

in the following respects, that is to say:—To require the provision of adequate food storage accommodation in existing houses; to impose a penalty for exposure of persons suffering from infectious disease, to empower the Corporation during the prevalence of infectious disease to close and in certain cases to exclude children from Sunday schools, cinemas, and other places of public entertainment; to define and extend the meaning of infectious disease for the purposes of the intended Act and of the Swansea Corporation Acts, 1902 and 1912, and any other Act relating to the Corporation; to enable the Corporation to secure the removal to and detention at a hospital of persons suffering from pulmonary tuberculosis; to require buildings to be disinfected so as to prevent the spread of tuberculosis; to prevent the contamination of sausages and similar foods; to prohibit rag and bone dealers from selling or distributing food, bladders, &c., at their premises or from their carts and other vehicles; to authorize the inspection of premises suspected of being unlawfully used as seamen's lodging houses; to empower the Corporation to reconstruct private drains improperly laid, and to repair defective private drains and to recover the cost from the owners.

25. To empower the Corporation to provide, construct and maintain on lands belonging to them additional public slaughterhouses, to revoke licences issued by them or their predecessors in respect of private slaughterhouses, and to close private slaughterhouses, to prohibit slaughtering elsewhere than in a Corporation slaughterhouse, and to compel the weighing of carcasses of all animals slaughtered at a public slaughterhouse.

26. To require motor carriages exempt from revenue duty under the Finance (1909-10) Act, 1910, to be licensed by the Corporation as hackney carriages under the provisions of the Towns Police Clauses Acts, to require all motor carriages licensed by them as hackney carriages to be furnished with taximeters, and to carry passengers at the fares for the time being chargeable in the borough for the hire of hackney carriages plying for hire, to provide a simpler and speedier method whereby such fares may be revised, and to extend the definition of the word "street" for the purposes of the Towns Police Clauses Acts so as to include certain premises of railway companies, garages, and other private premises.

27. To make regulations with a view to preventing disorderly conduct in public libraries, police offices and other public buildings.

28. To empower the Corporation to advertise the attractions of the borough, and to apply such revenues, rates and funds thereto as the intended Act may prescribe, to confer further powers upon the Corporation for the regulation of swimming baths and open bathing places, and to empower them to permit the same to be used for family and mixed bathing, to enable them to reserve the exclusive use thereof for such contests, exhibitions, entertainments and other purposes as they may think fit, to prescribe different rates for the use of such baths at various times and for various purposes, and to authorize the Corporation to impose restrictions and make regulations as to the use of the foreshore in or adjacent to the borough.

To remove the limit upon or to increase the amount of the annual contributions payable

Compensation Fund to such extent as may be prescribed by the intended Act, and to vary, amend or repeal the provisions of section 109 of the Swansea Corporation Act, 1902, with respect thereto.

30. To authorize the Corporation to establish and maintain a superannuation fund or funds for their officers, workmen and other employees, to empower the Corporation and to require such officers, workmen and employees to contribute to such fund such sums as may be prescribed by the intended Act, and to make provisions and regulations with regard to the conduct and administration of the fund and the payment of benefits thereunder, and to prescribe the age at which persons entitled to benefits in the fund shall retire.

31. To authorize the Corporation to establish and maintain a fire insurance fund in regard to the buildings and other properties under their control, and to enable them to make such capital or annual contributions thereto as may be prescribed by the intended Act.

32. To authorize the Corporation to establish and maintain a Fidelity Guarantee Fund to provide against the loss which they, or the Guardians of any Union, wholly or partially comprised within the borough, or the overseers of any parish comprised within the borough, may sustain in consequence of the dishonesty of any person employed or appointed by the Corporation, and to enable them to appropriate to the fund such capital or annual sums as may be prescribed by the intended Act.

33. To authorize the Corporation to establish and maintain an Education Accident Fund to provide for meeting claims which may be made upon them as the Local Education Authority for the borough in respect of any accident or injury occurring to their employees, or to any child or person attending the schools in the borough, and to enable them to appropriate to the fund such capital or annual sums as may be prescribed by the intended Act.

34. To consolidate into one rate (hereinafter referred to as "the consolidated rate") the Borough Rate, the General District Rate, and all or any other rates which the Corporation are or may be authorized to make or levy, and the Poor Rate of the parish of Swansea, and all or any other rates which are or may be otherwise leviable in the borough, or any part or parts thereof, to provide for the payment out of, or the carrying to the credit of the Borough Fund and the Borough Rate of all expenses and moneys which would otherwise be paid out of or carried to the credit of the District Fund or General District Rate, or any other rates or funds as aforesaid, and to provide that references in the Acts and Provisional or other Orders of or relating to the Corporation or in force within the borough, or in any mortgage of or charge on any of the rates or funds hereinbefore referred to shall be construed as references to the Borough Fund and the Borough Rate.

35. To provide for the closing of the General District Rate and District Fund, and for the transfer to the credit or debit of the Borough Fund of balances standing to the credit or debit of the said rate and fund, and to require the Overseers of the parish of Swansea to pay out of the Poor Rate leviable therein the contributions of the parish to the Borough Rate, and to apply to such contributions the provisions of section 145 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1912, with respect thereto.
