TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.
CHAIN TRADE BOARD.
(GREAT BRITAIN.)

I.—DOLLIED OR TOMMIED SECTION.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established in Great Britain under that Act for the Hammered and Dollied or Tommied Chain-Making trade, having given due notice on 1st August, 1919, of proposal to vary as therein shown the minimum rates of wages as set out in the notice varying minimum rates dated 1st March, 1918, have given notice that they have varied the general minimum time rates and general minimum piece rates for dollied or tommed chain-making and for hand-hammered chain making of $\frac{3}{8}$ inch diameter and over up to 17-32 inch inclusive, such variations to be operative until 31st March, 1920:—

- (b) Where the worker provides (in respect of iron provided by the employer) the workshop where the work is carried on and the tools and the fuel or any one of these three heads of outlay:—

- (c) The rates in Table (b) are on the basis that any carriage to or from the premises of the employer is performed by the worker, or that if performed by the employer the latter is entitled to receive 2d. per cwt. for carriage either way.

The Board have given similar notice that they have varied the general minimum time rates for learners as defined by the Trade Board as follows:—

During the first six months of employment, from 5s. 2d. to 12s. 6d. a week.

During the second six months of employment from 7s. 2d. to 17s. 3d. a week.

During the third six months of employment, from 13s. to 31s. 3d. a week.

During the fourth six months of employment, from 16s. 3d. to 39s. a week.

The Trade Board have given similar notice that they have varied the general minimum piece rates for making dollied or tommed short link chain or short link hand-hammered chain of $\frac{3}{8}$ inch diameter and over up to 17-32 inch in-

clusive by the addition of sums varying from 114 per cent. to 174 per cent. to the rates set out in the notice issued by the Trade Board and dated 1st March, 1918.

II.—HAND-HAMMERED SECTION.

The Board have also given similar notice that they have varied the general minimum time rates for hand-hammered chain making up to and including 11-32 inch as follows:—

- (a) Where the employer provides (in addition to the iron) the workshop where the work is carried on and the tools and the fuel, from 4d. per hour to 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ d. per hour (free and clear of all deductions).

- (b) Where the worker provides (in respect of iron provided by the employer) the

workshop where the work is carried on and the tools and the fuel, or any one of these heads of outlay, from 5½d. per hour to 10d. per hour (free and clear of all deductions).

(c) The latter variation is proposed on the basis that any carriage to or from the premises of the employer is performed by the worker, or that if performed by the employer, the latter is entitled to receive 2d. per cwt. either way.

The Trade Board have also given similar notice that they have varied the general minimum time rates for learners as defined by the Trade Board in the hand-hammered chain trade as follows:—

By increasing the minimum time rate for learners in their first six months of employment from 5s. 10s. a week to 11s. a week.

By increasing the minimum time rate for learners in their second six months of employment from 8s. a week to 15s. a week.

The Trade Board have also given similar notice that they have varied the general minimum piece rates for making hand-hammered chain by the addition of sums varying from 77 per cent. to 98 per cent. to the rates set out in the Notice issued by the Trade Board and dated 1st March, 1918.

The Trade Board have also given similar notice that, in the application of the above proposed general minimum piece rates to learners as defined by the Trade Board who are in their third or fourth six months of employment as learners (but not in any other case) the general minimum piece rates payable shall be respectively 80 per cent. and 90 per cent. of the above general minimum piece rates.

The Trade Board further give notice that they have received notification from the Minister of Labour that he has made an Order, dated 30th October, 1919 under Section 4 (2) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, confirming the above minimum rates of wages as varied by the Trade Board, and specifying 3rd November, 1919, as the date from which such minimum rates of wages shall become effective.

MACHINE-MADE LACE AND NET FINISHING TRADE.

In accordance with the Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Lace Finishing Trade Board established under that Act for certain branches of the Machine-Made Lace and Net Finishing Trade as defined in the Regulations made by the Board of Trade and dated 16th March, 1914, hereby give notice as required

by section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918 (the Minister of Labour having given his consent to such notice being given), that they propose to vary the general minimum time-rates at present fixed for workers other than learners, and set out in the Schedule of their Notice dated 19th June, 1919, from 5½d. to 7d. an hour, with corresponding variations in the rates for learners.

