"And whereas the said Duke of Buccleuch is desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Church Lawford with King's Newnham should be transferred to and be vested in the Right Reverend Huyshe Wolcott, now Bishop of Coventry, and his Successors in the same Bishopric:

"And whereas the said Huyshe Wolcott, Bishop of Coventry, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness, and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the Acts in the herein-before mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary, he, the said Huyshe Wolcott, Bishop of Coventry, has executed this Scheme as herein-after mentioned:

'And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Church Lawford with King's Newnham, which is herein-before mentioned and herein-after recommended and proposed, will, in our opinion, tend to make better provision for the Cure of Souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parishes of Church Lawford and King's Newn-

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Duke of Buccleuch (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Huyshe Wolcott, Bishop of Coventry (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), We, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Church Lawford with King's Newnham now vested in him, the said Duke of Buccleuch, as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Huyshe Wolcott, Bishop of Coventry, and his Successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in, and shall and may from time to time be exercised by, the said Huyshe Wolcott, Bishop of Coventry, and his Successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

And whereas the said Scheme has been ap-

proved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with
the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Coventry.

7HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, chapter 104, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme, bearing date the 29th day of May, 1919, in the

words and figures following, that is to say:—
"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, chapter 104, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken out of the Parish of Bispham, in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Manchester.

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said Parish of Bispham is a Cure wherein or in whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular part of the said parish of Bispham which is hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth.

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine

Worship. "And whereas for the purpose of providing an endowment for the said proposed separate District there has been contributed a sum of £3,700 India £3 per centum per annum Stock and the same has been transferred into our name to be held by us towards the endowment of the said proposed District and so soon as the said District shall have become a New Parish under the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act then of the said New Parish and towards the maintenance of the Minister or Incumbent thereof for the time being, the amount of the annual interest and dividends to accrue due on account of the said sum of Stock to be receivable by the said Minister or Incumbent for the time being when he shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the said secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act.

" And whereas the said annual interest and dividends to accrue due on account of the said sum of Stock and to be receivable by the said Minister or Incumbent for the time being will amount to the sum of £111.

"And whereas the said sum of Stock has been so contributed and paid as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that we should grant out of the Common Fund
