Falmouth, Novemb. 22.

Efterday put to lea from hence with a fair wind, the Darsmouth Fregat, with lome provision-ships bound for Tangier, for the supply of that Garrison. The two Maries, a Metchant ship of London for the Streights, the Brother adventure of the same place for Virginia, the Four Brothers for Ireland, and several other vessels bound to the Southwards.

Plymouth, Nov. 24. The Fleet of Merchant thips which has for fome time lain wind-bound in this Port, on Sunday night and yefterday went out to fea, but by the change of wind, 'tis believed, may be forced to put into Falmouth. Here is newly arrived the Roebuck Fregat from Ireland.

Rome, Nov. 17. This whole Court hathof late put on a face of fadnels for the death of the Lady Lucretia Cellofe the Popes Sifter in Law, and Mother to the Cardinal Patron, who died fome dayes fince, after 8 or 9 dayes aiftemper; her body was carried to the Jesuites Church near the Campidoglio, according to her own defire; where it was interred with much honour and folemnity.

The Pope has been lately ill of the Gout, with a Cattarrh, which has hindred him from giving Audiences, but his diftemper no way dangerous.

The Spanish Ambassadour having for some weeks diverted himself at *Frefeati*, is re urned again hither, where are suddenly expected several Cardinals and Princes, who retired themselves also in the Countrey for their divertifements.

His Holine's having long declared his refolution to prefer fome perfons to the Dignity of Cardinal, who should be able Divines, Father Oliva and Father Spinola, both of them Jefuites; one of them General of that Order, the other the Popes Confessor, have with much diligence applied themfelves to that fludy, of which they have lately given kveral publick demonstrations: but as yet the Pope has not declared his intentions as to the future promotion, nor given them any particular encouragement for their hopes.

From Naples we are told that they talk afresh there of the fudden going of the Vice-Roy of that Kingdom Don Pedro d' Arragen upon his Employment of Ambassadour of Obedience to the Pope, for which he has made his preparations, and expects his last Orders from the Court of Spain, and the arrival of a Succeffor to his Government.

They farther fay, that a confiderable part of the German forces which were entertained in that Kingdom, and lately difmified the Spanish fervice, are at last prevailed upon to enter themfelves into the fervice of the Republick of Venice, an 1 may fuddenly be embarked for Candra.

Vienna, Nov. 1<sup>9</sup>. The Turkifh Chians the 8th inflant in his first Audience from the Count de Montecuculi Prefiflent of the Emperours Council of War, opened his Commiffion, which chiefly confifted in a defire that the Fort which has for fome time been poffest, but lately repaired by the Count de Souches, at a little diffance from Comorrhe', might with leave of His Imperial Majefly be demo ifhed; and the Garrifon and Cannon with-drawn. Since this we have a confident report, that the Turks not expecting the iffue of this Negotiation, endeavoured to work their ends by a forprifal, but that the Count having an eye upon their motion, fo well prevented them in their defign, that he cur off fome numbers of them in the attempt, and for the furure intends to lie ftronger upon his guard; but of this proceeding of the Turks (though with much confidence given out) we yet expect a farther confirmation. Prince Charles of Lorrain is fafely arrived at Glogato upon the Frontiers of Poland, where he has been complemented and honourably ente tained by feveral Polish Lords, which are retired thither; where he did one of them the honour to affiss at the Baptisme of his Child.

We are in daily expectation of the arrival here of an Envoye from Tartary, for whom Lodgings have been fome time fince taken up. From Hungary we are told, that the Turks are in great apprehenfions of the Tartars, and are putting themfelves into a poffure of defence, upon intelligence given them that feveral ftrong parties of them have been of late difcovered upon the Frontiers; but others believe them to be onely fome featured Troops upon their retreat fince the defeat given them by the Mulcovites, and that they retire, in hopes to be protected by the Turks.

A Polifh Bifhop is lately arrived in this City, but the fubject of his Negotiation is not yet known.

Hambourg, Nev. 23. Upon the report, that the Prince Elector Palatine had fent hither an Officer with a confiderable fum of M neys to be expended in his levies; feveral Officers and Soldiers have repaired hither defiring employment. From Luncabourg we are told, that the Dukes of that name have neer upon compleated the number of Soldiers promifed by them for the affiftance of the Republickof Venice, greater numbers of men voluntarily offering their fervice, then was at first expected, for that in little time their forces may be in readincl's to begin their march.

The five thips which are lately arrived from Mufcevys fince their departure from Archange's, mer with extraordinary florms, which fomewhat engamaged thems three of the company which were coming out with them, by the violence thereof, were forced on ground at their putting out of that Port, viz, the Hope, the Two Brothers, and the Peace of Breds, but 'twas hoped might with little damage be gotten off again, and left free to the putfuit of their voyage; two other of our fhips being dilabled by the florm, were forced to put in again to refit, but by the increase of the Froffs (which 'twas expected, would in little time render those fease unpafiable) might be enforced to continue there all the winter.

Venice, Nov. 24. (n Saturday 1.ft arrived kere a Gally from Dalmatia belonging to the General of thole feas, bringing home his Excellency Segnior Zorqi Corndro, lately proveditor in that Province, who on the Monday following went to the Colledge, where he gave an account of the flate of the affairs of that Province, with the reafons of his return 3 by this Gally we have advice, that the City of Ragufa has been fenfible of another Barthquake, to the great terror of the inhabitants, which thook them and the adjacent territories for feveral days, but did them not any confiderable damage.

Several German foldiers are lately attived heres offering their forvice to this Republick as volumeers to be employ'd against the Turks, and amongst them about 200 Horfemen, who are at prefent diverting themselves in viewing the Curiofities of this place, and may in few days be in readiness to embark themselves with fome other Companies of our new Levies upon those fhips which are now lading with Provision and Ammunition, bound for *Candia*; from whence we are informed, that his Excellency, Segnior Tadio Morofini, with the Copvoy under his Command, having after a fevere form at leas fafely landed his fuccors at *Candia*, which were very confiderable, was by the Generals Order put to fea again with a fquadron of the Fleet under his command, to take at account of fome Cotfairs, who from the Iste of Rhodes much
