Provided also that nothing in this Licence shall be deemed to authorise the payment of money which at the date hereof is or but for the war would have been due to any person or body of persons resident or carrying on business in such territories, or the withdrawal or disposal of funds or property held or managed in this country for the account of or on behalf of any such person.

NOTICE, DATED MAY 7TH, 1919, BY THE BOARD OF TRADE UNDER THE ARTICLES OF COMMERCE (RELAXATION OF RESTRICTIONS) ORDER, 1918, OF THE REVOCATION OF THE MOTOR SPIRIT AND LAMP OIL (MAXIMUM RETAIL PRICES) ORDER, 1918, AND THE PETROLEUM PRODUCTS (WHOLESALE PRICES) ORDER, 1919.

Pursuant to the provisions of the Articles of Commerce (Relaxation of Restrictions) Order, 1918, the Board of Trade give notice that the Motor Spirit and Lamp Oil (Maximum Retail Prices) Order, 1918, and the Petroleum Products (Wholesale Prices) Order, 1919, will cease to have effect as from the 7th May, 1919.
