CLERGY DISCIPLINE ACT, 1892.

The Rule Committee under the Clergy Discipline Act, 1892, propose to make the following rules:-

1. The Schedule to the Clergy Discipline Rules, 1892, shall be read as if the following additions were made in the appropriate places under the Province of Canterbury in that Schedule: ---
