PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**W**HEREAS by His Majesty's Order in Council bearing date the 14th day of October, 1915, a Scheme of Pensions, Grants, and Allowances in the nature thereof was framed in pursuance of Section 1 of the Injuries in War (Compensation) Act, 1915, for the benefit of persons in respect of disablement suffered by them and attributable to causes arising out of the operations of the Present War:—

- (a) whilst they are employed afloat by or under the Postmaster-General or in pursuance of any agreement made by the Postmaster-General with other persons in connexion with the laying, installing, repairing, and operating of submarine cables and telegraphic (including wireless) apparatus; or,
  - (b) whilst they are being carried afloat to or from any place where they are about to be or have been employed in connexion with such purposes; or,
  - (c) whilst they are employed afloat by the Postmaster-General on duties in connexion with the conveyance or sorting of letters and parcels;
- and, in the case of their death to their widows and other dependants:

And whereas it is further enacted in the said Section of the said Act that an Order in Council under the said Act may provide that the Order shall have effect as from the 3rd day of August, 1914, and that any such Order in Council may be revoked or varied by any subsequent Order:

And whereas it has been represented to His Majesty that it is desirable that the provisions of the said Scheme should be amended as shown in the Schedule to this Order:

And whereas the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, in exercise of the powers in that behalf vested in Him by the Injuries in War (Compensation) Act, 1915, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order and direct that the said Scheme framed by the said Order in Council of the 14th day of October, 1915, be amended as shown in the Schedule hereto.

## SCHEDULE.

Between the 1st day of April, 1917, and the 16th day of November, 1918, the following scale of Pensions and Allowances shall be deemed to have had application instead of Clauses (a) and (b) of the Scale of Pensions

and Allowances to Widows and other Dependants provided for in the Scheme.

(a) To the widow a pension equal to one-third pay or 13s. 9d. per week, whichever be greater.

(b) To or for the benefit of each child (other than a motherless child) until the age of 16 the following allowances:—

1. For the first child 1/24th pay or 5s. per week, whichever be greater.
2. For the second child 1/24th pay or 4s. 2d. per week, whichever be greater.
3. For the third child 1/24th pay or 3s. 4d. per week, whichever be greater.
4. For the fourth and each subsequent child 1/24th pay or 2s. 6d. per week, whichever be greater.

From and after the 16th day of November, 1918, the following scale of Pensions and Allowances shall have application in substitution for the foregoing scale and for clause (c) of the scale of Pensions and Allowances to Widows and other Dependants provided for in the Scheme.

(a) To the Widow a pension equal to one-third pay or 13s. 9d. per week, whichever be greater.

(b) To or for the benefit of each child (other than a motherless child) until the age of 16 an allowance equal to 1/10th pay. Provided that the amount payable to or for the benefit of each child shall not exceed £24 a year and shall not be less than the following sums:—

1. For the first child 6s. 8d. per week.
2. For the second child 5s. per week.
3. For the third and each subsequent child 4s. 2d. per week.

(c) To or for the benefit of each motherless child until the age of 16 an allowance equal to 1/6th pay. Provided that the amount payable to or for the benefit of each child shall not exceed for the first child £40 per annum, and for the second and each subsequent child £35 per annum, and shall not be less than the sum of 10s. per week. Provided further that if at any time two or more motherless children, who are members of the same family, are being maintained by one person in the same household or institution, the minimum payment in respect of the second and each subsequent child, whilst maintained as aforesaid, shall be 9s. 2d. per week instead of 10s. per week.

Provided that when the allowance for the time being payable to any child in accordance with the foregoing scales is less than the allowance already being paid to such child in accordance with the scales provided by the Scheme, no reduction shall be made in any such allowance, but such child shall in all other respects be subject to and be entitled to the benefit of the alterations in the Scheme hereby provided for.

Provided further that if for any reason in his discretion the Postmaster-General thinks fit to do so, he may, instead of paying to or for the benefit of children who are members of the same family the allowances set out in the foregoing scales, pay to or for the benefit of each such child an equal proportion of the total sum for the time being payable in accordance with such scales in respect of the whole of the children who are members of the family.

The Scheme shall have effect and shall be deemed always to have had effect as if the following Clause had been contained therein:—

“The payment of an allowance to any child may at the discretion of the Postmaster-

General be made or continued until such child shall have attained the age of 18 years, if such child is an apprentice receiving not more than nominal wages or is being educated at a Secondary School, Technical Institute or University.”

The Scheme shall have effect and shall be deemed always to have had effect as if the following clause had been inserted in the definition of the term “Pay” immediately after the words “For the purposes of this Scheme pay shall be computed as follows,” and as if the Clauses numbered 1 and 2 in the said definition had been numbered 2 and 3 respectively.

“1. In the case of any person in the employment of the Postmaster-General, whether or not he holds a Civil Service Certificate (not being a person temporarily employed by the Postmaster-General), pay shall be deemed to be the salary and emoluments, exclusive of War Bonus, payable to him at the time of the disablement suffered by him, or at the time of his being killed, as the case may be, which in accordance with the regulations at such time in force would be taken into account by the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury in the calculation of any superannuation allowance or gratuity which might be awarded to such person under the Superannuation Acts, 1834 to 1914.”

**THE INSTITUTE OF CHARTERED ACCOUNTANTS IN ENGLAND AND WALES.**

**BYE-LAW 34A.**

34A.—The Council may at a meeting convened as prescribed by Section 14 of the Royal Charter and in exercise of the powers thereby conferred elect as an Associate any candidate for admission who has served, or is serving in His Majesty's Forces during war; provided such candidate shall have complied with the provisions of the Royal Charter and these Bye-laws relating to service under Articles and Examinations which are applicable in his case, with such exceptions therefrom and modifications thereof as the Council may by a Resolution passed under the provisions of this Bye-law have made in his favour.

The Council may by a Resolution passed at a meeting specially convened with notice of the object, at which meeting there shall be present not less than twenty-four of the Members of the Council, and for which Resolution not less than three-fourths of those present and voting shall vote, make in the case of any person who purposes to become a candidate for admission who has served, or is serving, in His Majesty's Forces during war such exceptions from or modifications in the provisions of the Royal Charter and these Bye-laws relating to service under Articles and Examinations as are below referred to and as may to them seem reasonable in the circumstances of his case, that is to say:—

(a) That the candidate shall be exempt from the Preliminary Examination.

(b) That any period of service by the candidate in His Majesty's Forces after the date of his Articles or any specified portion of such period shall be deemed equivalent to service under his Articles.

(c) That in the case of a candidate whose Articles are dated before the expiration of one year from the termination of the War of 1914-19, the candidate's period of service under Articles shall be reduced to such period as the Council may decide, provided that such reduced period of service shall not be less than three years, or if the candidate has graduated in any University of the United Kingdom shall not be less than two years.

(d) That the candidate shall be exempt from the Intermediate Examination.

(e) That the candidate may sit for any examination at any time specified by the Council, although not otherwise qualified to sit at that time.

(f) That the Certificate of service required by Bye-laws 82 and 87 or either of them be modified as the circumstances of the case require.

(g) That the candidate's period of service in His Majesty's Forces during war be proved by the Certificate of the candidate's superior officer or otherwise to the satisfaction of the Council.

Any of the aforesaid exceptions or modifications in favour of a candidate may be made in the manner aforesaid from time to time as the occasion for each such exception or modification arises, and without prejudice to the power of the Council to make further exceptions or modifications as are above referred to in favour of the same candidate at a later stage in his candidature.

**TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.**

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established in Great Britain under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for the branches of trade specified in the Trade Boards (Paper Bag Trade) Order, 1919, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they PROPOSE TO FIX general minimum time-rates, piece work basis time-rates and overtime-rates, and TO DECLARE THE NORMAL NUMBER OF HOURS OF WORK in the trade for the purpose of the application of the overtime-rates, as follows:—

*Proposed General Minimum Time-Rates for Male Workers.*

(a) For male workers other than learners, 1s. 1½d. per hour.

