the use of cloak rooms; the widening of highways by reducing the width of footways and otherwise; the temporary stoppage of streets during execution of works; the lopping of trees along the routes of tramways, light railways and omnibuses; the deposit of property found in trams or omnibuses, and the sale thereof by the Corporation if unclaimed and the application of the proceeds of the sale; the attachment of signs or directions indicating stopping places to lamp-posts, poles, standards and other erections, and the acquisition and exercise of patent and other rights or licences relating to motive power or otherwise.

13. To empower the Corporation to make and maintain the following street works, together with all necessary and proper approaches, junctions, abutments, embankments, arches, steps, sewers, drains, culverts, works and conveniences connected therewith or incidental thereto, namely:—

Street Work No. 1.—A widening of the 'Lees Conservancy Commissioners' Branch road to the Zinc Works to be situate wholly in the parish of Seaton, in the county of Durham, commencing at a point 9·1 chains north of the centre of the bridge carrying the road of the said Commissioners between West Hartlepool and Port Clarence across

lands belonging to the Earl of Eldon, and terminating at a point 4·5 chains north of the centre of the said bridge.

Street Work No. 2.—An extension and a widening of Brenda Street on the west side thereof, to be situate wholly in the parish of West Hartlepool, commencing by a junction with Stockton Road at the junction of that road with Sydenham Road, and terminating at the junction of Brenda Street with Windermere Road.

14. To empower the Corporation to deviate laterally and vertically from the lines and levels of the works shown on the deposited plans and sections.

15. To authorize the Corporation to break up, alter, widen, divert, stop up (either temporarily or permanently), make junctions and communications with and otherwise interfere with streets, roads, highways, footpaths, pavements, steps, areas, cellars, windows, water-courses, sewers, drains, mains, pipes, wires, telegraphs, telephones and apparatus within the parishes, township, borough and county aforesaid, for the purposes of constructing and maintaining the works or otherwise for the purposes of the Bill.

16. To empower the Corporation, for the purposes of the works, for the purpose of providing frontage to the streets intended to be extended, widened or improved and for other the purposes of or indicated in the Bill, to purchase or acquire or use by compulsion or agreement or to take on lease lands, houses and buildings in the parishes, township, borough and county aforesaid, and to acquire by compulsion or agreement rights or easements in, over or connected with any lands, houses and buildings therein, and to provide that they shall not be obliged to acquire the surface of such lands.

17. To exempt the Corporation from the operation of section 92 of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845 (so as to enable them to acquire parts only of certain properties), the provisions of that Act relating to superfluous lands and the restrictions upon the entry on lands, and to make other amendments in the Lands Clauses Acts in their application to the Bill.

18. To make special provision with regard to the amount of compensation to be paid in respect of the lands to be acquired under the Bill and the determination thereof, to provide that all questions of disputed compensation shall be determined by one arbitrator or by justices; that any buildings erected, alterations made or interest created after such date as may be mentioned in the Bill, shall not be taken into consideration; to render persons claiming compensation liable to pay their costs in certain events, and to make provision for enabling them to amend their claims.

19. To authorize the Corporation to sell, lease and dispose of the lands vested in them or acquired under the Bill upon and subject to such terms and conditions as they may think fit and to enlarge the powers of the Corporation relative to the acquisition, retention, user and disposal of lands under any general or local Act.

20. To authorize the Corporation to levy tolls, rates and duties, to alter and increase existing tolls, rates and duties, and to confer, vary and extinguish exemptions from the payment of tolls, rates and duties.

21. To authorize the Corporation to purchase by agreement lands for the purpose of constructing a public carriage road along the route of the said intended Tramroad No. 2.

22. To extinguish all public and private rights of way and other rights over the lands acquired under the Bill, and to vary and extinguish all other existing rights and privileges which would or might in any way prevent, interfere with or delay the accomplishment of any of the objects of the Bill, and to confer other rights and privileges.

23. To enable the Corporation to amend any rates made by them in pursuance of the Public Health Act, 1875, and the West Hartlepool Extension and Improvement Act, 1870, so as to accord with any new or supplemental valuation list.

