Parish of Silverton and the Incumbent of the United Benefice shall be discharged from all Cure of Souls within the Separate Land:

"That notwithstanding the separation of the Separate Land from the United Benefice the tithe rentcharge payable in respect of lands constituting the Separate Land shall continue to belong and to be paid to the Incumbent for

the time being of the United Benefice:
"That the whole of the glebe land formerly belonging to the separate Parish of Netherexe (except such part thereof as is situate in the said former separate Parish of Netherexe) shall be transferred to and become part of the glebe lands of the Benefice of Silverton:

"That no change shall be made in the patronage of either the United Benefice or the Benefice of Silverton."

"CONSENTS.

"I, the Right Honourable William Frederick Danvers, Viscount Hambleden, to whom or to whose heirs or assigns the right of presenting to the above mentioned United Benefice and the above mentioned Benefice of Silverton respectively (when the same respectively become vacant) belongs and I, George Owen Apthorp, the Incumbent of the above mentioned United Benefice and I, Ernest Edward Egremont, Heathcote, the Incumbent of the above mentioned Benefice of Silverton hereby respectively signify to Your Grace our several Consents to the Scheme above proposed and set forth and to every matter and thing therein contained.

And whereas the said Archbishop, being satisfied with the said Scheme, hath certified the same and the Consents aforesaid to His Majesty in Council by his Report, dated the 13th day of December, 1918, which said Report is in the words and figures following:—
"We, the undersigned, Randall Thomas,

Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury, do

hereby report to Your Majesty in Council: "That the Right Reverend William, Lord Bishop of Exeter, in pursuance of the 26th Section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, has repre-

sented unto Us amongst other things:.

"That there is in the County of Devon and his Diocese of Exeter, the United Benefice of the Rectory of Rewe and the Vicarage of Netherexe, the Parish whereof contains a population of Two hundred and eighty five or thereabouts:

"That there is also in the same County and Diocese the Rectory of Silverton, the Parish whereof contains a population of 1,141 or

thereabouts:
"That the United Benefice of Rewe and Netherexe includes the tithing of Upexe in which no house is less than two and a quarter miles from the Church at Rewe or the Church at. Netherexe and nearly all the houses in the said tithing are within one and a quarter miles of the Church at Silverton:

"That it appears to the said Lord Bishop that the said tithing of Upexe, the boundaries of which are shown by a green border on the Plan annexed to the hereinafter mentioned Scheme of the said Lord Bishop appended hereto, may be advantageously separated from the said United Benefice of Rewe and Netherexe and annexed to the said contiguous Parish

of Silverton:
"That pursuant to the directions contained in the said Pluralities Act, the said Lord Bishop has drawn up a Scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to him that the proposed alterations may best be effected and how the changes consequent upon such alterations in respect of ecclesias-tical Jurisdiction, Glebe Lands, Tithe Rent Charges and other Ecclesiastical Dues, Rates and Payments, and in respect to Patronage and Rights to Pews may be made with justice to all parties interested which Scheme together with the Consents in writing of The Right Honourable William Frederick Danvers, Viscount Hambleden, the Patron or person entitled to present to the said United Benefice of Rewe and Netherexe and also to the Benefice of Silverton, The Reverend George Owen Apthorp, and the Reverend Ernest Edward Egremont Heathcote, the Incumbents respectively of the same Benefices, has been transmitted to Us for our consideration:

"The Representation and Scheme of the said Lord Bishop and the Consents above re-

ferred to are hereunto annexed:
"And We, the said Archbishop, being on full consideration and enquiry, satisfied with the said Scheme, do hereby pursuant to the said Pluralities Act, certify the same and such Consents as aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may, in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do, make and issue an Order for carrying the said Scheme into effect.

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the said Scheme be carried into effect.

HEREAS by Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, after reciting that eas in some instances Tithings, " Whereas in Hamlets, Chapelries, and other Places or Districts may be separated from the Parishes or Mother Churches to which they belong, with great advantage, and Places altogether extraparochial may, in some instances, advantage be annexed to Parishes or Districts to which they are contiguous, or be constituted Separate Parishes for ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That when with respect to his own Diocese it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or when the Bishop of any Diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop, that any such Tithing, Hamlet, Chapelry, Place or District within the Diocese of such Archbishop, or the Diocese of such Bishop, as the case may be, may be advantageously separated from any Parish or Mother Church, and either be constituted a Separate Benefice by itself or be united to any other Parish to which it may be more conveniently annexed, or to any other adjoining Tithing, Hamlet,
