TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.

In accordance with the Regulations made
under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act,
1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated
31st October, 1918, the Trade Board estab-
lished under that Act and the Trade Boards
Provisional Orders Confirmation Act, 1913,
for certain branches of the Machine-made Lace
and Net Finishing Trade, as defined in the
Regulations made by the Board of Trade and
dated 16th March, 1914, hereby give notice,
as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade
Boards Act, 1918, that they propose to vary
the General Minimum Time Rate of Wages at
present fixed and set out in the Schedule of
their Notice dated 14th February, 1919, from
4½d. to 5½d. per hour, with corresponding
variations for learners.

The Trade Board give similar notice that
they propose to vary by an addition of 20 per
cent. the General Minimum Piece Rates of
Wages at present fixed and set out in the Sche-
dule of their Notice dated 14th February,
1919: Provided that this notice does not cancel
or affect the proposal to vary, cancel and fix
issued by the Trade Board on 23rd January,
1919.

The Trade Board propose that such variation
as may be made as the result of the above
proposals should be operative from the date
when it becomes effective until 1st January,
1920.

The Trade Board will consider any objections
to their proposals to vary which may be
lodged with them within two months from
1st April, 1919. Such objections should be
in writing and signed by the person making
the same (adding his or her full name and
address), and should be sent to the Secretary
