

ing, lift-operating, and cleaning, when these operations are carried on in connection with paper-bag manufacture, and including the printing of paper bags when the printing apparatus is attached to the making apparatus; but excluding the manufacture of bags or containers with unglued flaps (for use in the transmission of printed matter or samples) when made by the same processes as gummed envelopes, and excluding the manufacture of receptacles from cardboard, such as boxes, cartons or skillets.

In accordance with the regulations with respect to the constitution and proceedings of the above-mentioned Trade Board, dated 10th July, 1919, the Trade Board shall consist of:—

TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established under that Act and the Trade Boards Provisional Orders Confirmation Act, 1913, for the Shirtmaking trade in Great Britain as defined in the Regulations made by the Board of Trade and dated 26th December, 1913, hereby give notice, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they propose to vary the General Minimum Time Rate for female workers from 6d. to 8d. per hour, and to vary correspondingly the General Minimum Time Rates fixed for younger female workers.

The Trade Board also give similar notice that they propose to fix General Minimum Time Rates for Male Workers as follows:—

Male Workers of 22 years of age and over, who are employed during the whole or substantial part of their time in Cutting, 1s. 6d. per hour.

The term Cutting shall be deemed to include the operations of Hooking-up, Folding, Marking-in or Marking-out, and Dividing.

ALL OTHER MALE WORKERS.

When employed under 15 years of age, 3d. per hour.

When employed at 15 and under 16 years of age, 4d. per hour.

When employed at 16 and under 17 years of age, 5d. per hour.

When employed at 17 and under 18 years of age, 6d. per hour.