The Trade Board give similar notice that they propose to vary by the addition of about 25 per cent. the general minimum piece-rates for all processes other than the finishing of warp lace and hair nets at present fixed, and set out in the Schedule of their Notice dated 19th June, 1919, and the general minimum piece-rates for the finishing of warp lace and hair nets at present fixed and set out in the Schedule of their Notice dated 6th November, 1919.

The Trade Board propose that such variations as may be made as the result of the above proposals should be operative for one year from the date when they become effective.

1.—(a) the wholesale or retail sale of fresh milk when carried on as a main or distinct business or as a distinct branch or department of a business;

(b) the sale of food or drink for consumption on the premises or of other goods when any such sale is carried on in association with and as a subsidiary part of such business, branch or department as aforesaid, if such sale involves the employment of workers who are principally employed in the sale specified in (a) above;

and 2.—(a) the following operations when incidental to the sales specified in (1) above—

(1) boxing, parcelling, labelling, weighing, measuring, checking, bottling, unpacking, packing;

(2) collecting, delivering, despatching, horse-keeping, cleaning vehicles;

(3) portering, lift or hoist operating, time-keeping, storing, stock-keeping, warehousing, cleaning premises;

(4) pasteurising, cooking, separating of milk;

(5) cleaning utensils or receptacles;

(6) blending, testing, sampling;

(7) other incidental operations;

(b) clerical work or canvassing when incidental to and carried on in conjunction with the work specified in 1 above

but excluding any operations in—

(a) the transport of goods by common carriers;

(b) any industry or trade concerned exclusively with carting and operations incidental thereto;

(c) Post Office business;

(d) Agriculture within the meaning of the Corn Production Act, 1917.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 7TH NOVEMBER 1919.)

LINCOLNSHIRE (FOOT-AND-MOUTH
DISEASE) ORDER OF 1919 (No. 2).

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1.—(1) The area described in the First Schedule hereto shall be a Prohibited Area for the purposes of this Order.

(2) If any farm (except any detached part) is partly within and partly without the Prohibited Area, the whole shall be deemed to be within the Prohibited Area.

Modification of the Lincolnshire (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1919 (hereinafter referred to as the Principal Order).

Provision as to movement into the parts of the Scheduled District not included in the Prohibited Area.

2.—(1.) An animal may, subject as hereinafter provided, be moved by railway without a licence from premises not situate within the Scheduled District to a railway station situate within the Scheduled District which is not included in a Prohibited Area; and an animal so moved may be moved from the railway station to any slaughterhouse situate within the Scheduled District which is not included in a Prohibited Area if accompanied by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the railway station is situate.

(2.) An animal may, subject as hereinafter provided, be moved by road from any premises not situate within the Scheduled District to any slaughterhouse in the Scheduled District which is not included in a Prohibited Area if accompanied by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the slaughterhouse is situate.

Movement within the Scheduled District excluding any Prohibited Area.

3. Where an Inspector of the Local Authority considers it necessary or expedient that an animal in his district should be permitted to be moved from premises in the Scheduled District which is not included in a Prohibited Area to any other premises in the Scheduled District which is not included in a Prohibited Area, he may authorise such movement by a Movement Licence.

Provisions as to Movement Licences.

4.—(1.) Where the movement authorised by a Movement Licence granted under this Order is movement to a slaughterhouse from premises other than a railway station an animal shall not be moved with the Licence unless before the movement is commenced it is marked by and at the expense of the owner in manner following:—

Cattle.—By the clipping of a broad arrow ↑ about six inches long on the left hind-quarter of each of the cattle and by the clipping of the hair off the end of the tail.

Sheep.—By the clipping of a broad arrow ↑ on the forehead of each of the sheep; and also by the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long, on both sides of each of the sheep with the following composition, namely: Rosin, five parts; oil of turpentine, two parts; and blue or red ochre, one part; melted and used warm; or with some other adhesive composition of a blue or red colour.

Swine.—By the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long, on both sides of each of the swine with the composition above mentioned.

(2.) A Movement Licence under this Order shall not be granted by an Inspector of a Local Authority unless he is satisfied that the proposed movement will not involve movement on a road in a Prohibited Area.

(3.) Where the movement authorised by a Movement Licence is movement as often as occasion may require, either between different parts of the same farm or between different farms, the Licence shall be marked with the words "Occupation Licence," and shall be in force until it is revoked by an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board by a Notice served on the occupier of the farm on which the animals then are.

