ARMY COUNCIL ORDER.

CANCELLATION OF THE ORDER PROHIBITING THE LIFTING OF HAY AND STRAW IN SCOTLAND.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on them by the Defence of the Realm Regulations, and of all other powers thereunto enabling them, the Army Council hereby give notice that the Army Council Order dated the 21st day of August, 1918, relative to the prohibition of the lifting and using of hay and straw in Scotland, is hereby cancelled in so far as it relates to all hay, threshed hay, oat straw, wheat straw, revit wheat straw, buckwheat straw, barley straw, mustard straw, rye straw,

pea straw, bean straw and threshed tares in respect of which at the date this Order shall come into force no Purchase Note has been signed, and that all the said hay and threshed hay, oat straw, wheat straw, revit wheat straw, buckwheat straw, barley straw, mustard straw, rye straw, pea straw, bean straw and threshed tares is hereby released; but this cancellation and release shall not affect the previous operation of the said Order or the validity of any action taken under the same or the liability to any penalty or punishment in respect of any contravention of or failure to comply with such Order before the date this Order shall come into force or any proceeding or remedy in respect of any such penalty or punishment; nor shall this cancellation and release affect the provisions of the Army Council Order dated the 2nd day of September, 1918, relative to the regulation of the sale of hay and straw and of
