Deal, Novemb. 17.

Ight or ten thips are lately returned from Burdeauge much damnified by the late ill weather ; we expect about 80 fail more, which came lately thence, which 'tis feared have had also their thates in the fame Tempells. About ten Spanish thips, fifty Dutch, and feveral Hambourgers a e now riping in the Downs.

Plymouth, Nov. 17. Here are now in this Port neer 30 mil of Metchant Gips outwards bound for Spain, Portugal, the Canaries, and Well-Indies, expecting a fair wind.

Lisbonne, Oftob. 10. All things continue in this Kingdome in a quiet and peaceable condition, the Prince Don Pedro having made a full inquiry into the actions of feveral of his Nobility. whom upon feveral informations and jealoufies he had ordered to be lecured, and finding them not guilty of those practifes which were imputed to them, has been pleafed to free them from their confinements, and reftored them again to their liberties to the latisfaction of all people, and the better to lettle the Kingdom in peace, and to preferve a right understanding with the States of the United Provinces, has dispatcht away Don Francisco de Melo, under the character of his Amballador to the faid States, with an answer to all their demands, which 'tis hoped will be to their fatisfaction and procure the re eftablishment of their oncient frienathip

Tangier, Oftob. 17. On the 29th of September, Sir Themas Allen with the squadron under his command, arrived Before Algier, where he has made a new peace with the people, and obtained the reftitution of those English to their liberty, which were formerly taken near the Streights, the Peace was folemnly figned and fealed on both fides the 6th of this initant October.

Tangier, Oftob. 18. The great fuccesses which Taffaletta has of late had in the last Summers Expedition, makes all the Neighbouring Cities stand upon their Guard ; having by his Conquests taken on him not onely the Title of King, But Emperour of Barbary : which he has now fertled under his obedience.

The Seas are of late well fecured from the Sally Men of War by the diligence of Captain Richard Rooth , who with the Garland and Francis Friga & truiling upon their Coafts, on the 25th of September laft forced a Pink with 8 Guns and about 80 men, with her Prize, another Pink of 70 or 80 Tuns, belonging to Dublin, over the Barre of Sally, within the Command of the Caffle; which fired many Guns for their refeue : but the Pinks ftriking feveral times on

she fands, both of them funk upon their entrance. On the 27th of the lame Moneth they put on there about 4 leagues to the Southwards of the Barre, a French Prize be-Jonging to a revolted. Atgerin, laden with Sugar, Silt, and Linnen, of about 120 Tuns, where the in little time perifhed.

The 28th they had view and gave chale to the revolted Argerine, being a Frigar of about 200 Tuns, 16 Guns, 6 Murderers, and 10 men, forcing the Pyrate on shore upon the Barre, where h: immediately overfet and split to pieces.

Off. 5. They put two Men of War on those about 2 leagues to the Northward of Sally, the one judged to be a Caravel with 4 Guns, 4 Murtherers, and about 80 men; the other a French built thip with & Guns and about the fame number of 8 men, which they feeing grounded, and the Sea to break over them , flood off to Sea ; but about two

hours' after flanding in again to the fame place, could not perceive with part of them above water : after this fervice, which has fufficiently cleared thele Seas from thele Sally

Corlaires, the two Figats are gone to Cadig to refit. Madrid, Nov. 4. We have here many reports of the motions of Don Juan, but this onely feems affured, that he is gone from Arragon into the confines of Catalonia, but with what defignes is not yet known, and hath di patcht away his Secretary to Rome. The Council Royal of *caffille* hath declifted, that what his Highne's hath hitherto done, amounts not to Treason against the Crown. Three thousand Horfe rre ordered to be quartered about Madrid and forces or sered to be raifed, but 'tis faid are principally intended to be feat for the fecurity of your places in Affrica against the great power of Taffeiera, who has appeared already before Maffa-gon a Garifon belonging to the Portugueles.

The Marquis de Caftel Rodrige is fafely arrived here by Post from Flanders.

Venice, Novemb. 10. On Wednefday Morning laft arrived a thip from the Ifle of Corfu , which in her way overtook his Excellency Segnior Aleffaniro rolino Captain of the Fleet, on his return hither 5 but having acceived fome damage in his ship by ill weather, was constrained to put into lorse Port by the way to refit ; and may be fuddenly expected here.

Leuers from cardis of the gift paft inform us, that the Turks being very sensible of their great losses tustained in their affaults and several fallies made by the besieged; by which their numbers are much diminished ; have forborn of late to make any farther attempts : which encouraging the Defendants, the General St. Andre Monbrun with a choice party, made another bisk Sally upon them the 4th of Offober from the Fort St. Andre, beating the Turks out of their Line, and poffeffing themfelves of a Battery ; from whence they drew off a Mortar Piece , and were endeavouring allo to carry off their Cannon; but the Turks coming on with all their force, prevented them ; fo that they were obliged to make their-secret into the Town. In this Service Segnior Francisco Battaglia a Duke in Candia, and Brother to the General of that name, gave fingular marks of his valour , but as he was lerring his lown hand to draw off one of the Turks Guns, was ki led by a Musker fhor ; but his body was by the valuur of Segnior Carlo Dona and Pietro Badoar carried off; though with extraordinary oppolition ; befides this noble perion we loft in this Sally about 80 men, feveral others hurt, and amongst them Segnior Matteo semitecolo received a Musket that in his arm. A fugitive from the Enemies Camp has fince informed that, he Turks in that days firvice loft about 2,500 men, and amongh them the Aga of the Janifuries, the Grand Viners Lieutenam, and two other Officers of Note; and had above 2500 woundeds which had to difcouraged them , that many of the Army were fled into the Mountains 3 and 300 Janifaries had feiled upon fo ne little Barks, and were put to fea, being quite tired our with the fervice. They farther tell us, that the Turkish Gallies had not landed, above 1000 Janifaries for the rein-Forcement of their Army ; which upon a firict enquiry conlifts not of 20000 men, any ngu which might be accounted about 7000 Pior cers.

Bruffels, Nov. 23. On Friday laft returned bither the Deputies lent from this L ipy to the Confishe of Ca ille, and with them the Count de Salazar, who the new gay was prefent at the Affembly of the tates of Brabant, whe e he moved for the payment of the lummes demanded of them by the late Opvernoury and conferred to by the faid States, but Wah
