

BY THE KING.

A PROCLAMATION

RELATING TO THE IMPORTATION OF CERTAIN
ARTICLES INTO THE UNITED KINGDOM.

GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS by Section forty-three of the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876, it is provided that the importation of arms, ammunition, gunpowder, or any other goods may be prohibited by Proclamation:

And whereas by certain Proclamations entitled Prohibition of Import Proclamations the importation of certain goods has been prohibited accordingly:

And whereas it is expedient that the importation into the United Kingdom of certain other goods should be prohibited:

Now, therefore, We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, in pursuance of the said Act and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby proclaim, direct and ordain as follows:—

As from and after the date hereof, subject as hereinafter provided, the importation into the United Kingdom of the following articles is hereby prohibited:—

Chemicals of all descriptions.

Electrical goods and apparatus, including electrical plant and machinery of all kinds, and insulating materials of all descriptions.

Scientific, mathematical and optical instruments.

Tungsten powder and ferro-tungsten.

Provided always, and it is hereby declared, that this prohibition shall not apply to any such goods which are imported under licence given by or on behalf of the Board of Trade, and subject to the provisions and conditions of such licence.

This Proclamation may be cited as the Prohibition of Import (No. 32) Proclamation, 1919.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace, this Twenty-fifth day of June, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and nineteen, and in the Tenth year of Our Reign.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of Section 11 of the Ministry of Health Act, 1919, it is enacted that the Act shall come into operation upon such day or days as may be appointed by Order in Council and that different days may be appointed for different purposes and provisions of the Act.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, in pursuance of the Ministry of Health Act, 1919, and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. For such of the provisions of the said Act as are hereinafter mentioned the appointed day shall be:—

(1) in the case of Section 1, the 25th day of June, 1919;

(2) in the case of Section 2; paragraphs (a), (b) and (c) and Proviso (ii) of sub-section (1) and sub-sections (2), (3), (4) and (5) of Section 3; Sections 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, and 10 and sub-sections (3) and (4) of Section 11, the 1st day of July, 1919, except so far as paragraph (a) of sub-section (1) of Section 3 relates to powers and duties conferred or imposed upon the Local Government Board by any Act of Parliament passed, or Provisional Order confirmed, or other Instrument made, on or after the 1st day of July, 1919, but during the present session of Parliament, in respect of which powers and duties the appointed day shall be the day on which such Act, Order, or Instrument comes into operation.

2. The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies for the purpose of the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

3. This Order may be cited as the Ministry of Health Act, 1919 (Date of Commencement) Order, 1919.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 29th day of May, 1919, in the words following, viz.:—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas we are of opinion that the duties and responsibilities of Non-Commissioned Officers and Men belonging to the Royal Marine Garrison at Scapa in certain cases warrant the grant of additional remuneration:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction, with retrospective effect to cover payment in respect of duties already performed, the Rates of Allowances shown below, to be payable at our discretion to any men whose employment on the duties specified may be necessary:
