tinguished by reference to numbers and colours in the said Scheme and also by similar letters and colours in the two *Maps* or *Plans* marked A and B, annexed to the said Scheme of the said Lord Bishop:

"The Representation and Scheme of the said Lord Bishop and the Consents above referred to are hereunto annexed:

"And we, the said Archbishop, being on full consideration and enquiry satisfied with the said Scheme, do hereby, pursuant to the said Pluralities Act, 1838, certify the same, and such Consents as aforesaid, to Your Majesty in Council, to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may, in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do, make and issue an Order for carrying the said Scheme into effect.

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the said Scheme be carried into effect.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. W HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 6th day of March, 1919, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called ' the said Benefice') of Howell, in the County of Lincoln and in the Diocese of Lincoln:

"Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Howell is vested for an estate in fee simple in possession free from incumbrances in Arthur Vessey Machin, of Number 49, Esplanade Road, Scarborough, Esquire, Delia Vessey Machin, of Number 37, Avenue Victoria, Scarborough, Spinster, George Vessey Machin, of The Haven, Worksop, Esquire, and Edward Vessey Machin, a Captain in Your Majesty's Army, as tenants in common:

"And whereas the said Arthur Vessey Machin, Delia Vessey Machin, George Vessey Machin, and Edward Vessey Machin are desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Howell, now vested in them as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Right Reverend Edward Lee, now Bishop of Lincoln, and his Successors in the same Bishopric:

"And whereas the said Edward Lee, Bishop of Lincoln, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness, and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese, which, by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited, or by some or one of them, is made necessary, he, the said Edward Lee, Bishop of Lincoln, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned :

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Howell, which is hereinbefore mentioned, and hereinafter recommended and proposed, will, in our opinion, tend to make better provision for the Cure of Souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson, so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid, arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parish of Howell:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Arthur Vessey Machin, Delia Vessey Machin, George Vessey Machin and Edward Vessey Machin (in testimony whereof they have signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Edward Lee, Bishop of Lincoln, (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), We, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole Advowson perpetual right of Patronage of and or presentation to the said Benefice of Howell, now vested in them the said Arthur Vessey Machin, Delia Vessey Machin, George Vessey Machin, and Edward Vessey Machin, as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Edward Lee, Bishop of Lincoln, and his Successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in, and shall and may from time to time be exercised by, the said Edward Lee, Bishop of Lincoln, and his Successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Lincoln.
