

at present fixed and effective under the Order of the Minister of Labour dated 28th February, 1919, in respect of the following classes of female workers —

Female workers who are employed during the whole or any part of their time in any of the following occupations —

Cocoa making

Boiling sugar for boiled sweets other than boiling of sugar in vacuum pans

Brogueing of hermetically sealed receptacles containing meat, poultry, fish and soup.

Hand-soldering of hermetically sealed receptacles containing meat, poultry, fish and soup.

Tongue pumping.

Making-up sausages or "smalls" for tins and glass (making-up includes the class of work which would generally be considered to be butchers' or pork-butchers' work, but does not include the filling of skins)

Brining vegetables for pickling

Making Extract of Meat.

In respect of such classes of workers the Trade Board propose to vary the General Minimum Time Rates now payable in their Notice dated 3rd March, 1919, so that in lieu of such rates the General Minimum Time Rates shall be as follows —

When employed under 15 years of age, 2½ per hour, *i.e.*, 9s per week of 48 hours

When employed at 15 and under 16 years of age, 3¼d. per hour, *i.e.*, 13s per week of 48 hours

When employed at 16 and under 17 years of age, 4¼ per hour, *i.e.*, 17s per week of 48 hours.

When employed at 17 and under 18 years of age, 5½d per hour, *i.e.*, 22s per week of 48 hours

When employed at 18 and under 19 years of age, 6d per hour, *i.e.*, 24s per week of 48 hours

When employed at 19 and under 20 years of age, 7d per hour, *i.e.*, 28s. per week of 48 hours

When employed at 20 and under 21 years of age, 8d per hour, *i.e.*, 32s per week of 48 hours.

When employed at 21 and under 22 years of age, 9¼d. per hour, *i.e.*, 37s. per week of 48 hours.

When employed at 22 and under 23 years of age, 9¾d. per hour, *i.e.*, 39s per week of 48 hours.

When employed at 23 and under 24 years of age, 10½d per hour, *i.e.*, 41s per week of 48 hours.

When employed at 24 years of age and upwards, 11d. per hour, *i.e.*, 44s per week of 48 hours

The Trade Board will consider any objections to the above proposal to vary which may be lodged with them within two months from 17th June, 1919. TRADE BOARD ACTS, 1909 AND 1918

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Lace Finishing Trade Board established under that Act for that branch of the Lace Finishing trade in Great Britain, as defined in the Regulations made by the Board of Trade, and dated 16th March, 1914, having given due notice on 23rd January, 1919, of Proposal to Fix, as therein shown, certain General Minimum Piece Rates of Wages, and having given due notice on 1st April, 1919, of Proposal to Vary, as therein shown, certain General Minimum Time Rates and certain General Minimum Piece Rates as set out in the Notice varying minimum rates of wages, dated 14th February, 1919, have given notice that they have varied certain General Minimum Time Rates and certain General Minimum Piece Rates so previously varied by them on 14th February, 1919, for all workers, including learners, such variation to be operative until 1st January, 1920.

The Trade Board have further given notice that they have received notification from the Minister of Labour that he has made an Order, dated 18th June, 1919, under Section 4 (2) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, confirming the rates as fixed and as varied by the Trade Board, and specifying 19th June, 1919, as the date from which such minimum rates of wages shall become effective

On application to the Trade Board further information will be given as to the minimum rates, if in the opinion of the Trade Board the applicant is likely to be affected thereby.