(b) For male learners:—

Learners of under 15 years of age, 14s. per week of 48 hours, or 3½d. per hour.

Learners of 15 and under 16 years of age, 16s. per week of 48 hours, or 4d. per hour.

Learners of 16 and under 17 years of age, 20s. per week of 48 hours, or 5d. per hour.

Learners of 17 and under 18 years of age, 24s. per week of 48 hours, or 6d. per hour.

Learners of 18 and under 19 years of age, 32s. per week of 48 hours, or 8d. per hour.

Learners of 19 and under 20 years of age, 40s. per week of 48 hours, or 10d. per hour.

Learners of 20 and under 21 years of age, 48s. per week of 48 hours, or 1s. per hour.

The minimum time-rates for Learners under 14 years of age shall be 10s. per week of 48 hours or 2½d. per hour and on reaching the age of 14 they shall be entitled to the amounts shown in Column I. above as if they had commenced at 14.

*Proposed Piecework Basis Time-Rates for Female Workers.*

All female workers:—

(a) For female workers other than homeworkers, 8½d. per hour.

(b) For female homeworkers, 8½d. per hour.

The piecework basis time-rates are for the purpose of securing, as respects each of the above mentioned classes of workers, that in the case of all female workers employed on piecework each piece rate paid shall be such as would yield in the circumstances of the case not less than 8½d. per hour to an ordinary worker.

*Proposed Overtime-Rates for Male and Female Workers Whether Employed on Time Work or on Piecework.*

(1) In accordance with Section 3 (i.) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board PROPOSE TO DECLARE THE NORMAL NUMBER OF HOURS OF WORK TO BE as follows:—

In any week, 48.

On any day other than Saturday, 9.

On Saturday, 5.

Provided that all hours worked on Sundays and on customary public and statutory holidays shall be regarded as overtime, to which the overtime rates shall apply.

(2) And the Trade Board PROPOSE TO FIX overtime rates in respect of hours worked by a worker, whether engaged on time work or

on piecework, in excess of such normal number of hours as follows, that is to say:—

(a) For the first two hours' overtime on any day, except Sundays and customary public and statutory holidays, the overtime rates shall be equivalent to TIME AND A QUARTER, that is to say, one and a quarter times the minimum rate otherwise applicable.

(b) For the second two hours' overtime on any day, except Sundays and customary public and statutory holidays, the overtime rates shall be equivalent to TIME AND A HALF, that is say, one and a half times the minimum rate otherwise applicable.

(c) For all time worked on Sundays and customary public and statutory holidays, and for overtime after the first four hours on any other day, the overtime rate shall be equivalent to DOUBLE TIME, that is to say, twice the minimum rate otherwise applicable.

(d) For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48, the overtime rates shall be time and a quarter, except insofar as higher overtime rates are payable, under the provisions of paragraph 2 (a), (b) and (c) above.

Provided that where it is, or may become, the established practice of an employer only to require attendance on five days a week, the overtime rate shall only be payable where on any day the number of hours worked exceeds 9½.

Provided also that where it is, or may become, the established practice of an employer

to require attendance only on alternate Saturdays, the normal number of hours for the week in which attendance on Saturday is required shall be deemed to be 50.

The above rates shall apply subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Act to all workers in Great Britain who are employed during the whole or any part of their time in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Paper Bag Trade) Order, 1919, that is to say, the manufacture from paper (including gauze-lined or cloth-lined paper) of any bag or container without a gummed flap, INCLUDING the operations of packing, parcelling, warehousing, receiving, storekeeping, despatching, time-keeping, lift-operating and cleaning, when these operations are carried on in connection with paper bag manufacture, and INCLUDING the printing of paper bags when the printing apparatus is attached to the making apparatus, but EXCLUDING the manufacture of bags or containers with ungummed flaps (for use in the transmission of printed matter or samples) when made by the same process as gummed envelopes, and EXCLUDING the manufacture of receptacles from cardboard, such as boxes, cartons or skillets.

