Special Acts (Extension of Time) Act, 1915:
Further extending Time for operation of Section 5 of the Sunderland Corporation (Wearmouth Bridge) Act, 1915.

BOROUGH OF SUNDERLAND.

To the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Sunderland;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by virtue of Section 5 of the Sunderland Corporation (Wearmouth Bridge) Act, 1915, and of an Order dated the 29th day of June, 1918, issued by Us, the Local Government Board, under Section 1 of the Special Acts (Extension of Time) Act, 1915, the time limited for the exercise by the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Sunderland (hereinafter referred to as "the Corporation") of their powers for the compulsory purchase of lands under the first-mentioned Act will expire on the 2nd day of July 1919:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by Section 1 of the second-mentioned Act and of any other powers in that behalf, We, by this Our Order, extend until the 2nd day of July, 1920, the time limited as aforesaid for the exercise of the powers of the Corporation for the compulsory purchase of lands under the first-mentioned Act.

YEOVIL ELECTRIC LIGHTING ORDER, 1914.

SPECIAL ACTS (EXTENSION OF TIME) ACT, 1915.

BY virtue and in exercise of the powers conferred on them by the Special Acts (Extension of Time) Act, 1915, the Board of Trade hereby extend for six months from the 8th July, 1919, the periods of two years and eighteen months respectively mentioned in Section 21 of the Schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act, 1899, as incorporated with the Yeovil Electric Lighting Order, 1914 (Mains, &c., to be laid down in streets specified in Special Order and in remainder of area of supply).