24. To empower the Corporation to establish a fire insurance fund and an accident fund to meet claims under the Employers' Liability and Workmen's Compensation Acts or otherwise out of the rates and revenues of the Corporation, and also to enable them to grant gratuities to servants in their employment who may be injured or incapacitated, or to the widow or family of any such servant.

25. To authorize the Corporation to borrow or raise money for the purchase of lands for the execution of the works and for other the purposes of the Bill, and to charge the moneys so borrowed on the borough fund and borough rate, the improvement fund and improvement rate, and the undertakings, estates, rates, rents, revenue and other property of the Corporation or any of such securities, and to execute and grant and issue mortgages and other securities, to authorize the Corporation to apply any of their corporate funds or other moneys authorized to be raised to any of the purposes of the Bill, and to provide that moneys borrowed under the Bill shall not be reckoned in the limit of borrowing prescribed by the Public Health Act, 1875, or the West Hartlepool Extension and Improvement Act, 1870.

26. To make provision for the formation, maintenance and application of sinking funds, the use of sinking funds instead of borrowing, the method of meeting any deficiency in the receipts from the undertakings of the Corporation, and the charge thereof upon the borough fund and borough rate, the improvement fund and improvement rate of the borough, and to make further provision in regard to the borrowing, re-borrowing and repayment of money by the Corporation.

27. To authorize the Corporation to use one form of mortgage for all purposes for which they are for the time being authorized to borrow money, charging the loans upon all or any of the revenues, rates or property of the Corporation.

28. To provide for the consolidation of the loans of the Corporation and the equation of the periods for repayment or to enable the Corporation to make a scheme or schemes for that purpose subject to confirmation by the Local Government Board, including any necessary powers of borrowing money for giving effect to such scheme, and to confer further powers upon the Corporation in regard to financial matters.

29. To vary or extinguish all existing rights and privileges which would or might in any

way prevent, interfere with, or delay the accomplishment of any of the objects of the Bill, and to confer other rights and privileges.

30. To enact all necessary provisions for giving full effect to the purposes of the Bill or of the general or local Acts in force in the borough, including the making and confirmation of bye-laws, the imposition of penalties for breach of provisions of the Bill or of any bye-laws thereunder, or for obstructing the Corporation or their officers, the determination of compensation, the laying of information, the recovery, apportionment and application of penalties, damages, expenses, costs and charges, the recovery of demands in the county court and the entry of premises.

31. To repeal or amend or to incorporate with the Bill with or without amendments all or some of the provisions of the several local Acts and Provisional Orders confirmed by Acts relating to the borough following or some of them, viz.:—The West Hartlepool Extension and Improvement Act, 1870; the West Hartlepool Order, 1878 (confirmed by the Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (Bournemouth, &c.) Act, 1878); the West Hartlepool Order, 1879 (confirmed by the Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (Ashton-under-Lyne, &c.) Act, 1879); the West Hartlepool Order, 1880 (confirmed by the Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (Abingdon, &c.) Act, 1880); the West Hartlepool Order, 1883 (confirmed by the Local Government Board's Provisional Order Confirmation (No. 2) Act, 1883); the Borough of West Hartlepool (Extension) Order, 1897 (confirmed by the Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (No. 11) Act, 1897); the Borough of West Hartlepool Order, 1902 (confirmed by the Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (No. 12) Act, 1902); the West Hartlepool Order, 1910 (confirmed by the Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (No. 8) Act, 1910); the West Hartlepool Light Railways Order, 1897; the West Hartlepool Light Railways (Deviation, &c.) Order, 1901; the West Hartlepool Light Railways (Amendment) Order, 1913; the West Hartlepool Corporation Tramways Order, 1912 (confirmed by the Tramways Orders Confirmation Act, 1912); the West Hartlepool Electric Lighting Order, 1894 (confirmed by the Electric Lighting Orders Confirmation (No. 1) Act, 1894).

32. To incorporate and apply, with or without modification, or to render inapplicable, all or some of the provisions of the following public Acts:—The Municipal Corporations Acts; the Public Health Acts; the Lands Clauses Acts; the Tramways Act, 1870; the Railways Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845; the Electric Lighting Acts, 1882 to 1909; the Local Loans Act, 1875; the Arbitration Act, 1889; and all Acts amending those Acts respectively.

Plans and sections of the works and plans of the lands intended to be taken, together with a book of reference to the plans and a copy of this Notice as published in the London Gazette, will, on or before the 1st day of April, 1919, be deposited for public inspection with the Clerk of the Peace for the County of Durham, at his office at Durham, and a copy of so much of the said plans, sections and book of reference as relates to each of the several

areas hereinafter mentioned, together with a copy of the said Notice, will, on or before the said 1st day of April, 1919, be deposited as follows:—

(Extension of Area for Supply of Electricity to include Urban Districts of Cannock and Brownhills and Parts of Rural Districts of Walsall, Cannock and Lichfield; Electric Lines above Ground; Purchase of Heat and Electricity; Extension of Omnibus Routes beyond Borough; Further Powers for the Corporation to provide and assist in the provision of Housing Accommodation; Retention, &c., of Surplus Lands; Further Provisions with regard to Compounding for Rates; Borrowing of Money and other Financial Provisions; Incorporation, Repeal, and Amendment of Acts.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the present Session by the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the borough of Walsall (hereinafter referred to as "the Corporation" and "the borough" respectively) for an Act for all or some of the purposes and objects hereinafter mentioned (that is to say):—

1. To extend the area of the Corporation for the supply of electricity so as to include (in addition to the borough) the urban district of Cannock, the urban district of Brownhills, the parishes of Aldridge, Great Barr, Rushall and Pelsall in the rural district of Walsall, the parishes of Great Wyrley and Cheslyn Hay in the rural district of Cannock, and so much of the parishes of Hilton, Saredon, and Essington in the said rural district of Cannock as lies to the east of the following line:—From the boundary of the parish of Cheslyn Hay in Wolverhampton Road, proceeding thence in a south-westerly direction along the westerly boundary of that road to its junction with War-

stone Road, thence in a south-easterly direction along the westerly boundary of Warstone Road to the boundaries of the parishes of Saredon and Hilton, thence in a south-easterly direction along the westerly boundary of Warstone Road to its junction with Broad Lane, thence along the westerly boundaries of Bur-snips Road, Bognop Road, Church Road and Blackhalve Road to the southerly boundary of the parish of Essington, and thence along such southerly boundary to the boundary of the borough, and so much of the parishes of Burntwood Edial and Woodhouses, Ogle Hay and Hammerwich, in the rural district of Lichfield, as lies to the west of the following line:—From the junction of the boundaries of the parishes of Longdon and Burntwood, Edial and Woodhouses with the boundary of the Urban district of Cannock, proceeding south-eastwards along the boundary of the parish of Burntwood Edial and Woodhouses to Chorley Road, thence along the easterly boundary of Ogle Hay Road to the boundary of the parish of Hammerwich, thence south-westward along the easterly boundary of Burntwood Road to the junction of that road with Walsall Road, thence along the easterly boundary of Walsall Road to the junction of that road with Watling Street, and thence along the easterly boundary of Ogle Hay Lane to the boundary of the urban district of Brownhills, all in the county of Stafford.

2. To confer and impose upon the Corporation with reference to the areas referred to in the last preceding paragraph hereof (hereinafter called "the added areas") all or any of the powers, duties and obligations exercisable by or attaching to them with reference to their existing area for the supply of electricity, including provisions contained in the Walsall Electric Lighting Order, 1890, the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act, 1899, and the Walsall Corporation Acts, 1900 and 1914, and to specify the streets within which electric lines are to be laid within a limited time.

3. To alter, amend or repeal the provisions of the Cannock Electric Lighting Order, 1901, and to annul any agreement which may have been made between the Cannock Urban District Council and the Shropshire, Worcestershire and Staffordshire Electric Power Company or any other body or person under the powers of the said Order.

