WHEREAS by the Isle of Man (War Legislation) Act, 1914, His Majesty has power to extend to the Isle of Man any Act which, in the opinion of His Majesty, was passed for the purpose of meeting any emergency created by the present War, subject to adaptations for the purpose of making the Act applicable to the Isle of Man:

And whereas by Order in Council, dated the 17th day of December, 1914, His Majesty was pleased to order that the Defence of the Realm Consolidation Act, 1914, and the Defence of

the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, should extend to the Isle of Man, subject to the adaptations therein contained:

And whereas the said Act and Regulations have been amended by certain other Acts and Regulations, which Acts and Regulations have been extended to the Isle of Man by Orders in Council, subject to the adaptations therein contained:

And whereas the said Regulations have been further amended by Order in Council, dated the 20th December, 1919:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that paragraph one of the Order in Council of the 20th day of December, 1919, shall extend to the Isle of Man.

THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS ACT, 1868.

The Governing Body of Winchester College having, on the 31st day of January, 1920, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by the above-named Act, and of the Acts amending the same, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, made two Statutes in the terms hereafter set forth, and the said Statutes having this day been laid before His Majesty in Council, the same are hereby published in the London Gazette in accordance with the provisions in that behalf contained in the said Act.

And notice is hereby given that any person, body of persons, or body corporate, authorized in that behalf by the said Act, may, within two months after the publication of this notification, petition His Majesty in Council to withhold His approval from the whole or any part of the said Statutes.

FEES PAYABLE BY SCHOLARS: EXHIBITIONS AWARDABLE TO SCHOLARS.

We, the Warden and Fellows of Winchester College, being the Governing Body of Winchester College, do hereby, in exercise of the powers of the Public Schools Act, 1868, and of the Acts amending the same, and of all other powers enabling us in that behalf, resolve and enact as follows:—

A Statute for amending Section 10 of Statute XI, and Section 2 of Statute XII, of the Statutes of Winchester College approved by his late Majesty King Edward the Seventh in Council on the 24th day of October, 1904.

1. Each of the above mentioned Sections shall be amended by substituting therein, for the words "twenty guineas," the words "thirty guineas":

Provided always that such amendments shall in no wise apply to any Scholar of the College who shall have been admitted or elected at any time before the approval of this Statute by His Majesty the King in Council, and that with respect to every such Scholar the above-mentioned Sections shall continue to be read as if they had not been amended by this Statute.
