W HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, and of the Act of the 17th and 18th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 84, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 3rd day of July, 1919, in the words and figures following, that is to say:-

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, and of the Act of the 17th and 18th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 84, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for apportioning the income of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Slaley, in the County of Northumberland, and in the Diocese of Newcastle, between that Benefice and a certain other Benefice, namely, the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Saint Helen, Whitley, which said last-named Benefice is situate in the same County and Diocese:

situate in the same County and Diocese: "Whereas the Right Reverend Herbert Louis, Bishop of the said Diocese of Newcastle, is the Patron in right of his See of the said Benefice of Slaley, and also of the said Benefice of Saint Helen, Whitley:

"And whereas the present endowments of the said Benefice of Slaley include the sum of £1,061 16s. 8d. £5 per cent. War Stock (1929/47) held by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, in trust for and for the benefit of the Vicar or Incumbent of the said Benefice of Slaley for the time being:

"And whereas it has been made to appear to us that the said Benefice of Saint Helen, Whitley, is at present insufficiently endowed, and that the said Benefice of Slaley has endowments of such an amount as that after the apportionment hereinafter recommended and proposed to be made shall have been made the said Benefice of Slaley will still be sufficiently endowed: "Ánd whereas the Right Reverend Herbert Louis, Bishop of the said Diocese of Newcastle, has represented to us, and we are of opinion, that it is desirable that additional provision should be made for the cure of souls within the New Parish of Saint Helen, Whitley, aforesaid, by means of that apportionment of the income of the said Benefice of Slaley, which is hereinafter recommended and proposed :

"And whereas the said Benefice of Slaley is now full, the Reverend John Harrison Salisbury being the present Vicar or Incumbent thereof:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of York, acting as Archbishop of the Province within which each of the said two Benefices is situate, (in testimony of which consent he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Archiepiscopal Seal), with the consent of the said Herbert Louis; Bishop of the said Diocese of New-castle, acting as such Bishop and also as the Patron in right of his See of each of the said two Benefices as aforesaid, (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), and with the consent of the said John Harrison Salisbury, as such Vicar or Incumbent as afore-said, (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), We, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that as from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same, the said sum of $\pounds 1,061$ 16s. 8d. $\pounds 5$ per cent. War Stock, together with any dividends that may have accrued in respect thereof shall cease to form part of the endowments of the said Benefice of Slaley and shall be held by Us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, in trust for and for the benefit of the Vicar or Incumbent of the said Benefice of Saint Helen, Whitley, such sum or Stock, or the proceeds of any sale thereof, together with any dividends that may accrue from time to time in respect thereof shall be applied by Us towards the cost of providing a Parsonage House for the said Benefice of Saint Helen, Whitley.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."
