1. During the periods hereinafter mentioned :

(a) the wages payable for employment of any male worker in agriculture of the age of 18 years and over shall be not less than wages at the weekly rate of £4 in respect of all employment on a week-day after the hour of 6.45 a.m. and up to the hour of 7.0 p.m. when cutting or stooking work only is in progress and up to the hour of 8.0 p.m. when carting work is in progress.

(b) the rate for overtime employment in the case of any such worker shall be double the rate which but for this provision would be applicable to him.

(c) the minimum rate at which wages are to be paid for employment of any male worker in agriculture under the age of 18 years or of any female worker in agriculture shall be not less than 50 per cent. in excess of the minimum rate which but for

this provision would be applicable to him or her under any other Order of the Board for the time being in force and no overtime rate shall apply in the case of any such worker.

2. In the case of a worker employed for the whole of the harvest on a farm comprising more than 10 acres of corn the above rates shall apply for a period of four weeks from the day on which he is first employed on that farm in general harvest work notwithstanding that he may not be employed for the whole of this period in harvest work and after the expiration of such period of four weeks the above rates shall apply in respect of each day upon which he is employed in harvest work. Workers employed for less than the whole period of harvest shall be paid proportionately.

3. In the case of a worker employed in a farm not comprising 10 acres of corn the above rates shall apply only in respect of each day in which the worker is employed on harvest work, any other work during the harvest period being subject to the minimum and overtime rates which but for this Order would be applicable.

4. For the purpose of the above rates the following employment only shall be treated as overtime employment:—

- (a) All employment on a Sunday.
- (b) All employment before the hour of 6.45 a.m. and all employment after the hour of 8 p.m. (or where cutting or stook-

ing work only is in progress after the hour of 7 p.m.).

5. For the purpose of the above rates the hours of harvest work shall not include meal-times, but shall include any time during which by reason of weather conditions an employer has prevented from working a worker who was present at the place of employment and ready to work.

6. During the period of 4 weeks above mentioned the value at which the provision by an employer to a male worker of 18 years of age or over for full board and lodging for a 7-day week may be reckoned as payment of wages in lieu of payment in cash shall be 20s.

2. For the purpose of the above rates the following employment is defined as overtime employment, that is to say:—

- (a) all employment on harvest work in excess of 10 hours on any weekday;
- (b) all employment on harvest work on a Sunday.

3. In the case of a worker in regular employment upon a farm:—

(a) wages at the rates fixed by Clause 1 above shall be paid for twenty-four days including and occurring subsequently to the day on which such worker is first employed on that farm on general harvest work during the corn harvest, notwithstanding that such worker may not be employed on harvest work for twenty-four days.

(b) the hours of work shall not include meal times or any time during which harvest work is suspended by weather conditions or otherwise, provided that, in respect of any time during which, by reason of weather conditions, an employer has prevented from working a worker who was present at the place of employment and ready to work, such worker shall be entitled to wages at such rates as would be applicable to him or her if this Order had not been made.

4. In the case of a worker who is only engaged for the harvest period, or is only employed for part of the harvest period, wages at the above rates shall be paid only in respect of the hours for which the worker is actually employed on harvest work during the corn harvest.

5. During the period to which this Order applies, as respects any particular worker, the Order of the Board of 14th February,

1919, further defining overtime employment shall be suspended so far as regards such worker.

The Agricultural Wages Board, as required by the above Act, and the Regulations made thereunder, will consider any objections to the above Proposal which may be lodged with them within one month from the date of this Notice.