The Trade Board will consider any objections to the above proposals which may be lodged with them within two months from the 13th August, 1919.

Such objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Paper Bag Trade Board (Great Britain), 5, Chancery Lane, W.C. 2.

It is desirable that objections should state precisely and so far as possible with reasons what is objected to.

OF 1919 (No. 3).

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

*Modification of Orders.*

1. The Warwickshire and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1919, hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order," and the Warwickshire and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1919 (No. 2), hereinafter referred to as "Order (No. 2)," are modified in manner hereinafter appearing.

*Movement into the Zone for Immediate Slaughter.*

2.—(1.) An animal may, subject as herein-after provided, be moved by railway without a licence from premises not situate within the Scheduled District to a railway station situate within the Zone described in the First Schedule hereto (hereinafter referred to as "the Zone"); and an animal so moved may be moved from the railway station to any slaughterhouse situate within the Zone if accompanied by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the railway station is situate.

(2.) An animal may, subject as hereinafter provided, be moved by road from any premises not situate within the Scheduled District to any slaughterhouse in the Zone if accompanied by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the slaughterhouse is situate.

*Movement within the Zone.*

3. Where an Inspector of the Local Authority considers it necessary or expedient that an animal in his district should be permitted to be moved from premises in the Zone to any other premises in the Zone, he may authorise such movement by a Movement Licence.

*Provisions as to Movement Licences.*

4.—(1.) Where the movement authorised by a Movement Licence granted under this Order is movement to a slaughterhouse from premises other than a railway station an animal shall not be moved with the Licence unless before the movement is commenced it is marked by and at the expense of the owner in manner following:—

*Cattle.*—By the clipping of a broad arrow † about six inches long on the left hind-quarter of each of the cattle and by the clipping of the hair off the end of the tail.

*Sheep.*—By the clipping of a broad arrow † on the forehead of each of the sheep; and also by the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long, on both sides of each of the sheep with the following composition, namely: Rosin, five parts; oil of turpentine, two parts; and blue or red ochre, one part; melted and used warm; or with some other adhesive composition of a blue or red colour.

*Swine.*—By the painting or stamping of

the letter M, about six inches long, on both sides of each of the swine with the composition above mentioned.

(2.) A Movement Licence under this Order shall not be granted by an Inspector of a Local Authority unless he is satisfied that the proposed movement will not involve movement on a road in the Scheduled District which is not in the Zone.

(3.) Where the movement authorised by a Movement Licence is movement as often as occasion may require, either between different parts of the same farm or between different farms, the Licence shall be marked with the words "Occupation Licence," and shall be in force until it is revoked by an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board by a Notice served on the occupier of the farm on which the animals then are.

(4.) Every Licence shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted, the number and description of the animals authorised to be moved, and the name or description of the several premises to and from which the animals are authorised to be moved.

(5.) Where animals are moved with a Licence under this Order, unless the Licence is an Occupation Licence, the Licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up to an officer of the Local Authority or be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station in the same District by the person in charge of the animals at the time of completing the movement.

(6.) A Movement Licence granted under this Order, except where it is otherwise expressly authorised by this Order, shall be in force for four days, inclusive of the day of issue, and shall be in the form set forth in the Second Schedule to this Order or to the like effect.

(7.) A Movement Licence granted under this Order shall not be available if granted by the owner of the animal to be moved, or by his agent, or by the consignee of the animal, or by the occupier of the farm or premises or slaughterhouse from or to which the animal is to be moved, or by any individual member of an Executive Committee or Sub-Committee of a Local Authority.

(8.) A copy of a Licence which authorises movement to premises in a District other than the District for which the person granting the Licence acts as Inspector shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination is situate.

*General Provisions as to Movement.*

5. Animals while being moved under this Order shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all animals which are not being so moved, and shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the place of destination specified in the Licence, and where the place of destination is a slaughterhouse they shall be there detained until they are slaughtered.

