Walton on the Hill, of the second part, the Right Reverend. Francis James, Bishop of Liverpool, the Ordinary of the said Rec-tory of the Parish of Walton on the of the third part, and us, Hill, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners, of said the fourth part (which Indenture is intended to be enrolled in the Chancery Division of the High Court of Justice), the said George Hardwicke Spooner did with the consents of the said John Cecil Gerard Leigh, as such patron as afore-said, and of the said Francis James, Bishop of Liverpool, as such Bishop as aforesaid, grant and confirm unto the Minister of the District hereinafter recommended to be constituted and to his successors and when such District shall have become a New Parish then to the Vicar or Incumbent of such New Parish and to his successors a perpetual clear yearly ront charge or net annual sum of £50 to be payable quar-terly on the usual quarter days in every year, free from and clear of all deductions, taxes, charges, rates, assessments and outgoings whatsoever (except on account of the tax on income or property, if any) and to be for ever issuing and payable out of and charged upon all that the said Rectory of the Parish of Walton on the Hill and the tithes or tithe commutation Rent Charges, Glebe Lands and hereditaments and all other the endowments and emoluments for the time being to the said Rectory belonging, the first of such quarterly payments in respect of the said clear yearly rent charge or net annual sum of £50 to be made on such of the said quarterly days as shall happen next after the date when an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette and to be a proportionate part of the said quarterly payment calculated from the date of the issue of the said Gazette to the said quarterly day of payment:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Francis James, Bishop of Liverpool (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme) We, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said Parish of Walton on the Hill and of the said New Parish of Saint John the Baptist, West Derby, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme become and be constituted a Separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Cclumba, Anfield ':

"And we further recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid the whole right of patronage of the said District so recommended to be constituted and when such District shall have become a New Parish under the provisions of the first hereinbefore mentioned Act then of such New Parish and of the nomination of an Incumbent thereto, shall be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Francis James, Bishop of Liverpool, and his successors in the same Bishopric, as contem-plated by the said 17th section of the Liverpool and Wigan Churches Act, 1904:

"And we further rocommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

## "The Schedule to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Columba, Anfield, comprising:----

"I. All that portion of the Parish of Walton on the Hill, in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Liverpool, which is bounded upon the south-east by the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint John the Baptist, West Derby, in the said County and Diocese, upon the south-west partly by the New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Walton Breck, and partly by the New Parish of Saint Simon and Saint Jude, Anfield, both in the said County and Diocese, upon the northwest by the New Parish of Saint Luke the Evangelist, Walton on the Hill, in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the north-east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boun-dary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Luke the Evangelist, Walton on the Hill, from the said Parish of Walton on tho Hill, at the centre of the bridge which carries the Edge Hill and Bootle Branch Line of the London and North Western Railway across Walton Lane, and extending thence southeastward along the middle of the said branch line of railway for a distance of 72 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Walton on the Hill from the said New Parish of Saint John the Baptist,

West Derby. "II. And also all that contiguous portion of the said New Parish of Saint John the Baptist, West Derby, which is bounded upon the north-west by the above described portion of the said Parish of Walton on the Hill, upon the south-west by the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Walton Breck, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south-east and upon the north-east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity. Walton Breck, from the said New Parish of Saint John the Baptist, West Derby, at a point in the middle of Lower Breck Road opposite to the middle of the passage running along the backs of the houses situate on the south-eastern side of Suburban Road, and extending thence north-eastward first to and then along the middle of the said passage and along the middle of the passage in continuation thereof for a distance of 381 chains or there-abouts to its junction with Lampeter Road, and continuing thence north-eastward in precisely the same direction and in a straight line for a distance of 29<sup>‡</sup> chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the said Edge Hill and Bootle Branch Line of the London and North-Western Railway, and extending thence northwestward along the middle of the said branch line of railway for a distance of 29 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint John the Baptist, West Derby, from the said Parish of Walton on the Hill."
