To authorize the Corporation to establish and maintain a superannuation fund or funds for their officers, workmen and other employees, to empower the Corporation and to require such officers, workmen and employees to contribute to such fund such sums as may be prescribed by the intended Act, and to make provisions and regulations with regard to the conduct and administration of the fund and the payment of benefits thereunder, and to prescribe the age at which persons entitled to benefits in the fund shall retire.
