In the Rural District of Pontardawe:

Route No. 8.—From the borough
boundary on the road leading from Swansea
to Pontardawe at Clydach along the said
road through Clydach and along Herbert-
street to the Railway Inn, Pontardawe, and
also along James-street, Dynevor-street and
High-street to the Cross at Pontardawe.

In the Rural District and the Borough of
Neath:

Route No. 9.—From the borough
boundary on the road leading from Swansea
to Neath at Lonlas along the said road
through Skewen and Neath Abbey, and
along New-street and Orchard-street to the
junction of London-road and Orchard-street,
Neath, and also along Croft-road, the
Parade, Charlesville-place, Green-street and
Windsor-road to the junction of Windsor-
road and London-road, Neath.

In the Rural District of Neath:

Route No. 10.—From the borough
boundary on the road leading from Swansea
to Jersey Marine at Baldwin's-crescent along
the said road through Jersey Marine and
along Burrows-road through Skewen and
along Old-road to the junction of that
road with the main road leading from Swan-
sea to Neath and joining Route No. 9 at
Skewen and also along Queen's-road,
Skewen, to the junction of Queen's-road with
Bethlehem-road, Skewen.

12. To enable the Corporation upon any
land for the time being belonging to them or
to be acquired under the powers of the intended
Act to erect and maintain omnibus garages
and motor houses, waiting-rooms, shelters,
buildings and sheds, and to provide the neces-
sary plant, appliances and conveniences for
the establishment, working, running and
equipment of such omnibuses or other vehicles,
and for any of those purposes or other purposes
the motor omnibus undertaking to acquire
the land by compulsion or agreement the lands follow-
ing in the county of Glamorgan (that is to

In the Rural District of Gower:

(1) Certain lands in the parish of Port
Eynon (82 square yards or thereabouts in
extent), bounded on the west by the road
leading from the Ship Inn, Port Eynon, to
the Burrows, on the south by the Burrows,
and on the north and east by other premises
owned by John Hughes.

(2) Certain lands in the parish of Rhosilli
(150 square yards or thereabouts in ex-
tent), forming the north-western portion of
the field numbered 211 on the $\frac{1}{25000}$ Ordnance
Map of the said parish, Edition of 1914, to-
gether with the occupation road leading into
the said field from the road passing through
Middleton to the Coastguard

(3) Certain lands in the parish of Penrice
(10 square yards or thereabouts in ex-
tent), bounded on the north-west by the
road leading from Knelston to Horton, on
the north-east partly by the garage of Mes-
srs. J. and P. Bevan and partly by pre-
mises forming a portion of the farm known as

the Beeches, and on the remaining sides by
other portions of the said farm.

(4) Certain lands in the parish of Llan-
gennith (1,006 square yards or thereabouts
in extent), being part of the premises known
as the Post Office, bounded on the north-west
by the road leading from Llanridian to Llan-
gennith, on the north by the field numbered
421 on the $\frac{1}{25000}$ Ordnance Map of the said
parish, Edition of 1915, on the east by the
field numbered 217 on the said map, and on
the south by other parts of the said Post
Office.

(5) Certain lands in the parish of Llan-
madoc (850 square yards or thereabouts in
extent), bounded on or towards the south-
west by the road leading from Llanridian to
Llanmadoc, on the north by the field num-
bered 147 on the $\frac{1}{25000}$ Ordnance Map of the
said parish, Edition of 1915, and on the east
by a part of the field numbered 149 on the
said map.

(6) Certain lands in the parish of Coed-
franc (849 square yards or thereabouts in
extent), bounded on the north by Bethle-
hem-road, on the south by premises in
Queen's-road, on the east by Francis-road,
and on the west by Queen's-road.

In the Rural District of Swansea:

(7) Certain lands in the parish of Loughor
Borough (1,167 square yards or thereabouts
in extent), and situate at the junction of
Glebe-road and Culfor-road.

In the Borough:

(8) Certain lands (506 square yards or
thereabouts in extent), situate at the junc-
tion of Eversley-road and Gower-road, and
being the sites of three houses abutting on
the said Gower-road and the gardens at the
rear thereof.

(9) Certain lands (640 square yards or
thereabouts in extent), situate on the east
side of the Tennant Canal Bridge, and lying
between the towing path of the Tennant
Canal and the road leading from Swansea to
Jersey Marine.

(10) Certain lands (629 square yards or
thereabouts in extent), situate on the west
side of the bridge carrying the Rhondda and
Swansea Bay Railway over the Tennant
Canal, and lying between the towing path of
the said canal and the road leading from
Swansea to Jersey Marine.

(11) Certain lands (6 acres 2 roods 33
perches and 14 square yards or thereabouts
in extent), bounded on the north by Pentre-
mawr-road, on the south partly by St. John
the Baptist's Church and partly by the
Hafod School, on the east by premises in
Odo-street, and on the west by Cwm-road
and Llangyfelach-road.

(12) Certain lands being the premises
known as No. 151, Llangyfelach-road.

(13) Certain lands (3 acres 5 perches and
23 square yards or thereabouts in extent),
bounded on the north-east by Carmarthen-
road and being part of the field numbered
290 on the $\frac{1}{25000}$ Ordnance Map of the parish
of Swansea, Edition of 1916.

(14) Certain lands (22 perches and 20
square yards or thereabouts in extent) and
being part of the gardens at the rear of Nos.
1 to 6 Brickyard-road, Gendros.
