By the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

WHEREAS it is provided by Section 2 of the Customs (Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914, that any Proclamation or Order in Council made under Section 8 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, as amended by the Act now in recital, may, whilst a state of war exists, be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade:

And whereas it is provided by Section 2 of the Customs (Exportation Restriction) Act, 1914, that any Proclamation made under Section 1 of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, may, whether the Proclamation was made before or after the passing of the Act now in recital, be varied or added to, whilst a state of war exists, by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade:

And whereas by a Proclamation, dated the 10th day of May, 1917, and made under Section 8 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, and Section 1 of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, and Section 1 of the Customs (Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914, the exportation from the United Kingdom of certain articles to certain or all destinations was prohibited:

And whereas by subsequent Orders of Council, and by the Proclamations dated respectively the 18th day of December, 1918, and the 12th day of March, 1919, the said Proclamation was amended and added to in certain particulars:

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Board of Trade to the following effect:—

That the Proclamation, dated the 10th day of May, 1917, as amended and added to by subsequent Orders of Council and by the Proclamations dated respectively the 18th day of December, 1918, and the 12th day of March, 1919, should be further amended by making the

following amendments in and additions to the Schedule to the same:—

(1) That the following headings should be deleted:—

(A) Animals, pack, saddle and draught, suitable, or which may become suitable, for use in war;

(A) Iron, scrap;

(A) Steel, scrap;

(A) Needles, hosiery machine, latch;

(B) Nitrate bags;

(A) Coffee;

(A) Beans of all kinds, including Haricots;

(A) Bean Flour and Meal;

(A) Chick Peas;

(A) Lentil Flour and Meal;

(A) Peas, other than split peas;

(A) Pigeon Peas;

(A) Pea Flour and Meal;

(A) Locust Bean Meal;

(A) Margarine and Oleo-Margarine;

(A) Lupin Seed;

(A) Fruit and fruit preserves, except olives, and except the following fresh fruit which may be exported without licence to all destinations with which trading is permitted:—

Apricots, grape fruit, green figs, grapes, peaches, pears, pineapples, nectarines, imported plums (South African), and imported melons;

(A) Chicory;

(A) Jute, raw and carded;

(B) Cocoa butter;

(A) Cocoa husks;

(A) Cocoa shells;

(A) Oleaginous kernels, nuts, seeds, and products of all kinds, except castor seed;

(A) Soya Bean, Cake and Meal: Meat Meal;

(A) Gram or Dhol;

(A) Millet;

(A) Swords and their component parts;

(B) Bristles, of European origin.

(2) That the following headings should be added:—

Chemicals, drugs, dyes, dyestuffs and medicinal and pharmaceutical preparations, the following:—

(A) Benzol and its compounds and preparations;

(A) Dimethylaniline;

(A) Meta-cresol;

(A) Methylaniline;

(A) Para-cresol;

(A) Fruit, preserved;

Fruit, dried, the following:—

(A) Figs, dried;

(A) Raisins (except Californian Seeded Raisins);

(A) Sultanas;

Oleaginous kernels, nuts and seeds, the following:—

(A) Copra;

(A) Cotton Seed;

(A) Groundnuts;

(A) Linseed;

(A) Palm kernels;

(A) Soya Bean, Cake, Meal and Flour.

Now, therefore, their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the same be approved.

Whereof the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs and Excise, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.

PAPER BAG TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

PROPOSAL TO VARY GENERAL MINIMUM TIME-RATES AND OVERTIME RATES FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF MALE WORKERS.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established in Great Britain under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for the Paper Bag Trade as specified in the Trade Boards (Paper Bag Trade) Order, 1919, hereby give notice, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918 (the Minister of Labour having given his consent to such Notice being given), that they propose to vary the General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates, at present fixed and set out in the Schedule to their Notice, dated 22nd November, 1919, effective under the Order of the Minister of Labour, dated 20th November, 1919, in respect of certain classes of Male Workers so that, in lieu of such General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates, the General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for such classes of Male Workers shall be as follows:—

PART I.

*Proposed Variation of General Minimum Time-Rates for Certain Classes of Male Workers.
Section I.—For Machine Tacklers and Paper Bag Cutters.*

Provided that, in the case of Male Workers entering the trade for the first time at the age of 21 years and over, either as Machine Tacklers or as Paper Bag Cutters, the General Minimum Time-Rates for such workers shall be as follows:—

Machine Tacklers.

During the first 12 months of service as a Machine Tackler, 1s. 1½d. per hour or 55s. per week of 48 hours.

During the second 12 months of service as a Machine Tackler, 1s. 3d. per hour or 60s. per week of 48 hours.