*Exception of certain Animals from Provisions as to Movement.*

6. Nothing in this Order shall be construed as authorising—

(i) movement of an animal which is affected with foot-and-mouth disease, or which has during the preceding twenty-eight

days been in any way exposed to the infection of such disease; or

(ii) movement into or out of a foot-and-mouth disease infected place; or

(iii) movement of an animal the movement of which is prohibited by notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board.

*Saving for Orders and Regulations.*

7. Movement of animals under this Order is subject to any other Order of the Board, and also subject to any Regulation made by a Local Authority under any Order of the Board for prohibiting or regulating the movement of animals.

*Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.*

8.—(1.) Any person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read, and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

*Prohibition of Movement out of the Zone except in certain cases.*

9. No animal shall be moved out of the Zone except for the purpose of movement for slaughter into any of the boroughs described in the Schedule to Order (No. 2), under and in accordance with the provisions of that Order, and for the purposes of such movement the Zone shall be treated as if it were not in the Scheduled District.

*Prohibition of Markets, &c., of Animals.*

10. No market, fair, sale, or exhibition of animals shall be held in the Zone, or in any other part of the Scheduled District.

*Offences.*

11.—(1.) If a person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted on any animal as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

*Interpretation.*

12.—In this Order—

“The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

“The Board” means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.

“Animals” means cattle, sheep, goats and swine.

“Slaughterhouse” means any premises where animals are habitually slaughtered, and includes a bacon factory.

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

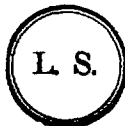

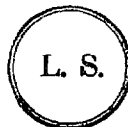

WIRELESS METEOROLOGICAL INFORMATION TO AND FROM SHIPS AT SEA.

*General Remarks.*

*Former Notice.*—No. 880 of 1919; hereby cancelled.

1. It is earnestly hoped that all concerned will assist in making the wireless meteorological service a success. Negotiations are now in hand to extend and unify the system of collecting weather data by wireless from ships at sea all over the world, and at the same time to organise the free transmission of weather bulletins from a sufficient number of wireless stations to admit of ships being constantly supplied with reliable weather reports and forecasts wherever they may be.

2. It should be borne in mind that the needs of ships at sea in regard to information regarding the weather will march hand in hand with the requirements of aircraft. The importance of this service will therefore be constantly increasing, and its success or failure will largely depend upon the co-operation of ships at sea in providing the data without which accurate forecasting is impossible. The matter does not depend solely upon the efforts of the ships selected to furnish the data. The essence of success lies in rapidity in passing such data by wireless from the ship to the coast station, and thence to the central meteorological office. It



follows, therefore, that all ships not taking an active part in supplying data should use the greatest care not to interfere with the transmission of the wireless messages to the shore.

3. The following particulars refer to the scheme now being undertaken by the British Meteorological Office. This notice will, however, be subject to revision from time to time, and endeavours will be made to include in each revision all information available to date of the weather bulletins issued by the wireless stations of the world. Earnest endeavours are being made to obtain international agreement as to the form of these weather bulletins and to the methods and times of transmissions. It is hoped that the messages will eventually all be made in an international code at fixed times, so arranged that a ship with only one wireless operator will be able to read them. A similar scheme for time signals is being evolved.

*Collection of Weather Data from Ships.*

4. Certain ships are being asked to supply data regularly three times a day whenever they are within a certain distance of any one of some six or eight "observation points" in the North-Eastern Atlantic.

5. In addition to the regular observations, which are taken at 0100, 0700 and 1300 Greenwich time and sent as soon as possible to Malin head (GMH) or Valentia (GCK) coast stations, these ships may, on request from either of these coast stations, send special data messages at other times.

6. The procedure for a ship which intends to send a data message will be as follows:—As soon as it has been decided to make the data message (*i.e.*, normally at about 0100, 0700 or 1300), the ship makes to "all ships" (CQ) the word "weather,"\* followed by a number which indicates the "observation point" (see para. 4 above), near which she is at the time.

\* Application is being made to Berne to allot an international 3-letter abbreviation to mean: "Am about to make weather data from observation point number ....."

7. This warning message will not be answered by any ship or station; it is merely designed:—

(a) To inform all ships within range that a report is about to be made and that they should therefore avoid interfering.

(b) To inform all other ships supplying weather data, which may be in the vicinity of the same observation point, that, one ship having decided to make a report, it is unnecessary for them to make one also.

8. About 5 or 10 minutes after the ship has made the warning as above, she may be expected to transmit the data message itself. The normal or regular "data message" consists of 4 groups of 5 figures each; the special data message is of 2 groups of 5 figures each. All data messages bear the one word "weather"† as the address, and conclude with a "time of origin" of 4 figures. The message will be sent to Malin head (GMH) or Valentia (GCK), according to the position of the "observation point."

† Application is being made to Berne to allot international 3-letter abbreviations to mean: "Following are normal (or special) weather data."

9. It should be noted that several of the observation points are so far out at sea that the coast stations, although provided with extra sensitive receiving gear, will be unable to read the messages unless all ships help by keeping quiet.

In particular, ships working near Malin head or Valentia should be on the watch for the coast station making "Go on" (K) or "Repeat" (UD) to a ship whose transmission they themselves cannot hear. It is hoped that ships will so co-operate in this matter that it will be unnecessary to arrange international "silent periods" to enable these long-range data messages to be read by the coast stations.

10. The coast stations, on receiving these data messages, will possibly have to forward them to London by wireless. They would use continuous wave for this purpose, and would therefore not be heard by ships not fitted with special receivers. Ships should therefore be prepared to find that Valentia or Malin head could not attend to calls for a few minutes after receipt of one of these data messages.

11. The "special" data messages referred to in paragraph 5 above are only made when the Meteorological Office finds its information pointing to the existence of peculiar conditions in a certain area. In such cases the Office directs Valentia or Malin head to ask for reports. The shore station then sends, to "any British ship supplying weather data"‡ the word "weather"¶ followed, if necessary, by the number of the observation point from which a special data message is desired. This word would not be answered by ships; but ships addressed, which were in the vicinity of any (or of the specified) observation point, would verify their position, make the warning signal to "All ships," take observations and pass in the special data message as above described for the regular message.

‡ The call letters BVD are being given this signification.

¶ Application is being made to Berne to allot an international 3-letter abbreviation to mean: "Please give special weather data (from observation point number .....)".

*ISSUE OF WEATHER BULLETINS TO SHIPS.*

12. A wireless *weather bulletin* may contain both or either of the following:—

(a) A *weather report*, which is an official statement of existing weather conditions; and/or

(b) A *weather forecast*, which is an official opinion of probable future weather conditions.

13. The accompanying schedule of wireless weather bulletins is intended to provide, in a form suitable to give all information required by the wireless operator, a complete and up-to-date list of all weather bulletins transmitted at fixed times by wireless stations throughout the world. The same information will be found in detail in the Sailing Directions and in the international list of radiotelegraph stations (the Berne List).

14. The times given in the third column of the schedule are expressed in the 4-figure notation employed for signalling during the war. The term "G.M.T." here means the civil mean time of the meridian of Greenwich, with the day commencing at midnight and the hours reckoned from 00 to 23.

15. Operators are reminded that Article 45 of the International Service Regulations imposes the general obligation of not interfering with reception of weather bulletins by other ships.

16. Certain other stations not shown in the schedule supply weather bulletins *on demand*, generally at reduced charges. Particulars will be found in the Berne List.

SCOTLAND, EAST COAST.

*Firth of Forth—Traffic Regulations.**Former Notice.*—No. 1242 of 1919; hereby cancelled.

Mariners are hereby warned that, under the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, the following Regulations have been made by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty and are now in force:—

## Section I.

## DEFINITIONS OF TERMS.

*Firth of Forth.*—All the waters bounded on the east by a straight line joining Elieness and Fidra, and extending as far as the tide flows.

*The Port.*—The limits of the Dockyard Port of Rosyth are:—

On the east a line drawn  $180^{\circ}$  (*S. 18^{\circ} W. Mag.*) through the south point of Carron harbour in the county of Fife to the south shore of the Firth of Forth.

On the west a line drawn  $0^{\circ}$  (*N. 18^{\circ} E. Mag.*) through Carriden house to the north shore of the Firth of Forth.

*King's Harbour Master.*—The King's Harbour Master, Rosyth.

*Thick or Foggy Weather.*—Any weather conditions which prevent objects 500 yards off being clearly visible, such as fog, mist, falling snow or heavy rainstorms.

## Section II.

## GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS.

Until further notice the following Regulations are to be observed by all merchant ships in the Firth of Forth. All orders and instructions given by the King's Harbour Master or any patrol vessel are to be implicitly obeyed.

2. The ordinary rules for navigation and safe conduct are to be adhered to in the Firth of Forth except so far as they are affected by these Regulations.

3. Nothing in these Regulations exonerates the owner, master or agent of any ship from any neglect of the ordinary rules for the navigation and safe conduct of ships.

4. Merchant vessels may enter or leave the Forth at any time, but must not leave without first obtaining port clearance from the Collector of Customs.

All traffic entering Firth of Forth is warned to keep a good look-out for signals flying from St. Abbs head and Fifeness signal stations.

5. Merchant vessels wishing to enter or leave the docks at Leith or Granton must first obtain permission from the Senior Naval Officer at Leith or Granton respectively.

## Section III.

## NAVIGATION OF THE DOCKYARD PORT—VESSELS TO KEEP CLEAR OF H.M. SHIPS.

*By Day.*—When any of H.M. Ships or other vessel in charge of H.M. officers is about to pass—

Outwards, through the Bridge channel, she will hoist the letter "O" flag at the fore, or

Inwards, through the Bridge channel, she will hoist the Union flag at the fore, and the signal stations at North Queensferry, Dockyard and Charlestown will repeat this signal. All other vessels, craft and boats of

every description under way are to keep out of the way of the said ship flying the "O" flag or Union flag as the case may be, provided always the said ship shall be navigated with due care and moderate speed and that she shall so far as possible be kept on that side of the channel which lies to her own starboard side.

Letter "O" flag is yellow and red, diagonal, *By Night.*—The signal stations mentioned above will hoist—

Two red lights for an inward bound vessel.

Three red lights for an outward bound vessel.

## Section IV.

## PILOTS AND PILOTAGE.

It is compulsory for all vessels to have a licensed pilot on board when navigating the Firth of Forth. Incoming vessels will pick up the pilot from the pilot vessel, which will be found in the vicinity of the green buoy situated  $212^{\circ}$  (*S. 50^{\circ} W. Mag.*),  $2\frac{1}{2}$  miles from Elieness. Should she be driven off her station she will be found at Inchkeith.

Outward bound vessels from ports west of Inchkeith are to discharge their pilot at the cutter.

A uniform landing fee of 8s. (eight shillings) is to be paid by every pilot landed from the motor boat or other vessel which is provided by the Admiralty for the purpose of conveying pilots to and from the Pilotage station.

The pilot is hereby authorised to recover this fee from the master, owner or agent of each vessel piloted.

## Section V.

## CAUTION AS TO ANCHORING.

No merchant vessel, craft or boat of any description is to make fast to or lay at any dolphins or structure of the Boom Defences.

No vessel is permitted to anchor within the limits of the Dockyard Port without the permission of the King's Harbour Master.

If unavoidably obliged to do so, care must be taken to keep well clear of the fairway and of H.M. Ships at anchor or moored.

## Section VI.

## HEAVY GUN FIRING BY H.M. SHIPS AND DIVING PRACTICE BY SUBMARINES—SPECIAL DIRECTIONS.

*H.M. Ships and Submarines exercising in the Firth of Forth.*—When any of H.M. Ships are carrying out full-calibre firing to the eastward of Inchkeith, or when any of H.M. Submarines are exercising in this area, a red ball over a red burgee will be hoisted at Inchkeith, Fifeness, May island and St. Abbs head signal stations. All shipping is then to follow the track as detailed below.

*Outward Bound.*—Pass close eastward of a red conical buoy moored  $1\frac{1}{2}$  miles east-north-eastward of Kinghorn ness, then steer  $42^{\circ}$  (*N. 60^{\circ} E. Mag.*) until Buckhaven light is abeam. Then steer eastward to pass close to and northward and eastward of a buoy situated about  $3\frac{1}{2}$  miles west-south-westward of Ruddons point, thence steer  $102^{\circ}$  (*S. 60^{\circ} E. Mag.*) to pass one cable south of a green conical light-and-whistle-buoy moored about south-westward,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  miles from Elieness light, then follow the usual track to pass north of May island.

The reverse track should be followed by incoming traffic.

*Variation.*— $18^{\circ} W.$

Mariners are hereby warned that, under the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, the following Regulations have been made by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty and are now in force.

## 1. ENGLISH CHANNEL AND NORTH SEA SOUTHERN PORTION—PILOTAGE REGULATIONS.

1. All ships (other than British ships when trading coastwise or to or from the Channel Islands, or to or from the Port of Brest, or any French Channel Port north and east of Brest, or any Netherlands Continental Port, and not carrying passengers) whilst bound from, and whilst navigating in the waters from, the Downs Pilot Station to Gravesend or *vice versa*, must be conducted by Pilots licensed by the London Trinity House.

2. All ships (other than British ships when trading coastwise or to or from the Channel islands, or to or from the Port of Brest, or any French Channel Port north and east of Brest, or any Netherlands Continental Port, and not carrying passengers) whilst bound from, and between the Downs Pilot Station and Gravesend to The Sunk or *vice versa*, must be conducted by Pilots licensed by the London Trinity House.

Clauses 1 and 2 above do not apply to British ships whilst navigating in the waters between the Downs Pilot Station and Graves-

end or between Gravesend and The Sunk or between The Sunk and the Downs Pilot Station, provided that they do not make use of any port in the London Pilotage District within these limits.

4. All ships (other than British ships of less than 3,500 tons gross tonnage, when trading coastwise or to or from the Channel islands, or to or from the Port of Brest or any French Channel Port north and east of Brest, or any Netherlands Continental Port, and not carrying passengers) whilst navigating in the waters from Gravesend to London Bridge or *vice versa*, must be conducted by Pilots licensed by the London Trinity House.

5. All ships (other than British ships) whilst navigating in the waters between the Downs Pilot Station and The Sunk, or between those places and any intermediate pilot station that may hereafter be established, must be conducted by Pilots licensed by the London Trinity House.

6. The Trinity House Pilot Station at Dungeness having been discontinued, pilotage is therefore not compulsory between the Downs Pilot Station and Dungeness, except for ships bound into or out of the harbours of Dover and Folkestone.

7. Trinity House Pilot Stations have been established at the undermentioned places, and merchant vessels not under compulsion of pilotage are very strongly advised to take pilots:—

(a) THE DOWNS, where ships can obtain Pilots capable of piloting as far as The Sunk, and also Pilots for the River Thames, and Folkestone and Dover harbours. The Pilot Steamer attached to the Downs Station will cruise in the vicinity of a position two miles south-east of Deal pier.

(b) \_\_\_\_\_

(c) THE SUNK, where ships can obtain Pilots for the River Thames and the Downs. The Pilot steamer attached to The Sunk Pilot Station, will cruise in the vicinity of The Sunk light-vessel.

(d) Pilots can also be obtained at LONDON for the Downs and The Sunk (including the River Thames and approaches).

8. The Trinity House Pilot Station at Orfordness has been discontinued.

*Note.*—The Pilots referred to in this Notice are the Pilots licensed by the London Trinity House and no others.

## II. RIVERS THAMES AND MEDWAY, &amp;c. — SPECIAL TRAFFIC REGULATIONS NO LONGER IN FORCE.
