And whereas the said Scheme hath been transmitted by the said Bishop to the said Archbishop for his consideration:

And whereas the said Archbishop, being satisfied with the said Scheme, hath certified the same and the Consents aforesaid to His Majesty in Council by his Report dated the 23rd day of December, 1918, which said Report is in the words and figures following:—

“ We, the undersigned, Randall Thomas, Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury, do hereby report to your Majesty in Council:—

“ That the Right Reverend Herbert, Lord Bishop of Hereford, has represented unto Us (amongst other things)—

“ That there is in the City of Hereford and his Diocese of Hereford the Parish of St. John Baptist, which is widely scattered:

“ That there are also in his said Diocese several other Parishes, viz.:—the Parishes of St. Peter, All Saints, St. Nicholas, St. Martin, Tupsley, Holmer, and Clehonger, all of which adjoin the said Parish of St. John Baptist:

“ That it appears to the said Lord Bishop that under the provisions of the Pluralities Act, 1838, the larger portion of the said Parish of St. John Baptist may be separated therefrom (together with part of the parochial endowments) and parts thereof annexed to the said several Parishes of All Saints, Holmer, Tupsley, St. Martin, Clehonger, St. Nicholas

and St. Peter's in the manner more particularly described in the Scheme hereinafter mentioned.

“ That pursuant to the directions contained in the said Act of Parliament the said Lord Bishop has drawn up a Scheme in writing, annexed to his Representation, describing the several parts of the said Parish of St. John Baptist so as aforesaid proposed to be separated therefrom and annexed respectively to the several contiguous Parishes hereinbefore named and the mode in which it appears to him that the proposed alterations may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alterations in respect to Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction, Glebe Lands, Tithe Rent Charges, and other Ecclesiastical Dues, Rates, and Payments, and in respect to Patronage and Rights to Pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested, which Scheme, together with the Consents thereto in writing of the respective Patrons and Incumbents of all the said several Benefices or Parishes affected, has been transmitted to Us by the said Lord Bishop for our consideration:

“ The said several portions of St. John Baptist, Hereford, so as aforesaid proposed to be separated therefrom and annexed respectively to the several contiguous Parishes hereinbefore named are separately and fully described with the several boundaries thereof in the said Scheme of the said Lord Bishop, and are dis-