During the third 12 months of service as a Machine Tackler, 1s. 4½d. per hour or 66s. per week of 48 hours.

After three years' service as a Machine Tackler, 1s. 6d. per hour or 72s. per week of 48 hours.

Paper Bag Cutters.

During the first 12 months of service as a Paper Bag Cutter, 1s. 1½d. per hour or 55s. per week of 48 hours.

During the second 12 months of service as a Paper Bag Cutter, 1s. 2½d. per hour or 58s. per week of 48 hours.

During the third 12 months of service as a Paper Bag Cutter, 1s. 3½d. per hour or 61s. per week of 48 hours.

After three years' service as a Paper Bag Cutter, 1s. 4d. per hour or 64s. per week of 48 hours.

For the purpose of this Notice, a Machine Tackler shall be deemed to be a Male person who is engaged in setting, adjusting and keeping running Paper Bag Machines and in superintending and carrying through all other operations that can be performed in whole or in part by such machines.

Section II. For Hydraulic Pressers, Slitters, Stock-keepers, Packers, and Despatchers (of the age of 21 years and over).

During the 1st 12 months of service after the age of 21 years in any one of the occupations specified in this Section, 1s. 1½d. per hour or 55s. per week of 48 hours.

During the 2nd 12 months of service after the age of 21 years in the same occupation, 1s. 2d. per hour or 56s. per week of 48 hours.

During the 3rd 12 months of service after the age of 21 years in the same occupation, 1s. 2½d. per hour or 58s. per week of 48 hours.

After three years' service after the age of 21 years in the same occupation, 1s. 3d. per hour or 60s. per week of 48 hours.

PART II.

Proposed variation of overtime rates for certain classes of Male Workers.

Overtime Rates calculated on the above General Minimum Time-Rates in the manner set out in the Schedule to the Notice fixing minimum rates for Overtime issued by the Trade Board and dated 22nd November, 1919, shall apply in substitution for the above General Minimum Time-Rates in respect of all hours worked by the above classes of workers in excess of the number of hours therein declared by the Trade Board to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade.

The Trade Board will consider any objections to the above proposals to vary which may be lodged with them within two months from 16th December, 1919. Such objections should be in writing and signed by the person making

the same (adding his or her full name and address) and should be sent to the Secretary of the Paper Bag Trade Board (Great Britain), 5, Chancery Lane, London, W.C. 2.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons what is objected to.

**ORDER OF THE BOARD OF
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.**

(DATED 12TH DECEMBER 1919.)

**DURHAM AND NORTHUMBERLAND
(FOOT - AND - MOUTH DISEASE)
ORDER OF 1919.**

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Movement into, out of, or within Scheduled District.

1.—(1.) No cattle, sheep, goats or swine shall be landed in or moved into or out of the District described in the Schedule to this Order, hereinafter referred to as the Scheduled District, or be moved along, over, or across, or be allowed by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon a highway or thoroughfare within the Scheduled District; provided that nothing in this Order shall be deemed to apply to the movement of animals into or out of the Scheduled District where they are moved through such District by railway from a place outside such District to another place outside such District, without unnecessary delay, and without the animals being untrucked within such District except for the purposes of feeding or watering the animals within the railway station premises where such untrucking takes place.

(2.) If any farm (except any detached part) is partly within and partly without the Scheduled District, the whole shall be deemed to be within the Scheduled District.

Power to Restrict Movement of Persons in Certain Cases.

2.—(1.) An Inspector of the Local Authority acting under their direction may serve a Notice on the occupier of any field, shed, or other place in the Scheduled District, prohibiting the entry of any person into any such field, shed, or other place, and thereupon, notwithstanding the existence of any footpath or right-of-way, no person shall enter the field, shed, or other place to which the Notice relates while any cattle, sheep, goats or swine are therein, otherwise than in accordance with the following regulations, that is to say:

(i) The owner of the field, shed, or other place, or of the animals therein, or the agent or servants of such owner, may enter such field, shed, or other place so far as may be necessary for the feeding or tending of the animals.

(ii) Any other person may enter such field,

shed, or other place with a licence of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.

(2.) Copies of such Notice shall be affixed or exhibited by the Inspector in such manner as he shall think desirable for ensuring notification of the restrictions thereby imposed.

(3.) A copy of every such Notice shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector to the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, Whitehall Place, London, S.W.

Power to restrict Movement of Dogs and Poultry in Certain Cases.