(4.) Every Licence shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted, the number and description of the animals authorised to be moved, and the name or description of the several premises to and from which the animals are authorised to be moved.

(5.) Where animals are moved with a Licence under this Order, unless the Licence is an Occupation Licence, the Licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up to an officer of the Local Authority or be delivered up at, or sent by post to the nearest Police Station in the same District by the person in charge of the animals at the time of completing the movement.

(6.) A Movement Licence granted under this Order, except where it is otherwise expressly authorised by this Order, shall be in force for four days, inclusive of the day of issue, and shall be in the form set forth in the Second Schedule to this Order or to the like effect.

(7.) A Movement Licence granted under this Order shall not be available if granted by the owner of the animal to be moved, or by his agent, or by the consignee of the animal, or by the occupier of the farm or premises or slaughterhouse from or to which the animal is to be moved, or by any individual member of an Executive Committee or Sub-Committee of a Local Authority.

(8.) A copy of a Licence which authorisee movement to premises in a District other than the District for which the person granting the Licence acts as Inspector shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination is situate.

Movement through a Prohibited Area by Rail.

5. Nothing in this Order shall be deemed to apply to the movement of animals into or out of a Prohibited Area where they are

moved through such Prohibited Area by railway from a place outside such Prohibited Area to another place outside such Prohibited Area without unnecessary delay and without the animals being untrucked within such Prohibited Area except for the purposes of feeding or watering the animals within the railway station premises where such untrucking takes place.

General Provisions as to Movement.

6. Animals while being moved under this Order shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all animals which are not being so moved, and shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the place of destination specified in the Licence, and where the place of destination is a slaughterhouse they shall be there detained until they are slaughtered.

Exception of certain Animals from Provisions as to Movement.

7. Nothing in this Order shall be construed as authorising—

(i) movement of an animal which is affected with foot-and-mouth disease, or which has during the preceding twenty-eight days been in any way exposed to the infection of such disease; or

(ii) movement into or out of a foot-and-mouth disease infected place; or

(iii) movement of an animal the movement of which is prohibited by notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board:

Saving for Orders and Regulations.

8. Movement of animals under this Order is subject to any other Order of the Board, and also subject to any Regulation made by a Local Authority under any Order of the Board for prohibiting or regulating the movement of animals.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

9.—(1.) Any person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read, and a copy or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Holding of Markets and Sales in the Scheduled District (except in a Prohibited Area).

10.—(1.) A market or sale of animals may be held on any premises in the Scheduled District which are not in a Prohibited Area if the Local Authority are satisfied that the market or sale will be restricted to animals intended for immediate slaughter and the market or sale is authorised by the Local Authority under this Article.

(2.) The Local Authority shall cause a Veterinary Inspector to attend at every market or sale authorised under this Article and examine the animals exposed thereat.

(3.) An animal exposed at a market or sale authorised under this Article shall not be moved therefrom unless before such movement it is marked, by and at the expense of the owner, in the manner described in Article 4 of this Order.

Offences.

11.—(1.) If a person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted on any animal as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

12. In this Order—

“The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

“The Board” means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.

“Animals” means cattle, sheep, goats and swine.

“Slaughterhouse” means any premises where animals are habitually slaughtered, and includes a bacon factory.

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Commencement.

13. This Order shall come into operation on the tenth day of November, nineteen hundred and nineteen.

Short Title.

14. This Order may be cited as the LINCOLNSHIRE (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1919 (No. 2), and shall be read with the principal Order.

ISLE OF WIGHT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH
DISEASE) ORDER OF 1919 (No. 2).

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

Prohibited Areas.

I.—(1) The areas described in the First Schedule hereto shall be Prohibited Areas for the purposes of this Order.

(2) If any farm (except any detached part) is partly within and partly without a Prohibited Area, the whole shall be deemed to be within the Prohibited Area.

*Movement within the Scheduled District
excluding any Prohibited Area.*

2. Where an Inspector of the Local Authority considers it necessary or expedient that an animal in his district should be permitted to be moved from premises in the Scheduled District which are not included in a Prohibited Area to any other premises in the Scheduled District which are not included in a Prohibited Area, he may authorise such movement by a Movement Licence.

Provisions as to Movement Licences.