4. To empower the Corporation to place electric lines above ground in any of their areas of supply, including the added areas, and to exclude or modify the provisions of the Electric Lighting Acts, 1882 to 1909, and Orders made thereunder relating to overhead electric lines.

5. To exclude the provisions of the Electric Lighting Acts, 1882 to 1909, relating to the purchase of undertakings by local authorities and particularly the provisions of sections 2 and 3 of the Electric Lighting Act, 1888, from application to the added areas, and to alter or repeal any existing powers of purchase vested by virtue of the said Acts or reserved by any deeds of transfer in the local authorities in respect of those undertakings, works, lands and property.

6. To authorize the Corporation to supply electricity from their existing or future generating stations and other works to the whole or any part of their areas for the time being for the supply of electricity (including the added

areas and the areas in which they supply electricity in pursuance of powers that have been or may be transferred to or conferred upon them) and for the purposes aforesaid to break up streets and highways and to lay down electric lines.

7. To empower the Corporation and any Company, body or person to enter into and carry into effect agreements for the supply to the Corporation of steam, waste heat or electrical energy upon and subject to such terms and conditions as may be agreed, including the transfer to such Company, body or person of part of the Corporation's electrical plant, and to apply to such plant the provisions of section 16 of the Electric Lighting Act, 1909, and to confirm any agreement that may be entered into between the Corporation and any such Company, body or person.

8. To empower the Corporation for the purposes of obtaining, procuring, conveying, utilising and supplying any such steam, waste heat or electricity to erect, maintain, use, lay down, repair, alter, and renew generating stations, electric lines, cables and other works and apparatus and mains, pipes and culverts within the borough and the added areas and to apply to any such purposes as aforesaid the provisions of the Electric Lighting Acts, 1882 to 1909.

9. To empower the Corporation for the purposes of the Bill to open and break up the surface of and otherwise interfere with streets, roads, highways, footpaths, level crossings, railways and works, and to alter or interfere with mains, pipes, sewers, drains, electric lines, wires, tubes, apparatus, works, matters and things therein, thereunder or thereover, and to apply to the exercise of the powers of the Bill, with or without modification, or to render inapplicable thereto, all or some of the provisions of the Electric Lighting Acts, 1882 to 1909, and any Act amending the same, and to exempt the Corporation in respect of the proposed works from the restrictions imposed by section 13 of the Electric Lighting Act, 1882, and section 12 of the Schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act, 1899, with respect to the breaking up of railways and other works.

10. To confer further powers upon the Corporation with regard to their electricity undertaking and particularly to empower the Corporation to lay down electric mains and wires in streets not dedicated to the public use; and to cut off the supply of electricity to any consumer supplied under the terms of any agreement, if such consumer uses the electricity so supplied in any manner contrary to the terms of such agreement; to confer further powers upon the Corporation with regard to the entering of premises for the purpose of ascertaining the amount of electricity consumed, or for the removal of fittings and other property belonging to them, and to prescribe penalties for hindering or obstructing them in so doing; and to authorize the Corporation to refuse to supply electrical energy to persons in debt to them.

11. To empower the Corporation to provide, maintain and run motor omnibuses within and beyond the borough along the following routes:—

(a) In the parishes of Brownhills and Norton Canes, in the urban district of Brownhills, and the township and urban district of Cannock from the junction of High Street

(Brownhills) with Wolverhampton Road along High Street, Chester Road, Watling Street, Hednesford Road (Norton Canes), Hednesford Road (Five Ways), Hednesford Road (Heath Hayes), Hill Street, Forge Street, and Uxbridge Road to its junction with Market Street (Hednesford);

(b) In the parishes of Ogle Hay and Norton Canes, in the urban district of Brownhills, and the township and urban district of Cannock, and the parish of Ogle Hay in the rural district of Lichfield, from the junction of High Street (Brownhills) with Wolverhampton Road, along Lichfield Road, Chase Road, Burntwood Road (Newtown), Triangle Road (Chase Town), High Street (Chase Town), Cannock Road, Chase Terrace, and Hednesford Road to its junction with Wimblebury Road (Five Ways);

