November 5, 1919:*

This day had Audience of the KING:—

His Excellency Señor Don Ismael Tocornal, to present his Letters of Credence as Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary on a Special Mission from the Republic of Chile to His Majesty.

November 7, 1919.*

This day had Audience of the KING:—

Senhor Antonio da Fontoura Xavier, to present his Letters of Recall as Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary from the United States of Brazil; and Señor Don Pedro César Domínci, to present his Letters of Credence as Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary from the United States of Venezuela.

*Whitehall, October 30th, 1919.*

The KING has been graciously pleased to grant unto Charles Coltman Rogers, of Stanage Park, in the County of Radnor, Esquire, In the Commissions of the Peace for the Counties of Radnor and Salop, and Deputy-Lieutenant for the former County, His Royal Licence and Authority that he may, in compliance with a clause in the will of Marion Catherine Pocklington-Coltman, late of Hagnaby Priory, in the County of Lincoln, Widow, deceased, take and henceforth bear the surname of Coltman before that of Rogers, and bear the Arms of Coltman quarterly with his own family Arms, the said Arms being first duly exemplified according to the Laws of Arms and recorded in His Majesty's College of Arms, otherwise the said Royal Licence and Permission to be void and of none effect.

And to command that the said Royal Concession and Declaration be recorded in His Majesty's said College of Arms.