3.—(1.) Where the movement authorised by a Movement Licence granted under this Order is movement to a slaughterhouse from premises other than a railway station an animal shall not be moved with the Licence unless before the movement is commenced it is marked by and at the expense of the owner in manner following:—

Cattle.—By the clipping of a broad arrow ↑ about six inches long on the left hind-quarter of each of the cattle and by the clipping of the hair off the end of the tail.

Sheep.—By the clipping of a broad arrow ↑ on the forehead of each of the sheep; and also by the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long, on both sides of each of the sheep with the following composition, namely: Rosin, five parts; oil of turpentine, two parts; and blue or red ochre, one part; melted and used warm; or with some other adhesive composition of a blue or red colour.

Swine.—By the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long, on both sides of each of the swine with the composition above mentioned.

(2.) A Movement Licence under this Order shall not be granted by an Inspector of a Local Authority unless he is satisfied that the proposed movement will not involve movement on a road in a Prohibited Area.

(3.) Where the movement authorised by a Movement Licence is movement as often as

occasion may require, either between different parts of the same farm or between different farms, the Licence shall be marked with the words "Occupation Licence," and shall be in force until it is revoked by an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board by a Notice served on the occupier of the farm on which the animals then are.

(4.) Every Licence shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted, the number and description of the animals authorised to be moved, and the name or description of the several premises to and from which the animals are authorised to be moved.

(5.) Where animals are moved with a Licence under this Order, unless the Licence is an Occupation Licence, the Licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up to an officer of the Local Authority or be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station in the same District by the person in charge of the animals at the time of completing the movement.

(6.) A Movement Licence granted under this Order, except where it is otherwise expressly authorised by this Order, shall be in force for four days, inclusive of the day of issue, and shall be in the form set forth in the Second Schedule to this Order or to the like effect.

(7.) A Movement Licence granted under this Order shall not be available if granted by the owner of the animal to be moved, or by his agent, or by the consignee of the animal, or by the occupier of the farm or premises or slaughterhouse from or to which the animal is to be moved, or by any individual member of an Executive Committee or Sub-Committee of a Local Authority.

(8.) A copy of a Licence which authorises movement to premises in a District other than the District for which the person granting the Licence acts as Inspector shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination is situate.

*Movement through a Prohibited Area by
Rail.*

4. Nothing in this Order shall be deemed to apply to the movement of animals into or out of a Prohibited Area where they are moved through such Prohibited Area by railway from a place outside such Prohibited Area to another place outside such Prohibited Area without unnecessary delay and without the animals being untrucked within such Prohibited Area except for the purposes of feeding or watering the animals within the railway station premises where such untrucking takes place.

General Provisions as to Movement.

5. Animals while being moved under this Order shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all animals which are not being so moved, and shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the place of destination specified in the Licence, and where the place of destination is a slaughterhouse they shall be there detained until they are slaughtered.

Exception of Certain Animals from Provisions as to Movement.

6. Nothing in this Order shall be construed as authorising—

(i) movement of an animal which is affected with foot-and-mouth disease, or which has during the preceding twenty-eight days been in any way exposed to the infection of such disease; or

(ii) movement into or out of a foot-and-mouth disease infected place; or

(iii) movement of an animal the movement of which is prohibited by notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board.

Saving for Orders and Regulations.

7. Movement of animals under this Order is subject to any other Order of the Board, and also subject to any Regulation made by a Local Authority under any Order of the Board for prohibiting or regulating the movement of animals.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

8.—(1.) Any person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read, and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Holding of Markets and Sales in the Scheduled District (except in a Prohibited Area).

9.—(1.) A market or sale of animals may be held on any premises in the Scheduled District which are not in a Prohibited Area if the Local Authority are satisfied that the market or sale will be restricted to animals intended for immediate slaughter and the market or sale is authorised by the Local Authority under this Article.

(2.) The Local Authority shall cause a Veterinary Inspector to attend at every market or sale authorised under this Article and examine the animals exposed thereat.

(3.) An animal exposed at a market or sale authorised under this Article shall not be moved therefrom unless before such movement it is marked, by and at the expense of the owner, in the manner described in Article 3 of this Order.

Offences.

10.—(1.) If a person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order,

by washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted on any animal as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

11. In this Order—

“The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

“The Board” means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.

“Animals” means cattle; sheep, goats and swine.

“Slaughterhouse” means any premises where animals are habitually slaughtered, and includes a bacon factory.