3.—(1.) An Inspector of the Board, or of the Local Authority acting under their direction, may, for the purpose of preventing the spread of Foot-and-Mouth Disease, by a Notice served on the occupier of any premises in the Scheduled District, require him:—

(a) to keep in confinement, or under control, as may be prescribed by the Notice, dogs on such premises;

or (b) to confine live poultry on such premises in a pen or other like enclosure;

or (c) to prevent the access of live poultry to any specific part of the premises to which cattle, sheep, goats, or swine have, or recently have had, access;

and if any occupier after service of any such Notice shall fail to comply with the requirements thereof, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2.) An Inspector of the Board, or of the Local Authority acting under their direction, may, for the purpose of preventing the spread of Foot-and-Mouth Disease, by Notice affixed or exhibited by the Inspector in such manner as he shall think desirable for ensuring notification of the restrictions thereby imposed, require dogs to be kept by the person in charge thereof under control while passing along any road or footpath specified in such Notice, and if any person in charge of a dog while passing along any road or footpath to which any such Notice relates fails to keep the dog under control, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(3.) Every Notice served on an occupier of premises shall remain in operation until it is withdrawn by a further Notice served by an Inspector of the Board or of the Local Authority.

(4.) A copy of every Notice served by an Inspector of the Local Authority under this Article shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector to the Secretary, Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, Whitehall Place, London, S.W.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

4. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

5.—(1.) If an animal is landed in contravention of this Order, the owner, and the charterer and the master of the vessel from which it is landed, and the owner of the animal and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing or permitting the landing, and the person landing the same, and the consignee or other

person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been landed in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2.) If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the animal and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the animal is moved shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(3.) If any person enters any field, shed, or other place in contravention of this Order, or of a Notice served thereunder, such person shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Short Title.

6. This Order may be cited as the DURHAM AND NORTHUMBÉRLAND (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1919.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF

EAST KENT (MUZZLING AND CONTROL
OF DOGS) ORDER OF 1919 (No. 2).

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

PART I.

*Prohibition of Movement of Dogs out of
certain District.*

1.—(1.) No dog shall be moved, out of the District described in the Schedule hereto, hereinafter referred to as "the Scheduled District," unless it is accompanied by a licence of the Board authorising such movement signed by an Officer of the Board, and any such licence may be subject to such conditions as to the detention and isolation of the dog or otherwise as the Board may think necessary or desirable, and shall be specified in the licence: Provided that this Article shall not apply to—

(a) the movement of a dog under a licence granted by the Board under the Importation of Dogs Order of 1914 and the Importation of Dogs (Amendment) Order of 1918 (No. 2) to a port in Great Britain for shipment, or to a place of detention for the purpose of detention and isolation; or

(b) the movement of a dog through the Scheduled District by railway from a place outside the District to another place outside the District without unnecessary delay and without being re-booked within the District.

(2.) If any farm (except any detached part) is partly within and partly without the Scheduled District, the whole shall be deemed to be within the Scheduled District.

Seizure of Dogs in case of Default.

2.—(1.) If a dog has been moved in contravention of this Order or having been moved with a licence under this Order is not detained and isolated or otherwise dealt with as required by the conditions of the licence, an Inspector of the Board may seize the dog, and thereupon the Board shall detain and isolate it at the place of detention specified in the licence (if any) or any other place of detention selected by them for such time as the Board think necessary or expedient.

(2.) If the owner of the dog does not, within ten days after the expiration of the period of detention specified in the licence (if any) or such other period as the Board may think necessary or expedient and notify to the owner, claim the dog from the Board and pay to them their expenses of detaining and isolating the

dog, the Board may destroy or otherwise dispose of the dog as they think expedient.

*Notice of Detention in case of Illegal
Movement.*

3.—(1.) Where an Inspector or other Officer of the Board, or of a Local Authority, has reason to believe that a dog has been moved in contravention of this Order he may give notice to the owner or person in charge of the dog requiring that the dog shall be detained and isolated in accordance with the provisions of such notice, and that within a time specified in such notice, the dog shall be moved to a place of detention for the purpose of such detention and isolation.

(2.) Such provisions may be inserted in the notice as the Board may think necessary or desirable for any of the following purposes, namely:—

(i) For prescribing and regulating the detention and isolation of the dog.

(ii.) For prescribing the person by whom and the premises on which the dog shall be detained and isolated.

(iii.) For regulating the movement of the dog to the place of detention.

(iv.) For prescribing the confinement of the dog in a suitable hamper, crate, box, or other receptacle or the muzzling of the dog, during its movement by railway, or along a highway or thoroughfare.

(v.) For prescribing the mode of isolation of the dog.

(vi.) For prescribing the notice to be given of the death or loss of the dog, or of any matter arising in connection with the movement, detention, or isolation of the dog and the persons by whom and to whom the notice is to be given; and

(vii.) For prescribing the production of the notice for inspection by an officer of the Board, or police constable, or officer of the Local Authority.