(c) In the parish of Shire Oak, in the urban district of Brownhills, from the junction of High Street with Lyndon Road (Brownhills), along Chester Road, to the junction of that road with the main road between Lichfield and Walsall at Shire Oak;

(d) In the township and urban district of Cannock, the parish and urban district of Rugeley, the parish of Teddesley Hay in the rural district of Cannock, and the parish of Brereton, in the rural district of Lichfield, from the Market Place (Cannock), along Stafford Road and Pye Green Road to Broadhurst Green, the Military Road through Rugeley Camp, Penkridge Bank and Rugeley Road to the Sheep Fair (Rugeley);

(e) In the township and urban district of Cannock, the parish and urban district of Rugeley, and the parish of Brereton, in the rural district of Lichfield, from the junction of Market Street and Rugeley Road (Hednesford), along Rugeley Road, Upper Brook Street, Lower Brook Street, and Bow Street to Sheep Fair (Rugeley);

(f) In the township and urban district of Cannock the parish of Teddesley Hay in the rural district of Cannock, and the parish of Brocton in the rural district of Stafford, from Broadhurst Green along the Military Road (Anson's Bank) to Brocton Military Camp;

(g) In the township and urban district of Cannock and the parish of Huntington in the rural district of Cannock, from the Market Place (Cannock) along Stafford Road to Huntington Village;

(h) In the parishes of Great Wyrley and Cheslyn Hay in the rural district of Cannock, from the junction of Walsall Road with Station Road (Great Wyrley), along Station Road and Station Street to the junction of Queen Street and High Street (Cheslyn Hay);

(i) In the parish and borough of Walsall, the parish of Essington in the rural district of Cannock, the parish and urban district of Short Heath, and the parish and urban district of Willenhall, from the junction of High Street (Bloxwich) with Wolverhampton Road, along Wolverhampton Road, Broad Lane, Bursnips Road, Essington Road to New Invention, Willenhall Road, Wesley Road (Short Heath), Col-

thorne Road, High Road, Lane Head and Clarkes Lane to its junction with Walsall Road (Willenhall);

(i) (1) In the parish and borough of Walsall, the parish of Bentley in the rural district of Walsall and the parish and urban district of Short Heath from the junction at Bloxwich of route (1) with Sneyd-lane along Sneyd-lane to the junction of Sneyd-lane with Essington-road at New Invention;

(j) In the parishes of Walsall Wood and Shire Oak in the urban district of Brown-hills, the parishes of Shenstone, Ogle Hay Rural, Hammerwich and Wall, in the rural district of Lichfield, and the parishes of Friary, St. Michael's, and The Close, in the city of Lichfield, from the tramway terminus at Walsall Wood, along the main road between Lichfield and Walsall, Queen Street, Sandford Street, and St. John's Street to the City Station of the London and North Western Railway (Lichfield);

(k) In the parish and borough of Walsall, the parishes of Rushall and Aldridge, in the rural district of Walsall, the parish of Shenstone, in the rural district of Lichfield, and the parish and borough of Sutton Coldfield, from the junction of Mellish Road with Lichfield Road (Walsall), along Mellish Road, Walsall Road, Station Road, Field Lane, New Lane (Aldridge), Little Aston Road, Walsall Road (Little Aston), Walsall Road (Four Oaks), Four Oaks Road and Lichfield Road (Sutton Coldfield) to the Parade (Sutton Coldfield);

(l) In the parish and borough of Walsall, the parish of Great Barr, in the rural district of Walsall, the parish of Shenstone, in the rural district of Lichfield, and the parish and borough of Sutton Coldfield, from the junction of Sutton Road (Walsall) with Birmingham Road, along Sutton Road and Foley Lane to Streetly, Streetly Lane and Lichfield Road to the Parade (Sutton Coldfield);

(m) In the parishes of Aldridge and Great Barr, in the rural district of Walsall, and the parish of Shenstone, in the rural district of Lichfield, from the junction of High Street (Aldridge) and Anchor Lane, along Anchor Lane and Harborough Lane to the junction of Harborough Lane with Sutton Road (Great Barr); and

(n) In the parish of Great Barr, in the rural district of Walsall from the junction of Aldridge Road and Sutton Road (Great Barr), along Aldridge Road to the junction of that road with Bridle Lane.

All the foregoing routes will be situate in the county of Stafford except routes (k) and (l), which will be situate partly in the county of Stafford and partly in the county of Warwick.

12. To authorize the Corporation to demand and take fares, tolls and charges for the use of and for the carriage and conveyance of passengers and goods on and by their omnibuses upon the proposed routes; to provide that such omnibuses shall form part of the tramway undertaking of the Corporation, and to extend and apply thereto all or some of the provisions relating to tramways, trolley vehicles and omnibuses contained in the Acts and Orders of the Corporation.

13. To make further provision in regard to the Corporation tramways, the trolley vehicles and omnibuses of the Corporation, including the appointment of stages and the fares, rates and charges to be taken in respect of each stage; the persons to whom and the places at which fares, rates and charges shall be paid; the appointment of stopping and starting places; and the attachment of signs or directions indicating stopping places to lamp posts, poles, standards and other erections, and to authorize the Corporation to form a depreciation fund in addition to a reserve fund in respect of their tramway undertaking.

14. To make further provision in regard to housing accommodation and the erection of buildings, and to enlarge the powers of the Corporation with respect to these matters, and to confer powers on them for encouraging and facilitating the provision of such accommodation.

15. To confer powers upon the Corporation relative to the promotion and extension of societies for the erection, improvement and management of houses, to enable them to assist societies by subscribing to their capital, and by making or guaranteeing advances, subject to such conditions as may be indicated in the Bill, and to empower them to lend money to persons for the erection, purchase or adaptation of dwelling-houses, to buy, sell and deal in building materials, and to lay out and develop lands for building purposes, including the provision of streets and open places and the erection of buildings, and to retain, hold and use for those purposes surplus lands acquired by them under the intended Act or any general or local Act in force in the borough, and to enable the Corporation to sell, lease, exchange or otherwise dispose of any such lands or any interest therein, and to confer powers upon the Corporation to enter upon lands and develop the same in case of the failure of persons to whom advances are made.

16. To empower the Corporation for the purposes of the Bill to purchase or acquire by agreement or to take on lease lands, houses or buildings and to acquire by agreement rights or easements in, over or connected with any lands, houses or buildings.

17. To make further provision in regard to the levying and collection in the borough of the poor, general district, municipal and other rates, to increase the limit of the value of the premises the owner of which may be rated instead of the occupier, to fix the allowances which may be made to owners so rated according to the value of their premises, and to amend the provisions of the Public Health Acts, the Poor Rate Assessment and Collection Act, 1869, and the Walsall Corporation Act, 1890, or any other local Act relating to rating in this respect.

18. To enable the Corporation in cases where the assessment of any property in the valuation list is altered or amended by the Assessment Committee or any new property is inserted in the valuation list to amend any rate made by them in pursuance of the Public Health Act, 1875, so as to make the assessment to such rate accord with the new or supplemental valuation list, and to provide that from the date of the notice to any person rated in respect of any increased, new or additional assessment the portion of the current rate shall be recoverable from such person.

19. To provide that any complaint in respect of the summary recovery of any sum of money due in respect of any rate levied by or in pursuance of the order or precept of the Corporation shall be deemed validly made if made within twelve months from the time when the matter of such complaint arose.

20. To authorize the Corporation to let stalls, standings, shops, benches, sites, spaces or other conveniences or accommodation in any market or fair in the borough upon such terms and conditions and for such periods as the Corporation think fit.

21. To make further provision in regard to the swimming baths and open bathing places belonging to the Corporation, to extend the powers of the Corporation in respect thereof, and to make bye-laws for the management, use and regulation of the public baths and open bathing places, so as to permit any swimming bath or bathing place to be used for the purpose of mixed bathing during such hours and subject to such regulations and charges as shall be prescribed in such bye-laws.

