EXPORT OF FOODSTUFFS TO GERMANY.

GENERAL LICENCE.

The Board of Trade, on behalf of His Majesty, and in pursuance of the powers reserved in the Trading with the Enemy Pro-clamations, and all other powers thereunto them enabling, do hereby give and grant licence, so far as the Trading with the Enemy legislation is concerned, to all persons residing, carrying on business, or being in the United Kingdom to negotiate for the supply to Germany of foodstuffs, namely, food, beverages, spices, edible oils and other articles intended solely for the manufacture of human food; to supply any such foodstuffs to Germany; to carry or arrange for the carriage of and to insure any such foodstuffs destined for Germany; and to take such action as may be necessary or convenient to secure payment for any such foodstuffs so supplied, or for any charges or expenses connected with such supply, carriage or insurance;

Provided always that any licence which may be necessary in respect of any such supply under any prohibition of export for the time being in force in the United Kingdom is first obtained:

Provided also that nothing in this Licence shall be deemed to authorise the payment of money which at the date hereof is or but for the war would have been due to any person or body of persons resident or carrying on business in Germany or the withdrawal or disposal of funds or property held or managed in this country for the account of or on behalf of any such person.