(3.) The operation of a notice under this Article may be terminated by notice to that effect given by an Inspector or other Officer of the Board or of the Local Authority to the owner or person in charge of the dog, on proof to the satisfaction of the Inspector or Officer that the dog was not moved in contravention of the said Order.

(4.) If the owner or person in charge of the dog, after receipt of such notice, fails to move the dog as required by the notice, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(5.) If the provisions inserted in any notice under this Article are not complied with, the owner of the dog and the person in charge of the dog and any person who being required to comply with any such provision fails to do so, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

PART II.

Control of Dogs in Scheduled District.

4.—(1.) A dog in the Scheduled District shall at all times:—

(a) whilst in or on any public place be efficiently muzzled with an effective wire cage muzzle;

(b) whilst in or on any other place, be kept under control by being—

(i.) confined in a kennel or other enclosure from which the dog cannot escape; or

(ii.) secured to some premises by a collar and chain; or

(iii.) efficiently muzzled with an effective wire cage muzzle; or

(iv.) accompanied by the owner or some person deputed by him and under effectual control.

(2.) The provisions of this Article shall not apply to—

(a) any pack of hounds while being exercised under the supervision of two or more competent attendants; or

(b) any dog in charge of a competent person while being used for sporting purposes, or for the capture or destruction of vermin, or for the driving or tending of cattle or sheep; or

(c) any dog confined in a suitable hamper, crate, box, or other receptacle, so constructed as to render it impossible for such dog while so confined to bite any person or animal.

Seizure, Detention, and Disposal of Uncontrolled Dogs.

5.—(1.) Any dog in the Scheduled District which is not muzzled, or kept under control, as prescribed by this Order, may be seized by the Local Authority or by the police, and any dog so seized shall be dealt with by the Local Authority as follows:—

(i.) If the dog is diseased or suspected, or has been bitten by a diseased or suspected dog, it shall be forthwith slaughtered.

(ii.) If the dog has been exposed to the infection of rabies it shall be detained, slaughtered, or otherwise dealt with as the Local Authority think expedient, but so that the dog shall not, while detained by the Local Authority, be allowed to come in contact with any other animal.

(iii.) In any other case the dog shall be treated as a stray dog seized under the powers conferred by section three of the Dogs Act, 1906.

(4.) No dog so seized shall be given or sold for the purposes of vivisection.

(3.) Every dog shall, for the purposes of this Article, be deemed to have been exposed to the infection of rabies which has been in the same shed, stable, building, kennel, field, or other place, or otherwise in contact with any diseased or suspected dog, or which has in any other way been exposed to the infection of rabies.

Prohibition of Holding of Exhibitions or Shows of Dogs in Scheduled District.

6.—No exhibition or show of dogs whether for sale or otherwise shall be held in the Scheduled District except with a licence of the Board, and any such licence shall be subject to such conditions as the Board may think necessary or desirable, and shall specify in the licence.

PART III.

GENERAL.

Offences.

7.—(1.) If a dog is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the dog, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from

which the dog is moved shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If any dog in the Scheduled District is not muzzled, or kept under control, as prescribed by this Order, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3.) If a dog which is being moved or has been moved with a licence under this Order is not muzzled or confined or is not detained and isolated or otherwise dealt with as required by the conditions of the licence, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(4.) If any person holds, or causes or permits to be held, any exhibition or show in contravention of this Order, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(5.) If a person with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order or of the conditions of a licence under this Order allows a dog to stray, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(6.) If the owner or person in charge of a dog fails to give, produce, or do any notice, licence, or thing which by this Order, or by the conditions of a licence thereunder, he is required to give, produce, or do, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

8.—In this Order—

“The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

“Disease” means rabies, “diseased” means affected with rabies, and “suspected” means suspected of rabies.

“Public place” includes any street, highway, thoroughfare, public bridge, royal park, public park, garden or pleasure ground, common, unenclosed land, or other place to which the public have for the time being access.

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Rabies Order of 1919.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

9.—The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Commencement.

10. This Order shall come into operation on the thirteenth day of December, nineteen hundred and nineteen; Provided that until the sixteenth day of that month a dog in or on any public place in the Scheduled District need not be muzzled if it is led by a person with a collar and chain or other attachment.

Short Title.

11. This Order may be cited as the East Kent (Muzzling and Control of Dogs) Order of 1919 (No. 2).

Movement of Animals into certain Boroughs for Immediate Slaughter.