22. To enact all necessary provisions for giving full effect to the purposes of the intended Act or of the general or local Acts in force in the borough, including the making and confirmation of bye-laws, the imposition of penalties for breach of the provisions of the intended Act or of any bye-laws thereunder, the payment of penalties to the Corporation and the recovery and application of penalties and expenses, the recovery of demands in the county court, the entry of premises, penalties for obstructing the execution of the Act, the payment of expenses of carrying the Act into execution, evidence of appointments and resolutions, and the authentication and service of notices.

23. To authorize the Corporation to borrow money for all or any of the purposes hereinbefore mentioned and for all other the purposes of the intended Act and to charge the moneys so borrowed on the borough fund and borough rate, the district fund and general district rate, and the undertakings, estates, rates, rents, revenue and other property of the Corporation or any of such securities, and to execute and grant and issue mortgages and other securities, to authorize the Corporation to apply any of their corporate funds or other moneys authorized to be raised to any of the purposes of the intended Act, and to provide that all moneys already borrowed and to be borrowed for the purposes of the electricity undertaking of the Corporation and all moneys to be borrowed under the powers of the intended Act shall not be reckoned in the limit of borrowing prescribed by the Public Health Act, 1875.

24. To make provision for the formation, maintenance and application of sinking funds, to suspend the payments to sinking funds for repayment of money borrowed for electricity purposes pending the construction of the works for which it is borrowed, the use of sinking funds instead of borrowing, the method of meeting any deficiency in the receipts from the undertakings of the Corporation, and the charge thereof upon the borough fund and borough rate, the district fund and general district rate of the borough.

25. To authorize the Corporation to use one form of mortgage for all purposes for which they are for the time being authorized to borrow money, charging the loans upon all or

any of the revenues, rates or property of the Corporation.

26. To provide for the consolidation of the loans of the Corporation and the equation of the periods for repayment, or to enable the Corporation to make a scheme or schemes for that purpose subject to confirmation by the Local Government Board, including any necessary powers of borrowing money for giving effect to such scheme, and to confer further powers upon the Corporation in regard to financial matters.

27. To authorize the Corporation to raise money by way of temporary loan or by way of overdraft or otherwise on the security of any funds, rates, revenues or property of the Corporation for the purpose of defraying current expenses in connection with the carrying out or execution of any duties or powers imposed or conferred on them by any Act of Parliament, provisional order or otherwise, and to utilise temporarily any reserve fund or sinking fund belonging to them for the purpose of any such expenses.

28. To vary or extinguish all existing rights and privileges which would or might in any way prevent, interfere with or delay the accomplishment of any of the objects of the intended Act, and to confer other rights and privileges.

29. To alter, amend, repeal, re-enact or extend, with or without modification, all or any of the provisions of the Walsall Improvement and Market Act, 1848; the Walsall Improvement and Market Amendment Act, 1850; the Walsall Gas Purchase and Borough Extension Act, 1876; the Walsall Corporation Act, 1890; the Walsall Corporation Act, 1900; the Walsall Corporation Act, 1914; the South Staffordshire Tramways Act, 1889; the South Staffordshire Tramways Act, 1899; the Walsall and District Tramways Order, 1880; the Staffordshire Tramways (Extension) Order, 1882; the Walsall and District Tramways Order, 1882; the Walsall and District Tramways Order, 1884; the South Staffordshire Light Railway Order, 1899; the Walsall Corporation (Loans) Order, 1882; the Walsall Order, 1895; the Walsall Order, 1909; and the Walsall Electric Lighting Order, 1890; and all other Acts and Orders relating to the Corporation or to any of their undertakings.

30. To incorporate and apply, with or without modification, or to render inapplicable, all or some of the provisions of the following Public Acts:—The Lands Clauses Acts; the Electric Lighting Acts, 1882 to 1909; the Gasworks Clauses Acts, 1847 and 1871; the Municipal Corporation Acts; the Public Health Acts; the Tramways Act, 1870; the Local Loans Act, 1875; the Arbitration Act, 1889; and all Acts amending the said Acts respectively.

Printed copies of the Bill for the intended Act will be deposited in the Private Bill Office of the House of Commons as soon as leave shall have been given by Parliament to introduce the same.
