And whereas the Commons in Parliament Assembled, have, by their humble Address, before the to Issue Our Royal Proclamation, for Securing the Person of the Said Roderick Mackenzie, We have thought fit, by the Advice of Our Privy Council, to Issue this Our Royal Proclimation, hereby Requiring and Commanding all our Louing Subjects what foever, to Discover and Apprehend, and cause the faid Roderick Mackenzie to be Discovered and Apprehended, and to carry him before some of Our Justices of the Peace, or Chief Magistrates of the County, Town, or Place where he shall be Apprehended, who are respectively Required to Secure him, and thereof to give speedy Notice unto Our Privy Council, or One of Our Principal Secretaries of State, to the end he may be forth-coming, to be Dealt withall, and Proceeded against according to Law. And We do hereby strictly Charge and Command all Our Loving Subjects (as they will Answer the contrary at their Perils) that they do not any ways Conceal, but do Discover the said Roderick Mackenzie, to the end he may be Secured and Proseeded against ac-