1. Notwithstanding anything in the Durham and Northumberland (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1919, an animal may, subject as hereinafter provided, be moved without a licence by railway or by vessel from outside the Scheduled District described in the Schedule to that Order to a railway station or landing place situate within any borough mentioned in the First Schedule to this Order; and an animal so moved may be moved from the railway station or landing place to any slaughterhouse or bacon factory situate within the same borough if accompanied by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the borough.

Provisions as to Movement Licences.

2.—(1) The movement of an animal with a Movement Licence under this Order shall be subject to the following conditions:—

(i.) The animal shall be moved to the slaughterhouse or bacon factory specified in the Licence, and not elsewhere, and shall be there detained until they are slaughtered.

(ii.) The animal during the movement to the slaughterhouse or bacon factory shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all animals not being moved with a Licence under this Order.

(iii.) After completion of the movement the Licence shall forthwith be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest police station in the same district by the person in charge of the animal at the time of completing such movement.

(2) A Movement Licence granted under this Order shall be in force for not more than four

days, inclusive of the day of issue, and shall be in the form set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect.

Exception of Certain Animals from Provisions as to Movement.

3. Nothing in this Order shall be construed as authorising movement of an animal the movement of which is prohibited by Regulation of a Local Authority or by notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

4.—(1.) Any person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read, and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Commencement.

5. This Order shall come into operation on the fifteenth day of December, nineteen hundred and nineteen.

WARWICKSHIRE AND DISTRICT
(FOOT - AND - MOUTH DISEASE)
ORDER OF 1919 (No. 15).

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

Movement into, out of, or within Scheduled District.

1.—(1.) No cattle, sheep, goats or swine shall be moved into or out of the District described in the Schedule to this Order, hereinafter referred to as the Scheduled District, or be moved along, over or across, or be allowed by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon a highway or thoroughfare within the Scheduled District; provided that nothing in this Order shall be deemed to apply to the movement of animals into or out of the Scheduled District where they are moved through such District by railway from a place outside such District to another place outside such District without unnecessary delay and without the animals being untrucked within such District except for the purposes of feeding or watering the animals within the railway station premises where such untrucking takes place.

(2.) If any farm (except any detached part) is partly within and partly without the Scheduled District, the whole shall be deemed to be within the Scheduled District.

Power to restrict Movement of Persons in Certain Cases.

2.—(1.) An Inspector of the Local Authority acting under their direction may serve a notice on the occupier of any field, shed or other place in the Scheduled District, prohibiting the entry of any person into any such field, shed or other place, and thereupon, notwithstanding the existence of any footpath or right of way, no person shall enter the field, shed or other place to which the notice relates while any cattle, sheep, goats or swine are therein, otherwise than in accordance with the following regulations, that is to say:—

(i.) The owner of the field, shed or other place, or of the animals therein, or the agents or servants of such owner, may enter such field, shed or other place so far as may be necessary for the feeding or tending of the animals.

(ii.) Any other person may enter such field, shed or other place with a licence of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.

(2.) Copies of such notice shall be affixed or exhibited by the Inspector in such manner as he shall think desirable for ensuring notification of the restrictions thereby imposed.

(3.) A copy of every such notice shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector to the Board of

Agriculture and Fisheries, Whitehall Place, London, S.W.

Power to restrict Movement of Dogs and Poultry in Certain Cases.

3.—(1.) An inspector of the Board, or of the Local Authority acting under their direction, may, for the purpose of preventing the spread of Foot-and-Mouth Disease, by a notice served on the occupier of any premises in the Scheduled District, require him:—

(a) to keep in confinement, or under control, as may be prescribed by the notice, dogs on such premises;

or (b) to confine live poultry on such premises in a pen or other like enclosure;

or (c) to prevent the access of live poultry to any specific part of the premises to which cattle, sheep, goats, or swine have, or recently have had, access;

and if any occupier after service of any such notice shall fail to comply with the requirements thereof, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2.) An Inspector of the Board, or of the Local Authority acting under their direction, may, for the purpose of preventing the spread of Foot-and-Mouth Disease, by notice affixed or exhibited by the Inspector in such manner as he shall think desirable for ensuring notification of the restrictions thereby imposed, require dogs to be kept by the person in charge thereof under control while passing along any road or footpath specified in such notice, and if any person in charge of a dog while passing along any road or footpath to which any such notice relates fails to keep the dog under control, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(3.) Every notice served on an occupier of premises shall remain in operation until it is withdrawn by a further notice served by an Inspector of the Board or of the Local Authority.

(4.) A copy of every notice served by an Inspector of the Local Authority under this Article shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector to the Secretary, Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, Whitehall Place, London, S.W.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

4. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

5.—(1.) If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the animal is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.
