HE Governor of Milan arrived here on Tuesday last; and has had several Conferences with the Duke of Savoy; and intends in a day or two to return to Milan. The Imperial and Spanish Forces, as well as the Troops in the Service of his Royal Highness, are all ordered to be in

a readiness to march.

The Convoy that is preparing herefor the Levant will be ready to fail in tendays or a fortnight, with which a great Supply of Stores and Ammunition will be fent thither for

Vienna, April 7. Prince Lewis of Baden intends to leave this place about the 15th of this month, and to return to Germany, to command the Confederate Army on the Rhine.
