WHEREAS it is provided by the Electricity (Supply) Act, 1919, that all the powers and duties of the Board of Trade under the said Act or the Electric Lighting Acts or the orders and regulations made thereunder or any local Act relating to the supply of electricity or any enactment relating to matters incidental to such supply shall as from such date as His Majesty in Council may fix be transferred to the Minister of Transport and that accordingly references to the Board of Trade in any such Acts, orders, regulations and enactments shall be construed as references to the Minister of Transport:
