For gallantry and devotion to duty at Aire during the period February to July, 1918, when in charge of a large number of French women engaged on important camouflage services.

Although the Town was frequently shelled and bombed, the gallant example and coolness displayed by this lady at all times resulted in most of the workers remaining at their posts.
